PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** it appears expedient to His Majesty, on representations made to Him by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Army Council and the Air Council that the conditions regulating the right of servants of the Crown to become candidates at Parliamentary elections should be made uniform:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. No person employed by or under the Crown to whom this Order applies shall issue an address to electors or in any other manner publicly announce himself or allow himself to be publicly announced as a candidate or a prospective candidate for election to Parliament for any constituency until he has retired or resigned from such employment.

2. This Order does not apply:—

- (a) to persons holding political offices; or
- (b) to officers on the retired or emergency lists of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines or Royal Air Force or to officers and men of any of the auxiliary or reserve forces (including officers in any reserve of

officers) as such, except when embodied or called out on permanent or active service or otherwise employed under conditions to be prescribed by regulations made in pursuance of this Order; or

(c) to persons employed in an industrial capacity in establishments under the Admiralty, Army Council or Air Council, being establishments certified by the Treasury to be establishments of an industrial or predominantly industrial character, other than persons employed in such supervisory grades as may be specified in regulations made by the department concerned and approved by the Treasury;

but, save as aforesaid, shall apply to all persons in the naval, military, air or civil service of the Crown, or otherwise employed by or under the Crown, whether such employment is of a permanent or temporary nature, and whether established or unestablished.

3. For the purpose of this Order, the expression "political office" means any office which is usually held by a member of one or other of the Houses of Parliament, and in relation to officers and men in the naval, military, and air service of the Crown, the expressions "retired or resigned" and "auxiliary and reserve forces" have such meanings as may be prescribed by regulations made in pursuance of this Order.

4. The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Army Council and the Air

Council shall provide for the issue of the necessary regulations for giving effect to this Order so far as it relates to persons in the naval, military and air service of the Crown.

5. Article 16 of the Order in Council, dated the tenth day of January, nineteen hundred and ten, relating to His Majesty's civil establishments and the conditions of service therein, is hereby revoked.

6. This Order may be cited as the Servants of the Crown (Parliamentary Candidature) Order, 1927.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, that if His Majesty is pleased to declare in Council that it is His will to relinquish His right of appointing a person to fill the office of Coroner for the Isle of Wight then, on a vacancy in that office occurring at any time thereafter, the Isle of Wight County Council shall have power to appoint a person to fill the vacancy, and the provisions of that Act and of any other enactment relating to the office of county coroner or to county coroners shall apply accordingly to the office of coroner and to the coroner for the Isle of Wight:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared that it is the will of His Majesty to relinquish His right of appointing a person to fill the office of coroner for the Isle of Wight as from the date of this Declaration.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as the Isle of Wight Coronership (Relinquishment) Declaration, 1927.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (4) of section four of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, that if His Majesty is pleased to declare in Council that it is His will to relinquish His right of appointing a person to fill the office of coroner for the jurisdiction of the Admiralty of England, thereupon the office of coroner for the jurisdiction of the Admiralty of England shall be thereby abolished:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that it is

the will of His Majesty to relinquish His right of appointing a person to fill the office of coroner for the jurisdiction of the Admiralty of England as from the date of this Declaration.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as the Admiralty Coronership (Abolition) Declaration, 1927.

WHEREAS by the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916, provision is made, amongst other things, for the transfer to the Minister of Labour of such powers and duties of any Government Department relating to labour or industry, whether conferred by Statute or otherwise, as His Majesty may, by Order in Council, transfer to him:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that, where any powers and duties are transferred by virtue of the said Act, the transfer is to take effect as from a date to be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council and that different dates may be fixed for different powers and duties:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. From and after the eighteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, there shall be transferred to the Minister of Labour the powers and duties of the Board of Education hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

(a) the power of approving arrangements made under Section one hundred and seven of the Education Act, 1921 by local education authorities for giving to boys and girls under the age of eighteen years assistance with respect to the choice of suitable employment; and

(b) the power of approving schemes made by local education authorities under Section six of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1923, regulating the exercise of their powers and duties under the said Section one hundred and seven of the Education Act, 1921, as extended by the said Section six of the first mentioned Act.

2. From and after the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, there shall be transferred to the Minister of Labour the powers and duties of the Board of Education under Section one hundred and eighteen of the Education Act, 1921, so far as they relate to grants to local education authorities in respect of the exercise of their powers and duties under the said Section one hundred and seven of that Act as extended as aforesaid.

3. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1927.

**WHEREAS** a majority of the whole Council of the City of Ripon in the County of York did on the 27th day of September, 1926, agree to petition, and the Council of the said City thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for the division of the City of Ripon into Wards:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 14th day of December, 1926, to fix the number of Wards into which the City of Ripon should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be four:

And whereas on the 6th day of January, 1927, the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the City of Ripon:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 28th June, 1927:—

" Scheme for the division of the City of Ripon into Wards and determining the Boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Orders in Council of 5th November, 1926, and 14th December, 1926.

## " CITY OF RIPON.

## " I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

" *Northgate Ward.*

" A line commencing at the junction of the City boundary with the fence forming the northern boundary of field 464 shown on O.S. plan CXIX.6. edition of 1909, thence eastward following the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence forming the western boundary of field 463 on the said plan thence northward following the said fence to its junction with the fence forming the northern boundary of field 463 thence northward to a point opposite the said junction in the centre of Kirkby Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Kirkby Road, Blossomgate and Westgate, to the Market Place, thence northward along the line of the frontage of the Buildings on the West Side of the Market Place to Fishergate and along the centre of Fishergate and North Street to the junction with Princess Road, thence eastward along the centre of Princess Road to the junction with Magdalens Road, thence northward along the centre of Magdalens Road to the junction with North Road thence north-eastward along the centre of North Road to the intersection of the City Boundary with

Hutton Bank thence following the City Boundary northward, westward and south-eastward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *Skellgate Ward.*

" A line commencing on the City Boundary at its junction with Greystone Lane, thence south-westward along the centre of Greystone Lane to the junction with Quarry Moor Lane, thence north-eastward along the centre of Quarry Moor Lane to the junction with Bondgate Back Lane (now called Southgate), thence northward along the centre of Southgate and Heckler Lane to a point in the centre of the River Skell thence eastward along the centre of the River Skell to a point in the centre of Bondgate Bridge thence northward along the centre of King Street and Bedern Bank to the junction with Kirkgate thence westward along the centre of Kirkgate and following the line of the frontage of the Buildings on the South Side of Market Place to the junction with the boundary of Northgate Ward thence westward following the Southern boundary of Northgate Ward hereinbefore defined to its junction with the City Boundary, thence following the line of the City Boundary westward, southward, eastward and northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *Allhallowgate Ward.*

" A line commencing at a point on the City Boundary in the centre of the River Ure opposite the end of the fence dividing fields 218 and 219 shown on O.S. plan CXIX.7. edition of 1909; thence south-westward along the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 219 and 206 on the said plan thence north-westward following the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 220 and 206 on the said plan thence westward following the line of the said fence and of the fence dividing fields 221 and 205 on the said plan to the Western Boundary of the London and North Eastern Railway (Leeds and Hartlepool Section); thence northward following the Western Boundary of the said Railway to its junction with the fence dividing fields 224 and 225 on the said plan; thence westward following the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 225 and 228 on the said plan; thence southward following the line of the said fence to its junction with the fence dividing fields 226 and 228 on the said plan; thence westward along the line of the said fence to its junction with Priest Lane; thence westward to a point in the centre of Priest Lane aforesaid; thence northward along the centre of Priest Lane to the junction with Residence Lane; thence westward along the centre of Residence Lane to the junction with St. Marygate; thence southward along the centre of St. Marygate to the junction with Minster Road thence westward along the centre of Minster Road to the boundary of Skellgate Ward hereinbefore defined, thence westward following the said boundary to its junction with the boundary of Northgate Ward hereinbefore defined thence northward, south-eastward, northward, north-westward and north-eastward following the said boundary to its junction with the City boundary thence southward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ *Bondgate Ward.*

“ A line commencing at the junction of the City boundary with the southern boundary of Allhallowgate Ward, thence westward following the southern boundary of the said Ward hereinbefore defined to its junction with the eastern boundary of Skellgate Ward thence southward and eastward following the eastern boundary of Skellgate Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the City boundary, thence eastward and northward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ The boundaries of the Wards as above described are more particularly delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 7th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting

the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Terling and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Fairsted both of which Benefices are situated in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Terling and Fairsted duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Terling is now full the Reverend William Edgar Morgan being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Fairsted is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said William Edgar Morgan has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Terling now belongs to the Right Honourable Robert John, Baron Rayleigh, who is also the Patron of the Benefice of Little Baddow, situate in the said County of Essex and in the said Diocese of Chelmsford:

“ And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Fairsted now belongs to the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, in right of his See:

“ And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be desirable for the purpose of more conveniently carrying into execution the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, in regard to the Union of Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed that an exchange should be made of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Fairsted for the Patronage of the said Benefice of Little Baddow to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted shall belong wholly to the said Robert John, Baron Rayleigh:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, as Diocesan and also as Patron of the said Benefice of Fairsted as aforesaid (testified by his signing this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Robert John, Baron Rayleigh, as Patron of the said Benefice of Little Baddow (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the Patronage of the said Benefice of Fairsted which is now vested in the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, as aforesaid, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, be trans-

ferred from the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, and his successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said Robert John, Baron Rayleigh, and that, in exchange for such Patronage so transferred, the Patronage of the said Benefice of Little Baddow which is now vested in the said Robert John, Baron Rayleigh, as aforesaid; shall in like manner and by the same authority be transferred from the said Robert John, Baron Rayleigh, and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

" 2. That the said Benefice of Terling and the said Benefice of Fairsted shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Fairsted with Terling' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Edgar Morgan if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Terling shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £50 in any one year.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Terling shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Fairsted and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the benefit of the Benefice of Southchurch, Christ Church, situate in the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

" 6. That upon and from the union taking effect the right of Patronage of and presentation to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the said Robert John, Baron Rayleigh.

" 7. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the two Benefices of Leyton, Saint Mary, and Grays, All Saints, both in the said Diocese of Chelmsford with the annual sums or yearly rent charges hereinafter mentioned

that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leyton, Saint Mary and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Grays, All Saints: the same annual sums or yearly rent charges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Leyton, Saint Mary, and Grays, All Saints, respectively and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Leyton, Saint Mary, and Grays, All Saints, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Leyton, Saint Mary, and Grays, All Saints, and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex to the said Benefices of Leyton, Saint Mary, and Grays, All Saints, or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for either or both of the said yearly charges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in any case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rent charge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable. And provided further that if at the date of the union taking effect any pension or pensions under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts shall be charged upon either or both of the said Benefices of Terling and Fairsted then the charges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid shall not become payable until any such pension or pensions has or have ceased to be payable.

" And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time

prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 7th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Mettingham with the Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint John (being part of the United Benefice of Ilketshall, St. John with Ilketshall, Saint Lawrence), and (2) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ilketshall, Saint Andrew, with the Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Lawrence (being part of the said United Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint John, with Ilketshall, Saint Lawrence), all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the said unions of Benefices duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said

Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for such unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Mettingham and Ilketshall, Saint Andrew, are now full, the Reverend Theodore Brocklesby Davis being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mettingham and the Reverend Alfred Huddle being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint Andrew, and the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint John with Ilketshall, Saint Lawrence, is at present vacant:

“ And whereas there is a pension of £50 per annum payable under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts out of the revenues of the said Benefice of Ilketshall, Saint John with Ilketshall, Saint Lawrence, to the Reverend Walter Samuel Wright, a former Incumbent thereof:

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. “ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Warwick, in the Diocese of Coventry:

“ Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Warwick should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed, together with any existing grant or grants now payable by us in augmentation of the income of the said Archdeaconry, will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for such Archdeaconry out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole income of that Archdeaconry, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1000 per annum:

“ And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £100 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Warwick shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Great Waldingfield and Little Waldingfield duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ips-

wich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Great Waldingfield and Little Waldingfield are now full, the Reverend Thomas Cecil Alexander being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield and the Reverend Ernest Harold Melling being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Little Waldingfield:

"And whereas there is charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield a pension (hereinafter referred to as the said pension) of £250, per annum to the Reverend Charles Albert Stokes, late Incumbent of such Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield and the said Benefice of Little Waldingfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great and Little Waldingfield' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Little Waldingfield only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield and the then Incumbent of Little Waldingfield shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Little Waldingfield: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Little Waldingfield if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield shall have been instituted to Great Waldingfield subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice: but if he shall have been instituted to Great Waldingfield before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice

of Great Waldingfield following such avoidance of the Benefice of Little Waldingfield and the then Incumbent of Little Waldingfield shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Great Waldingfield shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Waldingfield shall have the second turn.

"5. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the said pension which ever shall the later happen all the Tithe Rent Charge, glebe lands, and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the respective Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Haverhill, both in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Haverhill, the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect or of the cessation of the said pension, as the case may be, due and payable to the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged respectively and the annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Haverhill, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of June and the first day of December in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Haverhill, respectively, shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply: Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex to the said Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Haverhill, or either of them

any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the yearly rentcharges hereby created as aforesaid, then the said yearly rentcharges in both cases, or rentcharge in either case in which equivalent endowments shall have been granted conveyed and annexed as aforesaid, shall thereupon and henceforth cease and be no longer payable.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.
