**W**HEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the Republic of China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1918 (53-4 V. c. 87, and 3-4 Geo. V, c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1927," and shall be read as one with "The China Order in Council, 1925," hereinafter called the "Principal Order."

II. The power to make Regulations conferred upon the Minister by Article 209 of the Principal Order shall include a power to make Regulations for the requisitioning, for the purposes of the requirements of His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces in China, of land or property belonging to British subjects or British Companies, and for purposes ancillary thereto:

Provided that:—

(i) Such Regulations shall not be made unless the Minister is of opinion that special circumstances exist which necessitate the exercise of such power;

(ii) The power of requisitioning conferred by such Regulations shall not be exercised after such date as the Minister may, by notice under his hand, determine as the date of the cessation of such special circumstances;

(iii) Such Regulations shall make provision for the period during which the requisitioning authority may retain possession of any requisitioned land after the date determined in accordance with sub-paragraph (ii) of this Article.

III. Regulations made under Article 2 of this Order may provide for the establishment of a Tribunal to assess the amount of compensation payable in respect of any requisition affected under the Regulations and for the hearing of appeals from such Tribunal, and may prescribe the principles to be followed by the Tribunal in the assessment of such compensation.

IV. The power to make Rules of Court conferred on the Judge of the Supreme Court by Article 155 of the Principal Order shall include a power to make Rules of Procedure for any Tribunal established by Regulations made under Article 2 of this Order.

V. For the purposes of this Order the word "land" includes any interest in land, and any building or part of a building, any pier, jetty or other structure on the shore or bed of the sea or of any river, and any easement or right over or in relation to land.

VI. This Order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

And the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

**WHEREAS** by section six of the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) Act, 1925 (15 & 16 Geo. V, cap. 42) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted among other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of the Act shall, subject to such modifications and adaptations, to be specified in the Order, as appear to His Majesty necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case, apply to ships registered in any British possession outside the United Kingdom, other than the Dominions mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act, as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in this Order, apply to ships registered in the Colonies mentioned in the Schedule in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Act shall apply to ships registered in the Colonies mentioned in the Schedule in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—

(1) For the expressions "the Board of Trade" and "officers of the Board of Trade" there shall be respectively substituted the expressions "the Officer Administering the Government" and "officers authorised for such purpose by the Officer Administering the Government."

(2) For the words "United Kingdom" in section five of the Act there shall be substituted the name of the Colony.

(3) Sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Act shall not apply to (a) ships registered in the Straits Settlements or (b) ships registered in Seychelles by the Port Officer for voyages between the Islands shown in Schedule A of the Regulations made by the Governor in Executive Council under Sections 16 and 17 of the Unseaworthy Vessels Ordinance, 1896.

(4) For the purpose of the penalties prescribed in section four of the Act Rupees 10 shall be taken as the equivalent of £1 in the case of Mauritius.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Colonies) Order, 1927.

**WHEREAS** by sub-section (1) of section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vic. c. 60), it is enacted that whenever it appears to His Majesty the King in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in His Majesty's Dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Government of Latvia and are now in force in that country:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Latvian Tonnage Order, 1927.

2. Latvian ships, the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 4th June, 1925, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation bearing date the 7th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Agnes, Hove, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Barnabas, Hove, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, and of the said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Agnes, Hove, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, and with the consent of the Reverend Archdall Malden Hill, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Chichester and the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Hove, in the said County and Diocese, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, and of the

said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Agnes, Hove, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove.’

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Barnabas, Hove, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Hove, upon the north by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, at a point in Old Shoreham Road opposite to the middle of Sackville Road, and extending thence southward to and along the middle of Sackville Road for a distance of  $15\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the West Coast Line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway across Sackville Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of  $23\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, from the said Parish of Hove.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of West Blatchington, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south partly by the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, and partly by the said Parish of Hove, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hove from the said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, at a point on the southern side of Old Shoreham Road opposite to the middle of the road called Shirley Drive, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of Shirley Drive for a distance of  $26\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called The Droveaway, and extending thence westward along the middle of The Droveaway for a distance of  $19\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Goldstone Crescent opposite to the middle of the bridleway leading across Hove Park and past the southern side of the Goldstone Water Works to West Blatchington,

and extending thence north westward to and along the middle of the said bridleway for a distance of 24½ chains or thereabouts to a point on the western side of the roadway leading from Old Shoreham Road to the Goldstone Water Works upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, from the said Parish of West Blatchington."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, and the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cures (hereinafter called 'the said Benefices') of Saint Catherine, Liverpool, of Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool, of Saint Agnes, Toxteth Park, and of Saint Faith, Great Crosby, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the Benefices of Saint Catherine, Liverpool; Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool; and Saint Agnes, Toxteth Park, is vested in Howard Douglas Horsfall, of Mere Bank, Liverpool, Esquire, the Right Honourable Charles

Lindley, Viscount Halifax, the Right Honourable Walter George Frank, Baron Phillimore, the Reverend Stephen Richard Platt Moulds-dale, of Saint Chad's College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Ewart Douglas Horsfall, of Sandford Park, Sandford Saint Martin, in the County of Oxford, Esquire, as Trustees upon the Trusts declared in a Deed bearing date the 4th day of November, 1889, and the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice of Saint Faith, Great Crosby, is vested in the said Howard Douglas Horsfall; Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax; Walter George Frank, Baron Phillimore; Stephen Richard Platt Moulds-dale; and Ewart Douglas Horsfall as Trustees upon the Trusts of another Deed bearing date the 8th day of February, 1898, and the said Howard Douglas Horsfall; Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax; Walter George Frank, Baron Phillimore; Stephen Richard Platt Moulds-dale; and Ewart Douglas Horsfall are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefices in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Howard Douglas Horsfall; Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax; Walter George Frank, Baron Phillimore; Stephen Richard Platt Moulds-dale; and Ewart Douglas Horsfall are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint Catherine, Liverpool; Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool; Saint Agnes, Toxteth Park; and Saint Faith, Great Crosby, should be transferred to and be vested in the Governing Body of Saint Chad's Hall, Durham:

"And whereas the Governing Body of Saint Chad's Hall are willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, is consenting to the transfer of Patronage which is hereinafter recommended and proposed and in token of such his consent which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices of Saint Catherine, Liverpool; Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool; Saint Agnes, Toxteth Park; and Saint Faith, Great Crosby, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the rights of Patronage or Advowsons so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arise or exist, that is to say, in the Ecclesiastical District of Saint Catherine, Liverpool, the New Parish of Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool, the New Parish of Saint Agnes, Toxteth Park, and the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Faith, Great Crosby:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Howard Douglas Horsfall; Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax; Walter George Frank, Baron Phillimore; Stephen Richard Platt

Mouldsdales; and Ewart Douglas Horsfall, being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Governing Body of Saint Chad's Hall (in testimony whereof the Governing Body have caused their Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint Catherine, Liverpool; Saint Paul, Stanley, Liverpool; Saint Agnes, Toxteth Park; and Saint Faith, Great Crosby, shall be transferred to the said Governing Body of Saint Chad's Hall and their successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Governing Body of Saint Chad's Hall and by their successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint James, Croydon Common, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Martin, Croydon, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, as Bishop of the Diocese, with the consent of the Reverend Edward Sydney Woods, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury and the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, and as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint James, Croydon Common, and with the consent of the Reverend Agmond Edward Wilkinson, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Saint James, Croydon Common, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint James, Croydon Common, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Martin, Croydon, situate as aforesaid,

and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint James, Croydon Common, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, which is bounded upon the north west by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Croydon, upon the north east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, upon the south east and upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Croydon Common, at the centre of Windmill Bridge which carries Lower Addiscombe Road across the main line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Croydon and Balham Line of the same railway, and extending thence first north eastward and then northward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Croydon Common, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Croydon.

"II. **AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.**

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of East Suffolk and West Suffolk which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county borough of Ipswich have in pursuance of the above Act duly fixed minimum rates of wages for male workers employed in agriculture for time work during the Corn Harvest in 1927 in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. For the purpose of the application of the rates set out in Clause 1 (a) above the hours of harvest work shall be 12 on any week-day while the crops are being carted and 11 on any week-day while any other harvest work is in progress, if so required by the employer, but so that the total number of hours required by the employer in respect of the above rates shall not exceed 70 in any one week.

4. For the purpose of this Order the hours of work shall not include meal times.

5. Any existing rate or Order in so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded.

6. This Order shall apply to the corn harvest in 1927 only.
