WHEREAS by the Suffragans Nomination Act, 1888, it is enacted, that from and after the passing of that Act for the purposes of the Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14, intituled "An Act for Nomination and Consecration of Suffragans within this Realm," such other Towns as His Majesty the King may from time to time by Order in Council direct shall be taken and accepted for Sees of Bishops Suffragans as if they had been included in that Act, and that that Act shall be construed and have effect accordingly:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, under and by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said recited Act, and all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and doth hereby direct, that the Town of which the name is scheduled to this Order, shall be taken and accepted for a See of a Bishop Suffragan as if it had been included in the above-

mentioned Act of the 26th year of the reign of King Henry the Eighth, Chapter 14.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act

of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation bearing date the 7th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, the New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, the New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, the New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford, the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, the New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Brad-

ford, the New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, the New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford, the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Frizinghall, and the New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

“ Whereas District Chapelries have been assigned to each of the Churches of Saint Jude, Manningham; Christ Church, Bradford; Saint Luke, Bradford; Saint Barnabas, Heaton; Saint Mark, Manningham; Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Bradford; Saint James, Bolton; Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham; Saint Chrysostom, Bradford; and Saint Margaret, Frizinghall, and a Consolidated Chapelry has been assigned to the Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, and separate Districts for spiritual purposes have been constituted by the names of (Saint Paul) Manningham, and Saint Chad, Manningham, by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the 3rd Column of the following Table:—

“ And whereas the District Chapelries, the Consolidated Chapelry and the Districts named in the foregoing Table have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parishes shall be altered so that, *first*, all those portions of the

said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured purple shall be dis severed from such New Parishes and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Bradford, in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of Bradford; *secondly*, all that portion of the said Parish of Bradford which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured dark green shall be dis severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford; *thirdly*, all those portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Bradford, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon

coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford; *fourthly*, all that portion of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured light green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton; *fifthly*, all that portion of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham which is described in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured light blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham; *sixthly*, all those portions of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, which are described in the Sixth Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham; *seventhly*, all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, which is described in the Seventh Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured dark blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham; *eighthly*, all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, which is described in the Eighth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured brown shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford; *ninthly*, all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, which is described in the Ninth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured red shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham; and *tenthly*, all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, which is described in the Tenth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured orange shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Frizinghall.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in

accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or any of them, or any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The First Schedule.

" The territory to be restored to the Parish of Bradford, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, being:—

" I. All that portion of the New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north east, upon the south east and upon part of the south by the said Parish of Bradford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south, upon the south west, and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bradford from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, at the junction of Market Street with the road called Kirkgate, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Kirkgate for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Cheapside, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Cheapside for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with School Street, and extending thence first north eastward and then northward along the middle of School Street for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Valley Road, and extending thence in a straight line due east across Valley Road for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Leeming Street near its southern end, and extending thence northward along the middle of Leeming Street for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the point near its junction with North Brook Street where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, the said Parish of Bradford and the New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, all meet.

" II. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the west, upon the north and upon part of the east by the said Parish of Bradford and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the east and upon the south west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bradford from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford, at the junction of Eastbrook Lane with Vicar Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Vicar Lane for a distance of 3¼ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bridge Street, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Bridge Street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke Bradford, from the said Parish of Bradford.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford, being:—

" All that portion of the said Parish of Bradford which is bounded upon part of the west by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford, upon the south partly by the last named Parish

and partly by the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Bowling, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north east by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the remaining part of the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bradford, from the said Parish of Bradford at the junction of Carroll Street with Leeds Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Leeds Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Vicar Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Vicar Lane for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bradford from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Bradford.

" The Third Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford, being:—

" I. All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, the New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, and the New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon the east partly by the said New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford, and partly by the New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, from the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, crosses the middle of Queen's Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Queen's Road for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the Leeds and Bradford Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, and also the boundary which divides the last named Parish from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford) for a distance of 70 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries School Street across such line of railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of School Street for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Valley Road, and extending thence in a straight line due east across Valley Road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Leeming Street near its southern end, and extending thence northward along the middle of Leeming Street for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point near its junction with North Brook Street where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, the said Parish of Bradford, and the said New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford, all meet.

" II. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the west and upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford, upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Bradford, meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Peel Park, and extending thence southward along such wall or fence for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall forming the north western boundary of the Bradford Corporation Refuse Destruction, and extending thence south westward along the last mentioned wall for a distance of $3\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to its south western end on the north eastern side of Cliffe Road, and extending thence south westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Cliffe Road and the Cliffe Wood and Spinkwell Quarries) for a distance of $20\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the junction of Bolton Road and Wapping Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Bradford, from the said New Parish of Saint Chrysostom, Bradford.

" The Fourth Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint James, Bolton, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham which lies to the east of the middle of the Leeds and Bradford Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway and to the north of the middle of Queen's Road.

" The Fifth Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham which is bounded upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, from the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham at the junction of Manningham Lane with Thorncliffe Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Thorncliffe Road for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Midland Road, and continuing thence north eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Leeds and Bradford Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of such line of rail-

way for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham from the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham.

" The Sixth Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, being:—

" I. All that portion of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham which is bounded upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east, upon the north east and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, from the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham at the junction of Manningham Lane with Thorncliffe Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Thorncliffe Road for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Midland Road, and continuing thence north eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said Leeds and Bradford Branch Line of railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Queen's Road across the said line of railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Queen's Road for a distance of $20\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manningham Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Manningham Lane for a distance of 4 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Marlborough Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham.

" II. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, upon the north east by the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the south west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, at the junction of Lumb Lane with Green Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Green Lane for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Salt Street and Fraser Street, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Fraser Street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Priestman Street, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Priestman Street for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham.

" The Seventh Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham,

and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, which is bounded upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north west by the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, at the junction of Carlisle Road with Priestman Street, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Priestman Street for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham.

" The Eighth Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, which is bounded upon the south and upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, upon the north east by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, at the junction of the road called Whetley Hill with the roadway running along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of the road called White's View, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hollings Road and the road called Hollings Terrace, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Hollings Terrace for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the fence at its present western end, and extending thence south eastward along such fence, along the fences forming the western boundaries of the houses and premises known as Number 105, Hollings Terrace, and Number 32, Penzance Street, and along the fence at the present western end of Penzance Street for a distance in all of $2\frac{3}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford.

" The Ninth Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford,

which is bounded upon the west and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the south east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, at a point in the middle of the footpath on the southern side of Penzance Street opposite to the fence forming the western boundary of the gardens attached to the houses situate on the western side of Fearnside Street, and extending thence southward to and along such fence for a distance of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its southern end, and continuing thence southward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Thornton Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Thornton Road for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brownroyd Street, and extending southward along the middle of Brownroyd Street for a distance of $11\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Duncombe Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Duncombe Street for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Manningham.

"The Tenth Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Frizinghall, both in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, which lies to the east of the middle of Keighley Road."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Incumbents of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, have offered certain observations upon or objections to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, and the Incumbent of the said New Parish of (Saint Paul) Manningham, have not signified their assent or offered any objection to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since the date of the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas notwithstanding the said observations or objections, the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Great Stainton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bishopton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Great Stainton and Bishopton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Durham and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and the said Bishop of Durham signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Bishopton is now full, the Reverend Robert Henry Reilly being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Great Stainton is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Robert Henry Reilly has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Great Stainton and the said Benefice of Bishopton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bishopton with Great Stainton' and that such United

Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Stockton on Tees but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Robert Henry Reilly if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bishopton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bishopton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Great Stainton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Great Stainton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Bishopton having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Stow, in the Diocese of Lincoln:

" Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Stow should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

" And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed, together with any existing grant or grants now payable by us in augmentation of the income of the said Archdeaconry, will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for such Archdeaconry out of the Common Fund created by

the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole income of that Archdeaconry, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1000 per annum:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, or on such other quarterly days as the payments now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the income of the said Archdeaconry are usually made in every year to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Stow and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £100, such yearly sum to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1927. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £100 shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £100 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Stow shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Members of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, humbly desire to tender our deep sense of the great honour conferred upon us by your visiting Liverpool accompanied by Her Majesty The Queen, to open the Gladstone Dock System and we assure Your Majesties of our deep loyalty and affection.

This visit to our Estate is the third which we have been privileged to receive since your Accession and we also recall with pleasure visits during the last few years of H.R.H. Prince of Wales, and T.R.H. Duke and Duchess of York and we would offer to Your Majesties our sincere congratulations on the safe return of T.R.H. Duke and Duchess from their recent visit to some of your Dominions Overseas.

Your Majesty will no doubt recollect that at the time of your visit in July 1913 when Your Majesty opened the Gladstone Graving Dock, it was then indicated to Your Majesty that the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board contemplated the construction of Docks which would be able to accommodate vessels 1,100 feet in length. The Gladstone Graving Dock is included in this system of Docks, the completion of which has been inevitably delayed by the Great War, and these Docks we now ask Your Majesty graciously to declare open.

We are glad to have this opportunity of again expressing our thanks to Your Majesty for the great interest which Your Majesty has always made manifest by coming personally in touch with great projects designed for the improvement of trade between Great Britain and Your Majesty's Dominions beyond the Seas and Foreign Countries. This personal touch is again displayed by the gracious act Your Majesty is now performing by opening the Gladstone Docks to-day.

We earnestly pray that every blessing may rest upon Your Majesties and upon the Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the enthusiastic welcome given to the Queen and myself.

I well remember our visit of fourteen years ago to open the Gladstone Graving Dock, the first instalment of this new group of docks. To-day I heartily congratulate the Board upon the completion of a great enterprise. It is only right that on this occasion a tribute should be paid to the foresight of those who planned this admirable system of Docks; and to their tenacity and perseverance in carrying out their scheme in spite of the exceptional difficulties consequent upon the Great War.

I understand that the Gladstone Docks are designed to accommodate the largest liners now afloat and that the Graving Dock has already been used by vessels of this class and,

during the War, by the largest Battleships. They constitute therefore the most striking development of the work of the Board and a notable addition to the splendid series of docks which present so impressive a spectacle to the visitor approaching the City of Liverpool. But, though the latest, they are not likely to be the last development of that work. I confidently hope that the trade of Merseyside, as the chief port of the industrial areas in the North and Midlands, will continue to flourish and expand; and that in the future, as in the past, the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board will ensure the provision of necessary facilities for the growth of the commerce which they serve. We all deeply regret that the late Chairman of the Board, whose energy has contributed so much to the success of its work, has unfortunately been compelled by reasons of health to resign his office before to-day's inaugural ceremony.

Your Address reminds us that the increase of commerce is of far more than merely local interest. The expansion of your trade implies an advancement of world commerce and a strengthening of those links of mutual advantage which unite the Peoples of the British Empire, and further its good relations with friendly countries in every quarter of the globe. I shall always be happy to be associated with any enterprise directed to this beneficent end; and I appreciate your assurances that you recognise my personal solicitude in such undertakings.

I declare the Gladstone Dock System open for traffic; and I pray that, by God's blessing, it may serve to foster and increase the commerce of Liverpool and its sister ports on Merseyside.

CORPORATION OF EDINBURGH.

To The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, Your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Council of the City and Royal Burgh of Edinburgh, respectfully approach Your Majesty and gratefully acknowledge the honour which you are doing the City by your presence with us to-day.

The Corporation, in common with other Local Authorities throughout the country, were at the close of the War confronted with the very serious problem of providing adequate housing accommodation for the citizens. This problem has engaged their unremitting attention since the passing of the Act of 1919, with the result that up till this date they have provided, or are in course of providing, a total of 5,724 new houses.

While the Corporation have been pre-occupied with the provision of new houses,

they have also had before them the cognate question of dealing with the evils which exist in connection with a very large proportion of the existing houses. A few years ago they drew up a schedule of areas in the City where the housing was so unsatisfactory that nothing short of Slum Clearance Schemes would remedy the evils which were found to be existing. In accordance with that policy the Corporation have resolved to proceed with a Slum Clearance Scheme for one of the most congested areas of the City, viz., St. Leonard's Ward.

In order to make provision for a large proportion of the people who will be displaced by this Scheme, the Corporation recently acquired this beautiful site, which forms part of the Prestonfield Estate, and they propose to erect upon it about 600 houses.

Knowing as we do the deep interest which Your Majesty takes in all matters affecting the welfare of your Scottish subjects, it appeared to the Corporation that it would be fitting that Your Majesty should be associated with the initiation of this scheme. It is a matter of much gratification to us that Her Majesty the Queen is also present on this occasion, and on behalf of the citizens, and on our own behalf, we desire to express to Your Majesties the profound feelings of pride and satisfaction with which we regard Your Majesties' residence in your ancient Palace of Holyrood. We trust that your present visit to the City will be a happy and memorable one.

We would take this opportunity of renewing the assurance of our loyal and devoted attachment to Your Majesty's Person, Throne and Government.

The KING's gracious reply was as follows:—

The Queen and I heartily thank the Lord Provost, Magistrates, Council and Citizens of the City and Royal Burgh of Edinburgh for their warm and loyal welcome. It is always a great pleasure to us to renew our association with this ancient and beautiful City and to make our home at Holyrood.

I have followed with interest the enterprise and initiative which the Town Council have directed towards the improvement of the conditions under which the Citizens live. Ranking prominently amongst their achievements is the work which they have carried on over a period of years towards the solution of the local housing problem, and I have seen with much satisfaction something of the progress already made.

I heartily commend the Corporation's policy of clearing and improving the slum areas of the City; and the Queen and I are very glad to be associated with this scheme at Prestonfield which I am now inaugurating, and which, by providing healthy and convenient homes in pleasant surroundings, will add materially to the welfare of a large number of my people who are at present denied these blessings.

The scheme has been carefully laid out and

designed so as to be worthy of the natural beauties of the site; and I trust that its development will be such as to enable the Corporation in the near future to make substantial progress with the task of clearing and reconstructing one of the congested areas in the City.

Housing—especially of the poorer classes—enlists the deep sympathy and warmest interest of the Queen and myself, and I wish every success to the Corporation in this particular undertaking, and health and happiness to the future occupants of the houses to be built here.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Councillors of the City and Royal Burgh of Glasgow, desire for ourselves and on behalf of the citizens to offer Your Majesty a hearty welcome to our City, along with the expression of our loyal devotion and of our grateful appreciation of the honour you have conferred upon the City in coming to inaugurate the new Kelvin Hall of Industries and to lay a Memorial Stone in connection with the completion of a new bridge over the River Clyde at Oswald Street.

We regard it as an additional honour that Her Majesty the Queen has been able to accompany you. She is beloved by all Your Majesty's subjects not only for Her personal charm but for Her warm sympathy in all that affects the welfare of all classes of the people and the citizens of Glasgow are proud to extend a cordial welcome to Her on this occasion.

The Kelvin Hall when finally completed, will have cost, including the site about £250,000 and will be a valuable addition to the many public buildings of the City. For many years it was felt that a large and commodious Hall suitable for all kinds of Exhibitions, Trade Fairs, Promenade Concerts and Entertainments was absolutely essential for the City and that desire has now been realised by the erection and inauguration of this building. Many exhibitions connected with important Industries, Housing and Health, Shipbuilding and Education, as also Motor Shows, Flower Shows, and other enterprises were successfully held in the temporary building which previously occupied this site. The British Industries Fair held in that building was visited by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in March 1921; the Motor Show held there in January 1923 was opened by His Royal Highness the Duke of York, and the Flower Show in September 1924 was opened by Her Royal Highness the Duchess of York. The City was greatly encouraged by these Royal Recognitions, as it is by the presence of Your Majesties to-day.

The Corporation are also deeply sensible of the signal mark of Royal favour conferred upon the City by your Majesty personally associating yourself with the completion of the new Bridge, and in laying a Memorial Stone to signalise the event. The Bridge has been erected to cope with the ever increasing cross river and harbour and dock traffic and to

relieve the congestion of traffic in the centre of the City, and the results anticipated will it is confidently hoped be largely attained by the opening of the Bridge.

POST OFFICE REGISTER REGULATIONS, 1925—AMENDMENT OF REGULATION 13.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have in conjunction with the Postmaster General made the following Provisional Regulations dated the 15th July, 1927, under the Act 5 & 6 Geo. V, c. 93 amending Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925, dated August 7th, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925 No. 788):—

(1) The following shall be substituted for paragraph (1) of Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925:—

“(1) Subject to the terms of the prospectus relating to the issue of any stock on the register and subject as hereinafter provided, the holder of any stock or securities on the books of the Bank of England or of the Bank of Ireland may, if the stock or securities is or are of a description corresponding to any stock of that issue, exchange that stock or those securities for stock on the register of a corresponding amount and description:

“Provided that no person shall be entitled to exchange at any one time stock or securities of a nominal amount exceeding one thousand pounds, unless the stock or securities is or are the property of a friendly society entitled under section thirty-nine of the Income Tax Act, 1918, to exemption from income tax.”

(2) These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Register Regulations, 1927.

THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDER, 1927, SPECIAL ORDER DATED 1927, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918 (8 AND 9 GEO. 5. C. 32) VARYING THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDERS, 1920 AND 1926.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) by a Special Order called the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, dated the 9th day of January, 1920, applied the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Special Order;

And whereas the description of the Trade in the said Appendix was altered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section 1 of section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the said Special Orders by altering the description of the trade therein specified;

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, and of any other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby

makes a Special Order varying the said Special Orders:—

(1) The description of the trade set out in the Appendix to this Order shall be substituted for that set out in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, as altered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1927.

DRAFT DEFINITION OF THE MILK DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE.

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, the Milk Distributive Trade shall consist of the following operations:—

- (i) the wholesale and retail sale of milk;
- (ii) the sale of other goods by workers mainly employed in the sale specified in paragraph 1 (i) hereof;
- (iii) all work incidental to the sale specified in paragraph 1 (i) hereof.

2. Work incidental to the sale specified in paragraph 1 (i) hereof shall include, inter alia:—

- (a) collecting, delivering, despatching;
- (b) pasteurising, sterilising, homogenising, humanising, cooling, separating and all work performed in connection with any other processes in the preparation of milk;
- (c) blending, testing and sampling of milk;
- (d) cleaning of utensils, receptacles, vehicles, premises, plant, machinery;
- (e) stoking, attending to boiler, plant or machinery, fire lighting, portering of coal or other fuel;
- (f) horse keeping and harness cleaning;
- (g) portering, lift or hoist-operating, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing;
- (h) boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, packing and unpacking;
- (i) clerical work or canvassing carried on in conjunction with the work specified in paragraph 1 hereof.

3. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions, the Milk Distributive Trade shall not include any of the following operations:—

- (a) the wholesale sale of milk (and operations incidental thereto) from an establishment at which milk products are manufactured and from which unseparated milk is not ordinarily sold as such;
- (b) the wholesale sale of milk direct from the farm where the milk was produced and all operations incidental thereto;

(c) the following operations when performed at a farm where the only milk dealt with is that produced on the farm:—cooling, bottling, cleaning of the dairy premises and of utensils and receptacles used thereon;

(d) work done by a worker for an employer who employs that worker mainly in agriculture or in operations specified in paragraph 3 (b) or (c) when performed in the circumstances described therein;

(e) the sale of milk in restaurants, shops or similar premises by waiters or shop assistants who are not mainly engaged upon such sale;

(f) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(g) carting and operations incidental thereto where the business carried on consists exclusively of such operations;

(h) work done by or on behalf of the Post Office.

4. For the purpose of this Schedule the expression "milk" means milk other than dried or condensed milk.

(Power to Wokingham Corporation to acquire and use additional lands for Gas Works purposes; Further provisions as to supply of Gas and manufacture of residual products; Borrowing of money; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts and other matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wokingham (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") whose address is The Town Hall, Wokingham, for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under and in pursuance of Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Corporation to purchase, take on lease acquire and hold the lands in the borough of Wokingham hereinafter more particularly described, and all property rights and interests in the said lands.

The lands hereinbefore referred to are:—

2. To authorise the Corporation upon the lands hereinbefore described, or some part or parts thereof to construct, maintain, alter, extend, renew or improve works for the manufacture, storage, conversion, utilisation and distribution of gas and of residual products arising from such manufacture, and to make and store gas, and to make, store, purchase, utilise and distribute all such residual products and materials as aforesaid, and upon such lands to construct and maintain houses, buildings and other works connected with their gas undertaking.

3. To empower the Corporation to acquire additional lands to those hereinbefore described for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

4. To confer further powers upon the Corporation with reference to the purchase and utilisation of residual products arising from the manufacture of gas on their existing gas-lands and on the lands referred to in paragraph 1 of this notice.

5. To make further provision with regard to the supply of gas by the Corporation, and in particular to provide for the following matters:—The allowance of discount for

prompt payment of gas charges; the relief of the Corporation from obligation to supply for any purpose other than lighting or domestic use where the capacity of the main is insufficient; the mode of cutting off supplies by the Corporation and the expense of reconnecting any discontinued supply; further power to the Corporation to enter premises for the purpose of removing pipes and apparatus where supplies of gas are discontinued and for the purpose of inspecting meters fittings &c., power to compel repairs in case of danger; power to lay pipes and apparatus for conducting oil or other materials; requiring the provision of valves in cases where high pressure air is used in connection with the consumption or use of gas; the construction and placing of pipes, &c., the provision of dwellinghouses for employees, offices, showrooms, &c., the provision of anti-fluctuators in connection with gas engines; the date when erroneous registration shall be deemed to have arisen in a defective meter; charges for special readings of meters; licences for the use of patents; power to give or take a supply of gas in bulk; the authentication and service of notices; and the inclusion of several sums due from a person in one summons or warrant.

6. To authorise the Corporation to borrow money for the purchase of land and the construction of works and for other the purposes of the Order and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the District Fund and General District Rate the General Rate Fund and the General Rate of the borough of Wokingham and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenue and other property of the Corporation or of any such securities and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities, to provide that moneys borrowed under the powers of the Order shall not be reckoned within the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

7. To repeal, alter or amend or to re-enact or incorporate in the Order, with or without amendment, some or all of the provisions of the Wokingham Gas Orders 1894 to 1914 and any other Act or Order relating to the Corporation.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 1st day of October, 1927. Any such objections shall state:—

- (a) The specific ground of objection, and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
