The following Addresses were presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the Gladstone Dock System at Liverpool on the 19th July, 1927:—

LIVERPOOL CORPORATION.

May it please Your Majesties,

We, Your Majesties' loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Liverpool, in Council assembled, beg leave to approach Your Majesties with an expression of the dutiful homage of ourselves and the loyal community we represent, and our gratification at the high privilege of welcoming Your Majesties on this the memorable occasion of your visit to Liverpool.

It is a matter of great satisfaction to the Citizens of Liverpool that Your Majesties have once more evinced their deep interest in all that concerns the welfare of your people by your presence in this City, for the purpose of opening the Gladstone Dock System, which has been constructed to meet the evergrowing requirements of the Port of Liverpool, an event of great importance to our commerce and local history, and Your Majesties' presence on this auspicious occasion is regarded by the Citizens as another example of the profound interest taken by Your Majesties in all movements having for their object the welfare and prosperity of your subjects.

It is our heartfelt prayer that the Almighty may continue to bestow every blessing upon Your Majesties, and that Your Majesties may both be long spared to guide the destinies of this great Empire, to advance the happiness of which your best endeavours are always directed.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I am happy to receive your loyal and dutiful Address, and the Queen and I are gratified by the hearty welcome accorded to us by the Citizens of Liverpool.

The occasion of my last visit to Liverpool was the Consecration of your new Cathedral; and I was then impressed by the faith in the future of their City which inspired the Citizens to design so great a work to be completed by generations to come. To-day we celebrate the completion of the latest stage of a secular enterprise which has occupied the thoughts and labours of generations in the past. It is a pleasure to take part in an event of such importance to Liverpool and to see, in the opening of the Gladstone Dock System, the successful termination of a work which testifies to the growth of your trade and which can be used to promote its still further development. I have every confidence that it will be used effectively to this end, for I fully realise the devotion of its Citizens and their zeal and energy in everything that concerns the general welfare of Liverpool.

I thank you most sincerely for your prayers and good wishes on our behalf; and I appre-
