WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of July, 1927 (C.W. 6407/27), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas certain Schoolmasters, Royal Navy have been transferred to corresponding positions in the Royal Marines, and it is necessary therefore, to establish conditions for such transfers :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 1st day of July, 1927, the following rules for the transfer of School-

masters, Royal Navy to the Royal Marines as Schoolmasters, Royal Marines :

“ (i) Transferees to retain their Royal Navy seniority, provided that such seniority does not render them senior to any Schoolmasters, Royal Marines; otherwise their seniority to date from the same day as that of the junior Schoolmaster, Royal Marines to whom they are to be junior on the List.

“ (ii) Full and half pay to be at the rates for Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, according to Royal Marine seniority, but transferred Schoolmasters who are subsequently promoted to Headmaster and Chief Schoolmaster, Royal Marines, to be subject, when promoted, to the rates of full and half pay established by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 7th day of February, 1927, for Officers of those ranks who entered into the Royal Marines as Officers after the 16th October, 1926, notwithstanding that such transferred Officers may have been originally entered in the Royal Navy on or before the 16th October, 1926, or that their Royal Marine seniority may date from or earlier than that date.

“ (iii) The whole of the service of transferred Officers as Schoolmasters, whether in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, to count for purposes of retired

pay or retirement gratuity on the appropriate scales for Schoolmasters, Royal Marines.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duties so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that section:

And whereas by virtue of section forty-five of the Finance Act, 1922, the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, has effect as if the Federated Malay States were a British Possession:

And whereas by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, it is provided that the reference to the United Kingdom in the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, shall, in the application of the provisions of that section to Northern Ireland be construed as a reference to Northern Ireland:

And whereas by section eight of the Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, it is provided that the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, shall have effect as respects death duties payable in Northern Ireland with the like extension as is enacted by the said section forty-five of the Finance Act, 1922:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the law of the Federated Malay States as respects duties leviable by the Government of those States in respect of property situate in Northern Ireland when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the enactments and Order aforesaid, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that section twenty of

the Finance Act, 1894, as in force in Northern Ireland, shall apply, as respects death duties payable in Northern Ireland, to the Federated Malay States.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure 1926, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for augmenting the incomes of the Archdeaconry of Northampton and the Archdeaconry of Oakham, both in the Diocese of Peterborough:

“Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the incomes of the said Archdeaconry of Northampton and of the said Archdeaconry of Oakham should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“And whereas the grants hereinafter recommended and proposed, together with any existing grant or grants now payable by us in augmentation of the incomes of the said Archdeaconries, will not have the effect of raising the annual incomes provided for such Archdeaconries out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole incomes of those Archdeaconries, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1,000 per annum:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, or on such other quarterly days as the payments now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the incomes of the respective Archdeaconries are usually made in every year (first) to the Archdeacon of the said Arch-

deaconry of Northampton and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a yearly sum of £300, and (secondly) to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Oakham and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £100, such yearly sums to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1927. Provided always that before any payment in respect of any of the said yearly sums shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

" And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacons of the said Archdeaconries, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacons.

" And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive one of the said yearly sums of £300 and £100 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Northampton and the said Archdeacon of Oakham respectively shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day

of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Exeter, which is known as The Palace, Exeter:

" Whereas the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of Exeter, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

" And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £250 (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Exeter:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £250 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, and endowments or emoluments, which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 15 years or until the said sum of £250, with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twelfth part of the said principal sum of £250 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest

directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Exeter, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £250 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Yockleton, in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Yockleton is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, in his private capacity:

"And whereas the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Yockleton, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Hereford:

"And whereas the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token of such his desire and of his willingness as such Bishop to accept such transfer, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Yockleton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Yockleton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Yockleton, now vested in him, the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, in his private capacity, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth:

become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Bishop's Hatfield and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Lemsford, both in the County of Hertford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Bishop's Hatfield and the said New Parish of Lemsford are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Bishop's Hatfield and of the said New Parish of Lemsford which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is, not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by a certain Deed, bearing date on or about the 28th day of July, 1927, and made or expressed to be made, under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856' or some or one of them, between the Reverend Jocelyn James Antrobus, the Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Bishop's Hatfield, of the first part, the Most Honourable James Edward Herbert, Marquess of Salisbury, K.G., the Patron of the said Rectory of the Parish of Bishop's Hatfield, of the second part, the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Bishop's Hatfield, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part, the said Jocelyn James Antrobus did, with the consents of the said James Edward Herbert, Marquess of Salisbury, as such Patron as aforesaid, and the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop as aforesaid, first, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as a Minister shall have been licensed thereto in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act, and to his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish, and to his successors for the time being, certain Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £20 7s. 8d. arising from lands and hereditaments situate in the said Parish of Bishop's Hatfield and belonging to the said Rectory of Bishop's Hatfield, as and for an endowment for the said proposed District, and, secondly, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the sum of £4,366 13s. 4d. London County £3 per cent. Stock standing in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of the endowments of the said Rectory of Bishop's Hatfield, to have and to hold for or towards the further endowment of the Minister or Incumbent of the said intended District, so soon as one shall have been licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and of his successors, Ministers or Incumbents thereof for the time being:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the said Tithe Commutation Rent Charges have been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid and the said sum of £4,366

18s. 4d. London County £3 per cent. Stock has been so assigned as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the said Jocelyn James Antrobus has nominated to us, the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Saint Albans, as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Bishop's Hatfield and of the said New Parish of Lemsford which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Welwyn Garden City.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Michael, Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Welwyn Garden City comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Bishop's Hatfield and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Lemsford, both in the County of Hertford, and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which taken together are bounded upon the north partly by the Parish of Digsweil and partly by the Parish of Welwyn, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south west and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the Great North Road where

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parishes of Leire and Tooting Graveney, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

**LEIRE.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Peter, Leire, and except as hereinafter provided in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) In the undermentioned brick graves now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of the following persons at their decease, viz.:—

(1) Thomas Edward Jarvis, in the grave of his wife.

(2) Mary Stevens, in the grave of her husband.

Subject, in each case, to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Ellen Dale, Thomas Richardson, and Caroline Jane Richardson at their decease, for whom grave spaces have been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject in each case to the same condition as that above mentioned.

**TOOTING GRAVENEY.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Nicholas, Tooting Graveney, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth and, except as hereinafter provided, in the Parish Churchyard as it existed prior to 1857. Provided that—(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented. (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorks.*

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton, Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tosside, Bolton-by-

Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.
