PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Tooting Graveney, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, and to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Leire, in the County of Leicester, 10 days previous Notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 and 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, make Representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Tooting Graveney, in the said Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, and in the Civil Parish of Leire, in the said County of Leicester, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 27th June, 1927, Notice of such Representations was given, and it was ordered that the

same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 8th August, 1927, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parishes of Tooting Graveney and Leire, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that Burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

TOOTING GRAVENEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Nicholas, Tooting Graveney, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth and, except as hereinafter provided, in the Parish Churchyard as it existed prior to 1857. Provided that—(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented. (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin contain-

ing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

LEIRE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Peter, Leire, and except as hereinafter provided in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) In the undermentioned brick graves now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of the following persons at their decease, viz.:—

(1) Thomas Edward Jarvis, in the grave of his wife.

(2) Mary Stevens, in the grave of her husband.

Subject, in each case, to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Ellen Dale, Thomas Richardson, and Caroline Jane Richardson at their decease, for whom grave spaces have been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject in each case to the same condition as that above mentioned.

WHEREAS on 20th August, 1926, the Secretary-General of the League of Nations communicated to His Majesty's Government a certified copy of a draft Convention concerning the simplification of the inspection of emigrants on board ship which had been adopted by the International Labour Conference at Geneva on 5th June, 1926:

And whereas it is provided in Article 405 of the Treaty of Versailles that in the case of a draft Convention so communicated each Member of the International Labour Organisation shall, if such draft Convention obtains the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies, communicate the formal ratification thereof to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations:

And whereas such draft Convention has in respect of Great Britain and Northern Ireland obtained the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies and such action as is necessary to make the provisions of the said draft Convention conditionally effective therein has been taken:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Convention be confirmed and approved, provided, however, that such confirmation and approval shall not take effect until the date by which the Secretary-General of the League of Nations shall have received and registered the formal ratifications without reservations of the said draft Convention by

France, Germany, the Netherlands, Italy, Norway and Spain.

And it is further ordered that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
