RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO FIX GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND TO VARY THE OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS IN THE AREA COMPRISING THE COUNTY OF YORKSHIRE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st of April, 1927, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 6th August, 1924, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in England and Wales HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates and TO VARY the Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers in the Area comprising the County of Yorkshire, the Proposed Minimum Rates being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES (COMMONLY REFERRED TO IN THE TRADE AS LOG RATES) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.

The proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates (commonly referred to in the trade as Log Rates) for the classes of Male Workers specified in Section II of this Part who are employed on piece-work, on the classes of work specified in Section III of this Part are the rates ascertained by applying the Time-Rates per Log Hour set out in Section IV of this Part to the times set out in Parts I and II of the Piece-Work Time Statement for 1923 (commonly known as the London Time Log for 1923) published by the Joint Conciliation Board constituted for the Tailoring Trade and registered under the provisions of the Conciliation Act, 1896.

SECTION II.

PART I—continued.

Classes of Workers :

Any journeyman tailor employed to make any garment or to perform any alteration or repair work specified in the Piece-Work Time Statement referred to in Section I either—

- (i) alone ; or
- (ii) with the assistance of not more than one apprentice (male or female)

notwithstanding that machining as provided in the Piece-Work Time Statement may be supplied by the employer or the journeyman.

SECTION III.

Classes of Work :

(i) the making of Coats (including Overcoats, Jackets, etc.) of any of the classes specified in the Piece-work Time Statement referred to in Section I in which at least three of the following operations are performed :—

- Sleeves put in by hand.
- Collar padded by hand (whether or not the collar stand is machined).
- Collar put on by hand.
- Shoulder seams sewn by hand.
- Pockets tacked by hand.
- Edges stitched by hand.

(ii) the making of Vests of any of the classes specified in the Piece-work Time Statement referred to in Section I (other than under-vests) in which at least two of the following operations are performed :—

- Cuts in foreparts.
- Pockets tacked by hand.
- Forepart linings felled by hand.
- Edges stitched by hand.

(iii) the making of Trousers, Breeches and other Leg Garments (other than Gaiters and Leggings) of any of the classes specified in the Piece-Work Time Statement referred to in Section I in which at least two of the following operations are performed :—

- Cuts in waist.
- Seat seams sewn by hand.
- Fly put in by hand.
- Part leg seams sewn by hand.
- Pockets put in by hand.

(iv) the making of any of the other garments (including Under-vests, Gaiters and Leggings) specified in the Piece-Work Time Statement referred to in Section I.

(v) any alteration or repair work performed on any of the garments covered by sub-sections (i) to (iv).

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

The Overtime Rates in the case of Male Workers employed on Piece-Work in respect of whom General Minimum Piece-Rates (Log Rates) are applicable, shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates with the addition of an amount equal to one-quarter, one-half, or the whole of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Paragraph 27 of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (Y) 2, dated 9th July, 1927, if the worker had been employed on time-work, were time-and-a-quarter, time-and-a-half, or double-time respectively.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal which may be lodged with them within two months from the 20th day of September, 1927. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE AREA COMPRISING THE COUNTIES OF ANGLESEY, CARNARVONSHIRE, DENBIGHSHIRE, FLINTSHIRE, MERIONETHSHIRE AND MONTGOMERYSHIRE.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female workers as set out in the Notices R.B. (22) and R.B. (23) issued by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) and dated 28th February, 1923, in their application to workers employed in the above-mentioned Area, AND TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates (Log Rates) for certain classes of Male workers in such Area.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 :—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

The parishes of Tatham, Wray-with-Botton, Roeburndale, Over Wyresdale, Bleasdale and Little Bowland; such parts of the parishes of Hornby-with-Farleton, Claughton (Lancaster

So much of the parishes of Bowland Forest Higher Division, Bowland Forest Lower Division, Easington, Slaidburn, Newton, Bentham, Clapham-cum-Newby, Austwick, Lawkland, Giggleswick, Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Gisburn Forest, Tosside, Bolton-by-Bowland, Sawley, Grindleton, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Eaves and Great Mitton as lies within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Lancaster to Long Preston crosses the county boundary near High Bentham, thence south-easterly along that railway to the point where it intersects the road from Settle to Rathmell, thence in a southerly direction along that road via Rathmell, Wigglesworth, Becks Brow Bottom, Pikeber, Mere Sike, Flass Gate, Forest Becks, Holden, Bolton Peel, and Bow Lathe to Sawley; thence continuing in a south westerly direction along the road from Sawley via Foxley Bank, Grindleton, Lane Side, Lower West Clough, West Bradford, Waddington, Bashall Bridge, Backridge, and Bashall to the River Hodder; thence following the county boundary in a generally northerly direction to the point of commencement.

An Area comprising :—

So much of the county of Westmorland as is comprised within the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at a point in the parish of Shap Urban where the railway runs underneath the road from Hackthorpe to Shap, thence northerly along the said railway to a point where it meets the stonewall from the Sweetholme Buildings, thence in the direction of the
