His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Lewis Miller, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 7th September, 1927, the steamship "Endymion" was being unloaded in the City Docks, Bristol, and was lying about two or three feet away from the quay side. The cargo was being discharged by means of a

crane which lifted the sacks from the ship to a platform about 20 feet above the quay level. A man named Johns who was assisting to pull the sacks inwards from the crane to the platform was struck by a sack and fell from the platform to the quay wall and then rolled into the water between the quay side and the ship. On observing Johns fall into the water Miller immediately jumped in and held him up by means of the chains at the water level until a rope was lowered. Miller then fastened Johns to the rope and first Johns and then Miller were pulled out of the water. There is no doubt that Miller was fully aware of the risk of being crushed between the wall and the ship, and of the difficulty and danger of rescuing Johns in the confined space. The Coroner, when holding an inquest on Johns, who subsequently died as a result of his injuries, expressed very high admiration of Miller's conduct and the jury also highly commended his action. This is the sixteenth occasion on which Miller has rescued persons from the water.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.

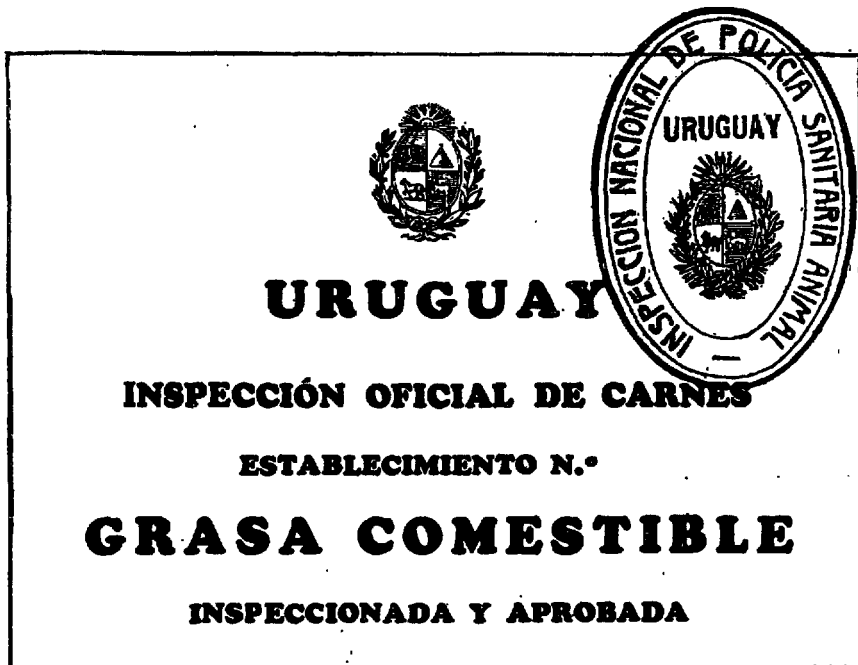
The Minister of Health gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises for the purposes of item (b) of the Second Schedule to the Regulations, i.e., lard, dripping, edible tallow and similar rendered fats, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter, and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

SCHEDULE.

URUGUAYAN REPUBLIC.

A label having on it a design and certificate in the form shown below, the large oval device being printed, or impressed by means of a rubber stamp, in blue, and figures being inserted in the blank space indicating the number of the establishment at which the meat was prepared.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875.

THE MEXBOROUGH URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL
ACT, 1914.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Mexborough (hereinafter called the Council), have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Mex-

borough Urban District Council Act, 1914, so as:—

(1) To authorise the Council to acquire by agreement for the purposes of their water undertaking.

(a) The farm known as Barnborough Grange situate in the Parishes of Barnborough and High Melton and containing an area of 246 acres, 2 roods, 9 perches or thereabouts.

(b) Certain pieces or parcels of land situate in the said Parish of Barnborough forming part of the enclosures numbered 255, 249 and 247 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map Yorkshire (West Riding) Sheet CCLXXXLV N.W. Second Edition of 1903 and containing in the whole 5.056 acres or thereabouts together with two cottages erected thereon known as the Ludwell Cottages.

(c) The two springs known as "Ludwell Spring" and "Thorntree Spring" together with the rams, engine pumps and sheds and pipes connecting the sheds with the said springs, and the right to take impound use and enjoy all the water flowing and percolating to and issuing and coming from the said springs or either of them and of laying mains or pipes for carrying or conducting water from the said springs and underneath the lands aforesaid to the waterworks of the Council;

(2) To authorise the Council to construct such additional works on the said lands as may be necessary for the utilisation of the said springs;

(3) To provide that section 26 (Limiting powers of Council to abstract water) of the said Local Act shall not apply to the abstraction of water from the lands on which the said springs are situate;

(4) To enable the Council to exercise within the Parish of Barnborough the powers of a local authority under section 54 of the Public Health Act, 1875, for the carrying of water mains through, across or under any road, street, etc., and through or under any lands within or without their limits of supply;

(5) To authorise the Council to acquire by agreement additional lands in the Parishes of Barnborough and High Melton as may be required in connection with the utilisation of the water from the said springs or for the protection of such water;

(6) To enable the Council to retain hold and use or to sell, lease, exchange or otherwise dispose of any of the lands hereinbefore referred to;

(7) To prescribe a new scale of maximum rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes in lieu of that in section 29 of the said local Act, such scale to be as follows:—

Where the rateable value of the premises so supplied with water does not exceed twenty pounds the rate of twelve pounds per centum upon such rateable value:

Where the rateable value exceeds twenty pounds but does not exceed forty pounds the rate of ten pounds per centum upon such rateable value:

Where the rateable value exceeds forty pounds the rate of nine pounds per centum upon such rateable value.

(8) To enable the Minister of Health on the application of the Council or of 20 consumers from time to time to vary by Order the rates and charges prescribed as aforesaid;

(9) To increase the maximum price for the supply of water by measure to one shilling and ninepence per thousand gallons and the minimum quarterly charge to twenty shillings;

(10) To alter or amend section 34 of the said Local Act so as to provide that the Council shall not be bound to supply otherwise than by measure, in addition to houses partly used for trade, any workhouse, public institution, hospital, asylum, sanatorium, club, hotel, public-house, or inn, or any boarding house capable of accommodating twenty or more persons in all or any school not maintained by the local education authority;

(11) To provide that the minimum quarterly charge for a supply of water by measure to any of the premises mentioned in paragraph (10) above shall be one-fourth of the annual amount which would be payable according to the scale for the time being in force for a domestic supply to a dwelling-house of the same rateable value;

(12) To enable the Council to make an allowance by way of discount on the amount due in respect of rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes to every person who pays the same within such time as the Council prescribe;

(13) To confer power to open ground on persons liable to maintain pipes and apparatus;

(d) Cottage, including any garden provided with the cottage except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

(a) Milk, the current wholesale price prevailing in the area of the Committee.

(b) Potatoes, the current wholesale price prevailing in the area of the Committee.

(i) In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on an application by or on behalf of a worker, have certified that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation or lack of water supply, the value of such cottage is less than 2s. the value shall be such sum less than 2s. as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the defects.

(ii) In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on an application by or on behalf of an employer, have certified that by reason of the accommodation and condition of the cottage the value of such cottage is higher than 2s., the value of such cottage shall be such sum greater than 2s. as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the accommodation.

3. In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby order that except as in this Order provided no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash.

4. This Order shall come into operation on 1st November, 1927, and continue in force until further notice.

AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 45).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further contraction of Somerset Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 39) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 44), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the second day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Release of Somerset Area from Restrictions.

2. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.
