**A PROCLAMATION**

**FOR APPOINTING TUESDAY, DECEMBER 27, 1927, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES AND IN NORTHERN IRELAND.**

**GEORGE R.I.**

**W**E, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the Twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of the provisions of The Bank Holidays Act, 1871, and The Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, Do hereby, by and with the

advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the Twenty-seventh day of December next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this third day of *November*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the Eighteenth year of Our Reign.

**DETERMINING NEW DESIGNS FOR CERTAIN SILVER COINS OF THE REALM.**

**GEORGE R.I.**

**W**HEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to determine the design for any coin :
