The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

#### LEAD PAINT (PROTECTION AGAINST POISONING) ACT, 1926.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

(c) All employment on a Saturday or such other day (not being a Sunday) as may be agreed between the employer and the worker after 12 noon, other than the hours (being part of the 12 hours above mentioned) spent in attendance on cattle or horses.

(3) In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment in any week (excluding Sunday) in excess of 44 hours.

(b) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday.

(c) All employment on Sunday.

# AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the cities and county boroughs of Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, Wakefield and York, and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Dewsbury, Doncaster, Halifax, Huddersfield and Rotherham, have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 24th day of November, 1927.

(a) In the case of male workers employed in agriculture as defined in Clauses 1 and 2 above:—

(i) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 48 hours in winter and 52½ hours in summer, and also in excess of the additional 12 hours on weekdays and 3 hours on Sundays for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

(ii) All employment except one hour for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock after 12 noon on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(iii) All employment on Sundays in excess of 3 hours for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

(b) In the case of all other male workers engaged by the week or longer period:—

(i) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 48 hours in winter and 52½ hours in summer.

(ii) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being

Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(iii) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment in excess of 44 hours per week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(ii) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(iii) All employment on a Sunday.
