

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1927.

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made Orders declaring the following places to be infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease :—

Date.	Subject.
1927.	
7th December ...	The field known as Pigsty Field and the farm buildings and yards adjoining, in the occupation of R. W. Tilley, and situate on the south side of Bradford Road, in the parish of Corsham, in the administrative county of Wiltshire.
8th December ...	The farm buildings and the pasture fields known as The Patch, Home-field, Ridgeleaze, The Mead, and Little Mead, at Whitley Farm, in the occupation of Henry Arthur Chard, in the parish of Melksham Without, in the administrative county of Wiltshire.
13th December ...	The buildings and all the grass land known as Nonsuch Farm, Quinton, in the occupation of the Birmingham City Corporation, and situate in the city and county borough of Birmingham.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH DECEMBER, 1927.)

FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 59).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows :—

Contraction of certain Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 56) (hereinafter referred to as Order No. 56) as amended by Order No. 4516 dated 8th December, 1927, shall be read and have effect as if

(a) The Areas numbered 2 and 3 described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Areas numbered 2 and 3 respectively described in the First Schedule to Order No. 56;

(b) The Areas numbered 4 (a) and 4 (b) described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Area numbered 4 described in the First Schedule to Order No. 56;

(c) Paragraph (a) of Article 2 of Order No. 56 relating to the movement of animals into the city of Salisbury, were deleted.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Release of New Forest, Salisbury and Shrewton (Wilts.) Areas from Restrictions.

2. The Area numbered 1 described in the First Schedule to Order No. 56 and the Areas

numbered 3 and 4 (b) described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the twenty-seventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Release of Southampton Area from Restrictions.

3. The Area numbered 2 described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as from the thirtieth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1927 (No. 59).

SCHEDULE.

Infected Areas.

2. An Area comprising :—

In the county of Southampton.

The county borough of Southampton; and so much of the parish of Millbrook as lies to the east of the River Test.

3. An Area comprising :—

In the county of Wiltshire.

The parish of Clarendon Park; so much of the parishes of Laverstock and Ford, Winterbourne Earls and Winterbourne Dauntsey as lies to the south of the road from Idmiston to
