## PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at 'he Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of December, 1927 (N.P. (2) 2741/27), in the words following, viz.:—

Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein,

shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the conditions prescribed by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 13th day of February, 1912, in regard to the payment of extra pay to the bakery staffs of Your Majesty's Ships fitted with bakeries, when employed in making bread for issue to other of Your Majesty's Ships not so fitted, require revision:
