WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of December, 1927 (C.W. 11646/27), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, it is provided, inter alia, that certain allowances shall be paid to Officers of the Royal Navy, for service in submarines:

"And whereas we consider that provision should be made for the payment of an allowance to qualified Fleet Air Arm Pilots and Naval Observer Officers who are appointed to submarines carrying aircraft:

submarines carrying aircraft:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that
Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by
Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect

from the 27th day of June, 1927, the payment of an allowance of 2s. a day to all qualified Fleet Air Arm Officers and Naval Observer Officers, who have been, or may hereafter be, appointed to submarines carrying aircraft, such allowance to be administered in the manner laid down for Submarine Allowance, except that payment shall be discontinued during any period in which the Officer in receipt of the allowance shall be absent from duty owing to sickness.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Ernest, Lord Bishop of Worcester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following

"We, Ernest, Lord Bishop of Worcester, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, de hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:-

"There is in the County and Diocese of Worcester the Vicarage or Benefice of Broom the Parish whereof contains a population of three hundred and ten or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Broom is Three hundred pounds or there-

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Clent the Parish whereof contains a population of one thousand two hundred and seventy four or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Clent is Three hundred and eighty pounds

or thereabouts.
"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Churchill with Blakedown the Parish whereof contains a population of seven hundred and sixty six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Church at Churchill for one hundred and fifty persons and in that of Blakedown for one hundred and twenty persons.
"The net annual value of the said Benefice

of Churchill with Blakedown is Three hundred and eighty five pounds or thereabouts.

That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the several portions of the Parishes of Clent and Churchill with Blakedown may vantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the Parish of Broom to which they are all contiguous. The boundaries of such several portions are more particularly described in the hereinafter mentioned Scheme appended to this Representation and are thereon respectively verged green and blue on the plan

annexed to such Scheme the existing boundaries of the Parish of Broom being shown by

a red verged line.

"The Reverend Joseph Handforth Bourne is the Patron of the said Benefice of Broom and the Reverend Arthur Sydney Ponsonby McGhee, D.S.O., is the present Incumbent

'The Right Honourable George, Viscount Cave, Lord Chancellor of Great Britain, is the Patron of the Benefice of Clent and the Reverend Penson Charles Thomas is the

present Incumbent thereof.

The Right Honourable John Cavendish, Viscount Cobham, is the Patron of the Bene-fice of Churchill with Blakedown and the Reverend Alfred Reginald Goodwin is the

present Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Broom, Clent, and Churchill with Blakedown and also the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices (with the exception of the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Clent) to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Clent and annex to the Parish of Broom all that portion of the Parish of Clent which is bounded by the road leading East North East from Broom Church past Field House along the said road past the Lodge of Field House to the point where the footpath leaves the said road North North East to the back of the Smithy and North North West behind certain houses till it joins the road from Lower Clent thence running West for about five hundred vards to where the footpath to Stocking Hill joins the road thence along the hedge North North West to Gallows Brook which it follows to the angle where the main roads meet. Thence it turns South West along the middle of the road till just beyond Spout Farm from which it turns West North West past Sweet Pool under the Great Western Railway to Brake Mill and then South along the road to the point where four roads meet and straight on for a short distance till it again joins the Parish Boundary of Broom the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and thereon verged green.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Churchill with Blakedown and annex to the Parish of Broom all that portion of Churchill with Blakedown commencing at the

South West corner of the Parish of Broom where it touches the Blakedown Road thence following the Parish Boundary of Churchill straight on South across the stream and to the road running South East along the top of Barnet Hill and through the centre of this latter road to its junction with the Droitwich and Stourbridge road then due North along the centre of the said road to Hackman's Gate where it joins the Parish of Broom the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and verged blue.

"And lastly it is proposed to separate also from the Parish of Churchill with Blakedown and annex to the Parish of Broom all that portion of Churchill with Blakedown commencing at the point where the road from Broom joins the Kidderminster and Halesowen Road thence running South West along the middle of the latter road to a point just past Harborough Farm and thence along the path from such point leading South South East and then South South West to Broom Mill where it joins the boundary of the Parish of Broom the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and likewise

verged blue.
"The existing boundaries of the Parish of Broom are delineated on the said plan hereto

annexed and thereon verged red.

That the Incumbent of Broom shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within those portions of the Parishes of Clent and Churchill with Blakedown so to be respectively separated

therefrom and annexed to Broom.

"That the inhabitants of such portions so to be separated shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Broom but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Churches of Clent and Churchill with Blakedown respectively except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Churches and who may not be

willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Broom as they might have had in the Parish Churches of Clent and Churchill with Blake-

down respectively.
"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding tithes if any) arising from the said portions so to be separated from the Parishes of Clent and Churchill with Blakedown shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Broom.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or any of

them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or any of

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1.
