RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

VARIATION OF MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND FIXING OF GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES.

The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) have issued Notices, dated 10th January, 1928, setting out General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers as varied by the Trade Board, together with the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates which remain

unaffected by the variation, as respects North and South Wales (including the County of Monmouthshire), the Urban District of Oakham and the Rural Districts of Oakham and Uppingham in the County of Rutlandshire, together with General Minimum Piece-Rates for certain classes of Male Workers fixed by the Trade Board as respects the above mentioned Areas and also as respects the County of Yorkshire, the variation in Minimum Rates and the General Minimum Piece-Rates fixed having been confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour, to take effect as from 10th January, 1928.

GAS.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED JANUARY 4, 1928, UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5. C. 28), PRESCRIBING THE RATE OF CONTRIBUTION TO THE GAS FUND FOR THE YEAR 1928.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 7 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that:—

1. The rate of contribution to the Gas Fund for the year 1928 shall be one shilling for each million cubic feet of gas sold during the year 1927.

2. Such contribution shall, on or before the 1st April, 1928, be paid to the Board of Trade at Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, by any Gas Undertakers with respect to whom an order under the said Act shall have been made, by cheque made payable to the "Board of Trade" and crossed "Gas Fund Account."

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease
Infected Areas.*

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925. The Midlands and North of England (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) (Controlled Area) Order of 1927 shall be read and have effect as if in Article 1 thereof the words "the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 6)" were substituted for the words "the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1927 (No. 71)."

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 6).

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising:—

In the administrative county of Derby.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly

direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.

Notices of Dissolution of Partnership will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative character of the signatory must be verified by Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
