JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for male and female workers set out in the Notice J. (43) issued by the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain) and dated 21st January, 1927, and that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates for certain classes of female workers employed in the Municipal Burghs of Kirkcaldy and Dysart.

Particulars of the Minimum Rates proposed are available for inspection at the address shown below or may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 31st day of January, 1928. (2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 7) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 8) shall be read and have effect as if the Area (numbered 7) described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Areas (numbered 6 and 7) described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 17).
