FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 16).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the Foot-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 16) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

SCHEDULE.

Infected Area.

An Area comprising :--

The county of London (including the City of London but excluding the parishes of Plum-stead, Woolwich, Charlton and Kidbrooke, Greenwich, Poplar Borough, St. John at Hackney, and Stoke Newington).

In the county of Surrey.

The county borough of Croydon; The boroughs of Kingston-upon-Thames, Reigate, Richmond, and Wimbledon;

The petty sessional divisions of Mortlake, Wimbledon, Sutton, Croydon, Kingston and Epsom; so much of the petty sessional division of Godstone as lies to the north of the railway from Redhill to Tonbridge; and the parishes of Weybridge, Mickleham, Buckland, Kingswood, Gatton, Chipstead, Merstham and Chaldon; so much of the parishes of Betchworth, Dorking and Dorking Rural as lie to the north of the railway from Redhill to Guildford; and so much of the parish of Nutfield as lies to the north of the railway from Tonbridge to Redhill.

In the county of Middlesex.

The boroughs of Acton, Ealing, and Twickenham :

The petty sessional divisions of Willesden, Brentford and Spelthorne; and the parishes of Harmondsworth, Harlington, Cranford, Hayes and Northolt.

In the county of Kent.

The borough of Bromley;

The petty sessional divisions of Bromley and Penge;

The parishes of Bexley, Lullingstone, Halstead, and Dunton Green; so much of the parishes of Eynsford and Shoreham as lie to the west of the railway from Sevenoaks to Swanley Junction; and so much of the parishes of Westerham, Brasted, Sundridge and Chevening as lie to the north of the main road from Redhill to Maidstone.

FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN-1928FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF (No. 17).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows :-

Extension of Derbyshire, ctc., Infected Area.

1.-(1) Article 1 (1) of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 14) is hereby revoked.

(2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 7) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 8) shall be read and have effect as if the Area (numbered 7) described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Areas (numbered 6 and 7) described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) Order of 1928 (No. 17).
