ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH FEBRUARY, 1928.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The Order of the Minister (No. 4564) dated 25th January, 1928, relating to the landing at the port of London of four Duroc Jersey pigs imported from Canada, shall be read and have effect as if for the date 15th February, 1928, specified in the First Schedule to that Order there were substituted the date 15th March, 1928.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 24).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Further Extension of Lindsey (Grimsby) Infected Area.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 7) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1928 (Nos. 9 and 12) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were included in and formed part of the Infected Area (numbered 12) described in the Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 9).

(2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 20) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were included in and formed part of the Infected Area (numbered 6) described in the Schedule to that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 24).
