Chancellor of the Exchequer,

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to Saskatchewan.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the

registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of October, 1860, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, a separate District was annexed to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary at Crumpsall, situate within the original limits of the Parish of Manchester, in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint Mary, Crumpsall ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 28th day of July, 1864, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of All Saints, situate at Rhodes, in the Parish of Middleton, in the said County of Lancaster, and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Rhodes ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of June, 1866, and published in the London Gazette on the 29th

day of the same month a separate District was annexed to the consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, situate at Blackley, within the original limits of the said Parish of Manchester, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint Andrew, Blackley ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of May, 1885, and published in the London Gazette on the 22nd day of the same month a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, situate in the Parish of Prestwich, in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich ’ :

“ And whereas the said District of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Rhodes, the said District of Saint Andrew, Blackley, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94 :

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, the said New Parish of Rhodes, the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, and the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, of the said New Parish of Rhodes, of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, of the said Parish of Prestwich, of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dis severed from such New Parishes, Parish and Consolidated Chapelry respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley ; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, which

is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Rhodes; (thirdly) all that portion of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such Consolidated Chapelry and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall; and (fourthly) all that portion of the said Parish of Prestwich which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The First Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, being:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, of an isolated portion of the Parish of Prestwich, of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, and of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, all in the said County and Diocese, which, taken together, are bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the west, upon the north west and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, crosses the middle of Blackley New Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Blackley New Road for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Middleton Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Middleton Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, the boundary which divides such Consolidated Chapelry from the said isolated portion of the Parish of Prestwich, and the boundary which divides such isolated portion of the Parish of Prestwich from the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prest-

wich), for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading to the Heaton Mills, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to a point on the eastern side of the River Irk upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Rhodes, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, which is bounded upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley, upon the north east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Rhodes, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the south west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Rhodes from the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, at the junction of Manchester Old Road, Heywood Road and Middleton Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Middleton Road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading to the Heaton Mills, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to a point on the eastern side of the River Irk upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Margaret, Holyrood, Prestwich, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Blackley.

" The Third Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, being:—

" All that portion of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, which is bounded upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall, upon the south west by the District of Saint Gabriel, Prestwich, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Gabriel, Prestwich, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, at the centre of the bridge which carries Sheepfoot Lane across the Manchester, Whitefield and Radcliffe Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Sheepfoot Lane for a distance of 31½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Middleton Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Middleton Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Prestwich, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Crumpsall.

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the said Arthur Gerard Miller is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lyminge with Paddlesworth should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Lyminge with Paddlesworth which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Lyminge with the Chapelry of Paddlesworth annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Gerard Miller, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106, and with the concurrence of the said Robert Dobson Eves and Taverner Brice Miller (in testimony of which consent and concurrence they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lyminge with Paddlesworth shall be transferred to the said Randall Thomas,

Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES.

THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION) No. 1 ORDER, 1928, DATED 6TH FEBRUARY, 1928, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 16 & 17 GEORGE V. CAP. 22).

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 and 17 George V. cap. 22), that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 and 12 George V. cap. 47) as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of the article for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities.

And whereas, by the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 1 Order, 1927 (S.R. & O. 1927, No. 195) the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 2 Order, 1927 (S.R. & O. 1927, No. 570) the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 3 Order, 1927 (S.R. & O. 1927, No. 761) the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 4 Order, 1927 (S.R. & O. 1927, No. 902) made by the Treasury the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order were exempted from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, as to the articles mentioned in the first of the said Orders for a period of twelve months from the 7th day of March, 1927, and as to the articles mentioned in the three remaining Orders for a period ending on the 6th March, 1928.

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations by consumers of the articles specified in the Schedule to and in Article 3 of this Order that these articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of these articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that these articles will within a

reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities.

Now therefore we, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 1 Order, 1928.

2. The articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be exempt from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, from the expiration of the periods prescribed by the four above mentioned Orders until the 31st day of December, 1928, inclusive.

3. Crude cocaine (other than that entered under the Customs Acts on or before the 11th day of February, 1928) shall also be exempt from the said duty until the 31st day of December, 1928, inclusive.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENTS IN THE FOREIGN OFFICE AND DIPLOMATIC SERVICE.

1. Candidates will be required to appear before a Board of Selection which will meet at the Office of the Civil Service Commission on the first Tuesday in May, and will decide which Candidates possess suitable qualifications for entry into the Foreign Office or Diplomatic Service in order to enable them to compete at the examination prescribed below. Candidates may appear before this Board of Selection at any time after they have attained the age of nineteen; but a Candidate who is not recommended for acceptance by the Board of Selection may not appear before that Board for interview a second time unless he is specifically notified after his first appearance that the Board will be prepared to see him again.

2. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 25 on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held. In reckoning age for competition, Candidates who have served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from their actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.

3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, provided they fulfil the conditions of the rule in respect of nationality prescribed for Candidates for admission to His Majesty's Civil Service as a whole, viz. :—

"No person will be eligible for appointment to the Civil Service who is not a natural-born British subject and the son of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of Candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH FEBRUARY, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (BOILING OF ANIMAL FOODSTUFFS) ORDER OF 1928.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Precautions to be adopted in regard to certain Animal Foodstuffs.

1.—(1) Subject as herein provided, every person having in his possession or under his charge—

(a) any meat, bones, offal, or other part of the carcase of an animal; or

(b) any swill; or

(c) any other broken or waste foodstuffs which have been in contact with meat, bones, offal, or other part of the carcase of an animal

shall cause any such articles to be boiled before they are brought into contact with, or fed to, animals.

(2) No person shall permit any animal to be brought into contact with any article mentioned in sub-section (1) hereof, unless and until the article has been boiled.

Exemption of Proprietary Foodstuffs.

2.—(1) This Order shall not apply to any proprietary foodstuff in respect of which the manufacturer thereof holds an effective certificate of exemption from the provisions of this Order granted by the Minister.

(2) A certificate of exemption shall not be granted by the Minister in respect of any proprietary foodstuffs unless he is satisfied that the process of manufacture or preparation of it includes the boiling of it.

(3) The Minister may revoke at any time any certificate of exemption granted by him, and such certificate shall thereupon cease to be effective.

Offences.

3. Any person committing or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order:—

“ animals ” means cattle, sheep, pigs or goats;

“ boiled ” means exposed for a period of at least one hour by any process to a temperature of not less than 212° F., and the expression “ boiling ” shall be construed accordingly;

“ swill ” means any broken or waste foodstuffs including table or kitchen refuse, scraps or waste, containing any meat, bones, offal or portions thereof, or any other part of the carcase of an animal.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Revocation.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 20) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1928 (Nos. 21, 22 and 25) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Infected Area described in the Second Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 22).

(2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 20) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas (numbered 1, 7 and 8) described in the Second Schedule to this Order were respectively substituted for the Infected Areas (numbered 1, 7 and 8) described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This part of this Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

(b) In the case of all other male workers (except casual workers):—

(1) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 52½ hours in summer and 48 hours in winter.

(2) All employment on Sundays, Christmas Day and after 12 noon on one day (other than Sunday) in each week.

(c) In the case of all female workers:—

(1) All employment in any week in excess of 52½ hours in summer and 48 hours in winter.

(2) All employment on Sundays, Christmas Day and after 12 noon on one day (other than Sunday) in each week.
