

Edmundsbury and Ipswich, which lie contiguous to one another and are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint John, Ipswich, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Rose Hill, Ipswich, at the junction of Foxhall Road with Dover Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Dover Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Exeter Road, and extending thence southward in precisely the same direction as the middle of Dover Road and in a straight line for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Felixstowe Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 275 and 289, Felixstowe Road, and extending thence south westward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the northern side of Felixstowe Road, and extending thence first south westward to and then north westward along the middle of Felixstowe Road for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with King Edward Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of King Edward Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hamilton Road, and extending thence first westward to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the Race Course Recreation Ground and then southward along such wall or fence and along the wall or fence in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 26 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the north eastern side of Nacton Road, and extending thence first south westward to and then south eastward along the middle of Nacton Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Rose Hill, Ipswich, and crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, from the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Alnesbourn Priory) for a distance of 1 mile and 22 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundary which divides the last mentioned Extra Parochial Place from the Parish of Nacton, in the said County and Diocese, crosses the middle of Nacton Road, and extending thence first north eastward, then south eastward and then again north eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby crossing the said Felixstowe Branch line of railway and the Felixstowe Road) for a distance of $51\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point near the northern side of the said Felixstowe Road where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Nacton from the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Purdis Farm, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of $64\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the Parish

of Brightwell with Foxhall, in the said County and Diocese, from the last mentioned Extra Parochial Place, and extending thence first north eastward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in one part the middle of the road leading from Bucklesham to Ipswich and in another part the middle of Woodhouse Lane) for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Woodhouse Lane with the road leading from Purdis Farm to Brightwell where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brightwell with Foxhall from the said Parish of Kesgrave, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the last mentioned road) for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the junction of such road with Bell Lane, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Bell Lane for a distance of 61 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Foxhall Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned road (thereby following in one part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Kesgrave from the said Parish of Rushmere Saint Andrew, in another part the boundary which divides a detached portion of the Parish of Saint Helen, Ipswich, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Rushmere Saint Andrew and in another part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Ipswich, from the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Rose Hill, Ipswich) for a distance of 1 mile and 76 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Foxhall Road with Dover Road upon the last mentioned boundary, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representa-
