PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Borough of Derby is divided into sixteen wards and the number of Councillors of the said Borough is forty-eight:

And whereas in pursuance of the Derby Corporation Act, 1927, the boundary of the said Borough will on the 1st day of April, 1928, be altered so as to include certain areas situate in the Administrative County of Derby:

And whereas by Section 9 of the said Act it is provided as follows:—

1. This section shall come into operation on the date of the passing of this Act but any scheme or Order in Council made in pursuance of the provisions hereinafter mentioned as applied by this section shall not take effect until the appointed day except for the purposes of an election of councillors after that day.

2. On the date of the passing of this Act the provisions of section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act 1893 shall have effect as if—

(a) A petition had been presented by the council of the borough praying for an alteration of the boundaries of the wards thereof; and (b) The provisions of this Act altering the boundaries of the borough had come into operation:

And whereas on the 28th day of October, 1927, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards of the Borough of Derby:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 4th day of February, 1928:—

'Scheme for Determining the Boundaries of the Wards of the County Borough of Derby and Apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Section 9 of the Derby Corporation Act 1927.

"I. BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

"In the following descriptions:

'The Borough Boundary' means the boundary of the Borough of Dorby as extended by the Derby Corporation Act, 1927.

" Derwent Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Derwent beneath St. Mary's Bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said river to the Borough boundary, thence in a northerly,

easterly, southerly, easterly, south-easterly, south-westerly, north-westerly, southerly and south-easterly direction following the Borough boundary to its junction with the said River Derwent, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said river to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Bridge Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Kedleston Road on the Borough boundary thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Kedleston Road to its junction with Cowley Street, thence in a southwesterly direction along the centre of Cowley Street to its junction with Leyland Street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Leyland Street to its junction with Whitecross Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Whitecross Street to its junction with Parker Street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Parker Street to its junction with Bridge Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Bridge Street to its junction with Lodge Lane, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Lodge Lane to its junction with King Street, thence in a southeasterly and easterly direction along the centre of King Street to its junction with Queen Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queen Street to its junction with Full Street, thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the centre of Full Street to its junction with Silk Mill Lane, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Silk Mill Lane to a point in the centre of the Bridge over the Mill Fleam discharging into the River Derwent, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the said Mill Fleam to a point in the centre of the River Derwent opposite the centre of the said Mill Fleam at its junction with the said river, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of Derwent Ward hereinbefore described to the Borough boundary, thence in a north-westerly and westerly direction along the Borough boundary to the point of commencement afore-

" King's Mead Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Queen Street at its junction with Full Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queen Street to its junction with St. Mary's Gate, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of St. Mary's Gate to its junction with Bold Lane, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Bold Lane to its junction with Cheapside, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Cheapside to its junction with Friar Gate, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Friar Gate and Ashbourne Road to the Borough boundary, thence in a northerly, easterly and northerly direction following the Borough boundary to the intersection of Kedleston Road, thence in a south-easterly direction following the south-western boundary of Bridge Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Friar Gate Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Friar Gate immediately under the centre of the London & North Eastern Railway Track from Derby to Nottingham, thence

in a north-westerly direction following the south-western boundary of King's Mead Ward hereinbefore described to the intersection of the Borough boundary, thence in a southerly direction following the Borough boundary to the intersection of the London & North Eastern Railway track from Burton to Derby, thence along the centre of the said Railway track in an easterly and north-easterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Rowditch Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of the London & North Eastern Railway from Burton to Derby on the Borough boundary, thence in a southerly, easterly and south-easterly direction following the Borough boundary to the intersection of Constable Lane, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Constable Lane and St. Albans Road to the junction of St. Albans Road with Bedford Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Bedford Street to its junction with Westbury Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Westbury Street to its junction with Dean Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Dean Street and Amy Street to the junction of Amy Street with Parliament Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Parliament Street to its junction with Bakewell Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Bakewell Street to its junction with King Alfred Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of King Alfred Street to its junction with Monk Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Monk Street, Dunkirk and Kensington Street to the junction of Kensington Street with Curzon Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Curzon Street to its junction with Stafford Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Stafford Street to its junction with Friar Gate, thence westwards following the southern boundary of King's Mead Ward herinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of Friar Gate Ward, and thence in a south-westerly and westerly direction following the southern boundary of Friar Gate Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Becket Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Friar Gate at its junction with Stafford Street on the boundary of King's Mead Ward, thence in an easterly, northeasterly, north-westerly, easterly and northerly direction following the south-east boundary of King's Mead Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of Bridge Ward, thence in an easterly and southerly direction following the southern hereinbefore of Bridge Ward boundary described to its junction with the western boundary of Derwent Ward, thence in a south-easterly direction following the south-western boundary of Derwent Ward hereinbefore described to a point in the centre of the River Derwent immediately under the centre of the Cattle Market Bridge, thence in a generally south-westerly direction along the centre of the Cattle Market thoroughfare, Mill Fleam, Morledge and East Street to the junction of

East Street with St. Peter's Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of St. Peter's Street and Osmaston Road to the junction of Osmaston Road with Sacheverel Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Sacheverel Street to its junction with Normanton Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Normanton Road to its junction with Burton Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Burton Road to its junction with Abbey Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Abbey Street to its junction with Alma Street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Alma Street to its junction with the boundary of Rowditch Ward, thence along the eastern boundary of Rowditch Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

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" Abbey Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Burton Road at its junction with Abbey Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Burton Road to the intersection of the Borough boundary, thence in a north-westerly direction following the Borough boundary to its junction with the southern boundary of Rowditch Ward, thence in an easterly direction following the southern boundary of Rowditch Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the Western boundary of Becket Ward and thence in an easterly and southerly direction following the western boundary of Becket Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Castle Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Osmaston Road at its junction with Sacheverel Street, thence in a northerly and easterly direction following the south-eastern boundary of Becket Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the southern boundary of Derwent Ward, thence in an easterly direction following the southern boundary of Derwent Ward to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence in an easterly direction following the Borough boundary to the point where the boundary of the Borough of Derby as it existed previously to the passing of the Derby Corporation Act, 1901, meets the Borough boundary, thence in a southerly direction following the boundary of the Borough as it existed previously to the passing of the Derby Corporation Act, 1901, defined and described as the Parliamentary Borough Boundary on the Ordnance Sheets, Edition of 1919, scale six inches to one statute mile, to its junction with London Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of London Road to its junction with Litchurch Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Litchurch Street to its junction with Osmaston Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Osmaston Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Babington Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Osmaston Road at its junction with Sacheverel Street, thence in a south-westerly direction following the southern boundaries of

Becket Ward and Abbey Ward hereinbefore described to the junction with Stone Hill Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Stone Hill Road to the inter-section of St. Chad's Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of St. Chad's Road to its junction with Byron Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Byron Street to its junction with Howard Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Howard Street to its junction with Northumberland Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Northumberland Street to its junction with Lower Dale Road, thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction along the centre of Lower Dale Road and Normanton Road to its junction with Harriet Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Harriet Street to the boundary of the Arboretum, thence in a northerly, north-easterly, and south-easterly direction following the boundary of the Arboretum to its junction with Morleston Street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Morleston Street to its junction with Osmaston Road, and thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Osmaston Road being the south-western boundary of Castle Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Dale Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Burton Road at its junction with Stone Hill Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Burton Road being the southern boundary of Abbey Ward to the intersection of the Borough boundary, thence in a south-easterly direction following the Borough boundary to the intersection of the foot-path from Warwick Avenue to Normanton Lane, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said footpath to the intersection of Warwick Avenue, thence in a south-easterly and easterly direction along the centre of Warwick Avenue and Stenson Road to the junction of Stenson Road with Upper Dale Road, thence in a north-easterly and northerly direction along the centre of Upper Dale Road and Dale Road to the junction of Dale Road with Lower Dale Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Lower Dale Road to its junction Street Northumberland being boundary of Babington Ward, and thence in a northerly, westerly and northerly direction following the western boundary of Babington Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Arboretum Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Lower Dale Road at its junction with Northumberland Street, thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction along the southern boundary of Babington Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with Rose Hill Street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Rose Hill Street to its junction with Sale Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Sale Street to its junction with Cambridge Street, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Cambridge Street to its junction with

Richmond Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Richmond Road to its junction with Portland Street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Portland Street to the intersection of St. Thomas' Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of St. Thomas' Road and Walbrook Road to the junction with the boundary of Dale Ward, and thence in a northerly and easterly direction following the eastern boundary of Dale Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Normanton Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of St. Thomas' Road on the southern boundary of Arboretum Ward, thence in a westerly direction following the southern boundaries of Arboretum Ward and Dale Ward to the intersection of the foot-path from Warwick Avenue to Normanton Lane, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the said foot-path to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence in a southerly, easterly, north-easterly, southerly and easterly direction following the Borough boundary to its junction with Sinfin Lane, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Sinfin Lane, Balaclava Road and St. Thomas' Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Pear Tree Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of St. Thomas' Road at its junction with Walbrook Road, on the southern boundary of Arboretum Ward, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of St. Thomas' Road to the intersection of Portland Street, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Portland Street to the junction with Richmond Road, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Richmond Road to its junction with Cambridge Street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Cambridge Street to its junction with Sale Street, thence in a northeasterly direction along the centre of Sale Street to its junction with Rose Hill Street, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Rose Hill Street and Malcolm Street to the junction of Malcolm Street with Colombo Street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Colombo Street and Black Lane to the junction Osmaston Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Osmaston Road to a point in the centre of Osmaston Road Bridge immediately over the centre of the Main Track of the London Midland & Scottish Railway from Derby to Birmingham, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the said track to a point in the centre of the said track immediately under the centre of the Sinfin Lane Bridge on the boundary of Normanton Ward, and thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of Normanton Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Litchurch Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of Osmaston Road at its junction with Morleston Street, thence in a generally southwesterly direction following the south-eastern

boundary of Babington Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with Rose Hill Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Rose Hill Street being the northern boundary of Arboretum Ward to its junction with Sale Street, thence in a south-easterly, northerly, south-easterly and south-westerly direction along the northern and eastern boundary of Pear Tree Ward to a point in the centre of the Main Track of the London Midland & Scottish Railway immediately under the centre of the Cotton Lane Footbridge, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the footpath from the said Bridge to its junction with Cotton Lane, thence in a northerly, easterly and north-easterly direction along the centre of Cotton Lane to its junction with Osmaston Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Osmaston Road to its junction with the footpath leading from Osmaston Road to Parsons Bridge over the Derby Canal, thence along the centre of the said footpath to its intersection with the road leading from the old Osmaston Parish Church and Vicarage to London Road. thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said road to its junction with London Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of London Road to its junction with Castle Ward, thence in a north-westerly and south-westerly direction following the south-western boundary of Castle Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Osmaston Ward.

"A line commencing at the centre of the Sinfin Lane Bridge over the London Midland & Scottish Railway over the centre of the Main Track from Derby to Birmingham, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said track being the south-eastern boundary of Pear Tree Ward to its junction with the boundary of Litchurch Ward, thence in a northerly and easterly direction following the southern boundary of Litchurch Ward hereinbefore described to its junction with the road leading from the old Osmaston Parish Church and Vicarage to London Road, thence along the centre of the footpath leading from Osmaston Road to Parson's Bridge over the Derby Canal to a point in the centre of Parson's Bridge over the centre of the Derby Canal, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the said canal to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence in a generally westerly direction following the Borough boundary to its junction with Sinfin Lane, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Sinfin Lane being the eastern boundary of Normanton Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Alvaston Ward.

"A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River Derwent being the junction of the eastern boundary of Castle Ward hereinbefore described with the Borough boundary, thence following the Borough boundary in an easterly, southerly and westerly direction to its junction with the eastern boundary of Osmaston Ward, thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundaries of Osmaston Ward, Litchurch Ward, and Castle Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. - 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

NOTICE OF INTENTION UNDER THE ABOVE-MEN-TIONED ACTS TO MAKE A SPECIAL ORDER TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIB-UTIVE) ORDER, 1928.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") has withdrawn the draft Special Order referred to in the Notice of Intention dated the thirtieth day of July, 1927;

And whereas the Minister intends to make a Special Order with a view to altering the description of the Milk Distributive trade contained in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, as varied by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926.

Now therefore the Minister hereby gives notice that he intends, pursuant to the powers conferred on him by Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order varying the above Orders in the manner shown in the draft Special Order contained in the Appendix hereto.

THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE)
ORDER, 1928, SPECIAL ORDER DATED
, 1928, MADE BY THE MINISTER
OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE TRADE
BOARDS ACT, 1918 (8 AND 9 GEO. 5. c. 32)
VARYING THE TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDERS, 1920 AND 1926.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) by a Special Order called the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, dated the 9th day of January, 1920, applied the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Special Order;

And whereas the description of the trade in the said Appendix was altered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926;

And whereas it is provided by sub-section 1 of section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the said Special Orders by altering the description of the trade therein specified;

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, and of any other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes a Special Order varying the said Special Orders:—

(1) The description of the trade set out in the Appendix to this Order shall be substituted for that set out in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, as altered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1926.

(2) This Order may be eited as the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1928.

APPENDIX.

- 1. Subject as hereinafter provided, the Milk Distributive Trade shall consist of the following operations:—
 - (i) the wholesale and retail sale of milk;
 (ii) the sale of other goods by workers mainly employed in the sale specified in paragraph 1 (i) hereof;

(iii) all work incidental to the sale

specified in paragraph 1 (i) hereof.

2. Work incidental to the sale specified in paragraph 1 (i) hereof shall include, inter alia:—

(a) collecting, delivering, despatching;

(b) pasteurising, sterilising, homogenising, humanising, cooling, separating and all work performed in connection with any other processes in the preparation of milk;

(c) blending, testing and sampling of milk;

(d) cleaning of utensils, receptacles, vehicles, premises, plant, machinery;

(e) stoking, attending to boiler, plant or machinery, fire lighting, portering of coal or other fuel;

(f) horse keeping and harness cleaning;

(g) portering, lift or hoist-operating, timekeeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing;

(h) boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, packing

and unpacking;

- (i) clerical work or canvassing carried on in conjunction with the work specified in paragraph 1 hereof.
- 3. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions, the Milk Distributive Trade shall not include any of the following operations:—
 - (a) the wholesale sale of milk (and operations incidental thereto) from an establishment at which milk products are manufactured and from which unseparated milk is not ordinarily sold as such;

(b) the wholesale sale of milk direct from the farm where the milk was produced and

all operations incidental thereto;

(c) the sale of milk in restaurants, shops or similar premises by waiters or shop assistants who are not mainly engaged upon such sale;

(d) the transport of goods by common

carriers;

(e) carting and operations incidental thereto where the business carried on consists exclusively of such operations;

(f) work done by or on behalf of the Post

Office.

4. For the purpose of this Schedule the expression "milk" means milk other than dried or condensed milk.

(DRAFT) EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM.

TRADE BOARDS (MILK DISTRIBUTIVE) ORDER, 1928.

Purpose of Memorandum.

1. The following memorandum is issued for the guidance of all concerned in the application of the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive)

Order, 1928; it must, however, be understood that an authoritative interpretation of the Trade Boards Acts and of Orders made thereunder can be given only in the Courts of Law. The Minister's responsibility is confined to securing compliance with the Trade Boards Acts in cases in which he is advised that the Acts have not been complied with.

General Effect of Amendment of Order.

- 2. General.—The Milk Distributive Order of 1928 which amends the Milk Distributive Orders of 1920 and 1926, makes no substantial change in the kind of establishment included within the scope of the Milk Distributive trade, but lays down a definition of that trade which is clearer than the definition contained in the earlier Orders. Experience has shown that the trade impinges on other trades or branches of trades which, though they were not intended to be covered by the original Order, were nevertheless not excluded with sufficient precision. In particular the words used in the first paragraph of the Order of 1920 have given rise to difficulties of interpre-
- 3. Inclusions.—The first paragraph of the Amending Order brings in without qualification all the wholesale and retail sale of milk, together with the sale of other goods by workers mainly employed upon the sale of milk (Section 1 (i) and (ii)). It also includes all work incidental to the sale of milk (Section 1 (iii)).

4. Incidental Operations. — Paragraph 2 enumerates the principal types of work which are incidental to the sales mentioned in paragraph 1 (i) and has the same general effect as the similar paragraph in the original Order.
5. Clerical Work.—The inclusion of clerical

work and canvassing carried on in connection with the sale of milk is in the same terms as in the original Order, that is to say that it is included when carried on as incidental to and in conjunction with the sale of milk

wholesale or retail (paragraph 2 (i)).
6. Employees of Farmers.—The Minister has been advised that the Trade Boards Acts do not apply to workers who are employed in agriculture and consequently the minimum rates fixed by Trade Boards are not enforceable in respect of them. He is advised, however, that certain workers employed by farmers upon work connected with milk distribution are not employed in agriculture but by reason of their status and occupation as milk workers are entitled to be paid the minimum rates of wages fixed by the Milk Distributive Trade Board.

As at present advised the Minister will confine his action in requiring farmers to pay Milk Distributive Trade Board rates to cases of workers who are employed in connection with the retail sale of milk and who fall within the following classes:

- Workers who are employed exclusively upon one or more of the operations included in the Order defining the Milk Distributive Trade (this work is described below as " milk work ''). Examples of such workers are:-
 - (a) a worker employed exclusively on a milk round;
 - (b) a worker employed exclusively upon "milk work" in or about the dairy or on any other "milk work";

- (c) a worker employed for part of his time on a milk round and for the rest of his time on other milk work.
- (2) Workers employed on milk work but who are also employed upon other work so long as such other work does not form a substantial element of their employment. Examples of such workers are:-
 - (a) a worker employed on milk work for 48 hours in the week and also employed on other work in additional hours;
 - (b) a worker employed, during the week, on milk work for all but a very small proportion of his time and doing other work during that time.
- 7. Exclusions.—Paragraph 3 of the Amending Order indicates certain classes of work which are to be excluded.
- (a) Milk Product Factories.—By paragraph 3 (a) the wholesale sale of milk is excluded from the Amending Order, when carried on from establishments such as creameries or cheese factories, in which milk is ordinarily used as a material for manufacture and is not ordinarily sold as milk. The intention is to exclude the occasional wholesale sale of milk by creameries, &c., but to include such sale when carried out as a regular part of the business, e.g. during the whole or the greater part of the year.
- b) By paragraph 3 (b) the wholesale sale of milk direct from the farm where it is produced is excluded in all circumstances. Thus a worker who is employed exclusively upon the wholesale sale of milk is not covered by the Amending Order.
- (c) Shops and Restaurants.—By paragraph (c) shop assistants, waiters, &c., are excluded if they are mainly engaged in shops, restaurants, or the like, in selling articles other than milk. But a person employed in the delivery of milk on a milk round (i.e. outside the shop) is included for such work even though employed for a larger number of hours in the day as a shop assistant or waiter. Further, a shop assistant, who is employed mainly in the sale of milk is, by virtue of section 1 (ii) of the Order included for all the time he acts as a shop assistant.
- 8. Transport.—The transport of goods by common carriers such as Messrs. Paterson, or by railways, is not regarded as part of the Milk Distributive Trade.

 9. Meaning of "Milk."—Milk is defined as
- milk other than dried or condensed milk.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF ASSISTANT INSPECTOR OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, JUNIOR ASSISTANT AUDITOR IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND THIRD CLASS OFFICER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 21 and 24. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

- 2.
