

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC
ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act, to make regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment (Route No. 30A) Provisional Regulations, 1928, to come into operation forthwith as provisional regulations to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

These Regulations provide for the re-arrangement of omnibus services on Routes Nos. 30A and 74 between Putney and Roehampton.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 7th March, 1928.)

Whereas under Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, the Registrar General, with the sanction of the Minister of Health, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

And whereas by the Sunderland Corporation Act, 1927, it is enacted inter alia that on the 1st April, 1928, parts of the Parishes of Whitburn and Silksworth shall be added to the Parish of Sunderland and to the Sunderland Union, and shall cease to form part of the South Shields Union and Houghton le Spring Union respectively.

And whereas it is expedient that corresponding alterations shall be made in the constitution of the Registration Sub-districts herein-after mentioned.

Now, therefore, I, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, C.B., Registrar General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1926 and with the

sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Sunderland, South Shields and Houghton le Spring Registration of Births, etc. (Alteration of Sub-districts) Order, 1928, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1928.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. That part of the civil parish of Whitburn, which by the above recited Act is added to the Sunderland Union, shall cease to form part of the South Shields Rural Sub-district of South Shields Registration District and shall be added to and form part of the Southwick Sub-district of Sunderland Registration District.

4. That part of the civil parish of Silksworth, which by the above recited Act is added to the Sunderland Union, shall cease to form part of the Houghton le Spring Sub-district of Houghton le Spring Registration District and shall be added to and form part of the Ryhope Sub-district of Sunderland Registration District.

5. The Superintendent Registrar of the existing Sunderland Registration District shall be the Superintendent Registrar of that Registration District as extended by this Order.

6. The Registrars of the existing Southwick and Ryhope Sub-districts shall be respectively the Registrars of these Sub-districts as extended by this Order.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.
