Registration of Title to land is to be compulsory on sale in the County Borough of

Hastings on and after the first day of January, 1929.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of the Explosives Act, 1875 (38-9 V. c. 17), it is provided that His Majesty from time to time, by Order in Council, may prohibit, either absolutely or except in pursuance of a licence of the Secretary of State under the Act, or may subject to conditions and restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation, conveyance, and sale, or any of them, of any explosive which is of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of His Majesty it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order:

And whereas the explosives to which this Order applies are of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of His Majesty it is expedient for the public safety to make this Order:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56-7 V. c. 66), have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe as follows:—

1. This Order applies to all explosives other than gunpowder, small-arm nitro-compound, safety cartridges made with gunpowder, or with small-arm nitro-compound, cartridges or charges for cannon or blasting made with gunpowder and not containing within themselves their own means of ignition, percussion caps, safety fuze, or fireworks.

2. No person shall sell any explosive to which this Order applies unless he complies with the following conditions:—

(i) He shall satisfy himself that the person desiring to purchase the explosive is in possession of a police certificate as provided by the two Orders in Council of the date of 20th April, 1883, and the Order in Council of the date of the 26th October, 1896 (S. R. & O., 1896, No. 964), or by this Order and in the case of a certificate given under this Order shall countersign the certificate at the time of sale.

Provided that this shall not apply to the owner agent or manager of a mine or quarry in respect of the sale by him of explosives to his employees for immediate use in the said mine or quarry.

(ii) He shall keep a record of the nature and quantity of explosives sold, the date of each transaction, and the name and address of the purchaser, and shall show such record to any Government Inspector, police officer, or duly appointed officer of the Local Authority when called upon to do so.

3. Where a Chief Officer of Police is satisfied that explosives to which this Order applies are

required for immediate use for industrial or agricultural purposes, or for immediate conveyance on board ship for use in the removal of wrecks or for other work afloat, he may issue a certificate to authorize the purchase of such explosive for private use, and not for sale, by such person as may be named in the Certificate and to such amount, exceeding ten pounds, as may be specified in the Certificate. The Certificate shall be valid for one purchase only.

4. The expression "Chief Officer of Police" in this Order has the same meaning as in Clause 5 (b) of the Order in Council of the date of 20th April, 1883, relating to the keeping of explosives for private use and not for sale.

5. This Order shall be in lieu of the Order in Council of the date of 6th February, 1922 (S. R. & O., 1922, No. 124), which is hereby repealed, and shall come into force from the date hereof.

6. This Order may be cited as the Sale of Explosives Order, 1928.

And whereas in accordance with the provisions of the Treaty of Versailles mandates on behalf of the League of Nations have been accepted by His Majesty and are being exercised on behalf of His Majesty by His Majesty's Government in Great Britain in respect of the under-mentioned territories that is to say:—

- (a) the Tanganyika Territory,
- (b) the British Cameroons,
- (c) British Togoland.

And whereas in accordance with the provisions of the Treaty of Versailles mandates on behalf of the League of Nations have been accepted by His Majesty and are being exercised on behalf of His Majesty by His Majesty's Governments in those parts of His Majesty's Dominions hereinafter appearing in respect of the under-mentioned territories that is to say:—

- (a) the territory of South West Africa (formerly German South-West Africa) exercised by His Majesty's Government in the Union of South Africa;

(b) the territory of New Guinea (i.e. the former German Possessions in the Pacific Ocean situated south of the Equator other than German Samoa and Nauru) exercised by His Majesty's Government in the Commonwealth of Australia; and

(c) the territory of Western Samoa (formerly German Samoa) exercised by His Majesty's Government in the Dominion of New Zealand.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct and it is hereby directed as follows:—

1. The above-mentioned territories shall as from the 15th June, 1927, be included in His Majesty's Dominions for the purposes of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Mandated Territories) Order, 1928.

2. This Order may be cited as the Cinematograph Films (Mandated Territories) Order, 1928.

WHEREAS by Section 445 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that where the Board of Trade certify that the laws and regulations for the time being in force in any foreign country and relating to overloading and improper loading are equally effective with the provisions of that Act relating thereto, His Majesty in Council may direct that on proof of a ship of that country having complied with those laws and regulations, she shall not, when in a port of the United Kingdom, be liable to detention for non-compliance with the said provisions of that Act, nor shall there arise any liability to any fine or penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, provision, as is more particularly therein mentioned, is made for applying to foreign ships when in ports in the United Kingdom certain sections of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, which relate to loadline, without prejudice to any direction of His Majesty in Council given under the said Section 445 of the last-mentioned Act:

And whereas the Board of Trade have certified that certain statutory regulations which have been approved by the Portuguese Government relating to overloading, so far as regards the assignment of loadlines to Portuguese ships are equally effective with the corresponding regulations in force in this country respecting the assignment of loadlines to British merchant ships:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council doth direct that on proof that Portuguese ships have complied with the aforesaid Portuguese regulations, such ships shall not, when in ports of the United Kingdom, be liable to detention for non-compliance with the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to overloading, nor shall there arise any liability to any fine or penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions.

WHEREAS by Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, provision has been made for the reciprocal enforcement of judgments in the United Kingdom and in other parts of His Majesty's Dominions:

And whereas by the said Act it is, amongst other things, provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Dominions of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said part of that Act shall extend to that part of His Dominions and that on any such Order being made the said part of that Act shall extend accordingly:

And whereas on the 6th day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

QUEENSLAND.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

of February, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Hoggeston and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Dunton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Buckingham and in the Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hoggeston and Dunton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Hoggeston is now full the Reverend Edmund Herbert Jones being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Dunton is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Edmund Herbert Jones has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Hoggeston and the said Benefice of Dunton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Hoggeston with Dunton’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Edmund Herbert Jones if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoggeston shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Dunton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hoggeston and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem

expedient and that so much of the net proceeds of such sale as shall be approved by the Bishop of Oxford and by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England shall be applied by us towards the cost of putting in order the fabric and garden of the Parsonage House belonging to the United Benefice and any residue of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the §2nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hoggeston shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Dunton shall have the second turn.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of February, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Abdon and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Clee Saint Margaret both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Abdon and Clee Saint Margaret duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union (including an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of Tugford being a Parish of the United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford situate in the said County of Salop and in the said Diocese of Hereford) and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Abdon and Clee Saint Margaret are now full being held in plurality by the Reverend Arthur John Knapton under a Dispensation:

“ And whereas the said Arthur John Knapton has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Abdon and the said Benefice of Clee Saint Margaret shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Abdon and Clee Saint Margaret ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Arthur John Knapton if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Abdon and Clee Saint

Margaret shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices of Abdon and Clee Saint Margaret for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto his tenure of the said Benefices of Abdon and Clee Saint Margaret shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clee Saint Margaret shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Clee Saint Margaret having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Abdon having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" 5. That with the consents of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (testified as aforesaid) and of the Right Reverend Ernest, now Bishop of Worcester (testified by his signing this Scheme), being the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford, and with the consent of the Reverend Russell Henry Jeffrey (testified by his signing this Scheme), being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford, upon the union taking effect a portion of the said Parish of Tugford that is to say all that detached portion of the said Parish of Tugford (containing ' New House ' and an area of approximately 7 acres) which lies to the south west of the Parish Church of Abdon shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Abdon, but no alteration in the Endowments or Patronage of the said Benefice of Abdon or of the said United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford shall be made by reason of such transfer of territory.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the

provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Northill is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Northill which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named ‘ The Church of All Saints, Caldecote ’:

“ And whereas by a certain Deed bearing date on or about the 2nd day of February, 1928, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the ‘ New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,’ or some or one of them, between the Wardens and Commonalty of the Mystery of Grocers of the City of London (hereinafter called ‘ the Grocers’ Company ’), of the one part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the other part, the Grocers’ Company did, for the purpose of providing an endowment for the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted, appoint, grant and confirm unto the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish and to his successors a perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £200 to be payable by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November, in every year free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, rates, charges, assessments and outgoings whatsoever except on account of income tax (if any), and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all and singular the corporate income of the Grocers’ Company, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarter days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarterly day of payment:

“ And whereas by another Deed bearing date on or about the 2nd day of February, 1928, and made or expressed to be made under the like authority of the said ‘ New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,’ or some or one of them, between the Reverend Henry Lestock De la Cour De Brisay, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Northill, of the first part, the Grocers’ Company, the Patrons of the said Vicarage of Northill, of the second part, the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, the Ordinary of the said Vicarage of Northill, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners

of the fourth part, the said Henry Lestock De la Cour De Brisay did, with the consents of the Grocers' Company, as such Patrons as aforesaid, and of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop as aforesaid, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, all that sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for the said Vicarage of Northhill, to have and to hold for or towards the further endowment of the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish and of his successors as from the date of the said licence of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish:

"And whereas the said perpetual clear yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of £200 has been so appointed, granted and confirmed as aforesaid and the said sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock has been so assigned as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Northhill which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of All Saints, Caldecote.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of All Saints, Caldecote, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Northhill, in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which is bounded upon the north by the Parish of Sandy, upon the east by the Parish of Biggleswade, upon the south by the Parish of Old Warden, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Old Warden from the said Parish of Northhill at the point where such boundary diverges westward from following the middle of the stream which flows from the lake in Southill Park into the River Ivel, and extending thence first northward and then in various directions along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 1½ miles or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries the footpath leading from Northhill to Beeston Green across such stream, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hitchin Road and extending thence northward along the middle of Hitchin Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the place on the eastern side of the said road where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Northhill from the said Parish of Sandy diverges eastward from such road, and extending thence eastward across the said road for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to the last mentioned boundary."

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

East Boldre; and Hale with South Charford; and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rent charges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex to the said Benefices of Woodmancote with Popham; Bishop's Sutton; East Boldre; and Hale with South Charford; or any of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Winchester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for all or any of the said yearly charges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in every case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rent charge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Chad, York, comprising :—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Fulford, upon the south partly by a detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity Micklegate, York, and partly by the New Parish of Dringhouses, upon the west partly by the last mentioned New Parish and partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, York, upon the north by the Parish of the Holy Trinity Micklegate, York, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side that is to say, upon the north east, by an imaginary

line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of the Holy Trinity Micklegate, York, from the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, diverges northward along the western side of Albemarle Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Albemarle Road for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Philadelphia Terrace, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Philadelphia Terrace for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ovington Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Ovington Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called South Bank Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of South Bank Avenue for a distance of $18\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bishopthorpe Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Bishopthorpe Road for a distance of 4 yards or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Butcher Terrace, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Butcher Terrace for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Terry Street, and continuing thence south-eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Ouse upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, from the said Parish of Fulford.

“ III. Also all that other detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by the said detached portion of the Parish of the Holy Trinity Micklegate, York, upon the east by the said Parish of Fulford and upon the south by the said Parish of Bishopthorpe.

“ IV. And also all the above mentioned detached portion of the said Parish of the Holy Trinity Micklegate, York, which is contiguous to the above described portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, and which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north by the portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, described in Part I of this Schedule, upon the east by the said Parish of Fulford, upon the south-east by the detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, described in Part III of this Schedule, upon the south partly by the said Parish of Bishopthorpe and partly by the detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary Bishophill Senior, York, described in Part II of this Schedule, and upon the west by the said New Parish of Dringhouses.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of February, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Exeter, in the Diocese of Exeter:

“ Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Exeter should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas there are at present payable to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the Archdeacon for the time being of the said Archdeaconry of Exeter an annual sum of £4 in respect of the annual synodals formerly payable to the Bishop of Exeter and an annual sum of 10 shillings in respect of the annual pentecostals formerly payable to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Exeter, and we have agreed to make a grant of such annual synodals and pentecostals in augmentation of the income of the said Archdeaconry:

“ And whereas the grant of the said annual synodals and pentecostals will not have the effect of raising the whole income of the said Archdeaconry of Exeter, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1000 per annum:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that the said annual synodals amounting to £4 and the said annual pentecostals amounting to 10 shillings payable to us by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Exeter (including the yearly payments in respect of such synodals and pentecostals due on Michaelmas Day, 1927), shall by virtue of this Scheme and any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same be released by us to the said Archdeaconry to the intent that the Archdeaconry shall be wholly acquitted of payment thereof and that the said annual synodals and pentecostals shall for ever cease to be payable.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

" I, Frank Theodore, Lord Bishop of Winchester, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

" There is in the County of Southampton and Diocese of Winchester the Vicarage or Benefice of North Stoneham the Parish whereof contains a population of four thousand five hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and thirty persons and in Bassett Church for four hundred and fifty persons.

" The net annual value of the said Benefice of North Stoneham is nine hundred and eight pounds or thereabouts.

" There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of South Stoneham the Parish whereof contains a population of ten thousand nine hundred and seventy five or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and fifty eight persons and in the Church of St. Agnes Hampton Park for one hundred and fifty persons.

" The net annual value of the said Benefice of South Stoneham is five hundred pounds or thereabouts.

" There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Portswood the Parish whereof contains a population of four thousand eight hundred and twenty four or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for seven hundred and fifty persons.

" The net annual value of the said Benefice of Portswood is four hundred and ninety eight pounds or thereabouts.

" There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Westend the Parish whereof contains a population of two thousand one hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for four hundred and eighty persons.

" The net annual value of the said Benefice of Westend is three hundred and sixty five pounds or thereabouts.

" There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Fair Oak the Parish whereof contains a population of nine hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred persons.

" The net annual value of the said Benefice of Fair Oak is three hundred and forty pounds or thereabouts.

" That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838:—

" (1) A portion of the Parish of North Stoneham (the boundaries of which are delineated on the map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon coloured dark green) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of North Stoneham and be annexed to the Parish of Portswood to which it is contiguous.

" (2) Two portions of the Parish of North Stoneham (the boundaries of both of which are delineated on the map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon verged red) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of North Stoneham and be annexed to the Parish of South Stoneham to which they are contiguous.

" (3) A portion of the Parish of Portswood (the boundaries of which are delineated on the map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon verged violet) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Portswood and be annexed to the Parish of South Stoneham to which it is contiguous.

" (4) Three portions of the Parish of South Stoneham (the boundaries of which are delineated on the map attached to the

annexed Scheme and thereon verged yellow, blue, and light green respectively) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of South Stoneham and be annexed to the Parishes of Portswood, Westend, and Fair Oak respectively to which they are contiguous.

" (5) A portion of the Parish of Westend (the boundaries of which are delineated on the map attached to the annexed Scheme and thereon verged orange) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Westend and be annexed to the Parish of Fair Oak to which it is contiguous.

" John Edward Arthur Willis Fleming is the Patron of the said Benefice of North Stoneham and the Reverend Thomas Salmon is the present Incumbent thereof.

" I, Frank Theodore, Lord Bishop of Winchester, am the Patron of the Benefices of Portswood, Westend, and Fair Oak, the Reverend Walter Henry Chitty being the present Incumbent of Portswood, the Reverend Arthur Gerald Sayer of Westend, and the Reverend Thomas Sandford Blakiston Francois de Chaumont of Fair Oak.

" The Venerable Alfred Edward Daldy Archdeacon of Winchester and Rector of St. Mary Southampton is the Patron of the Benefice of South Stoneham and the Reverend Cyril Edward Spencer is the present Incumbent thereof.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of North Stoneham, Portswood, South Stoneham, Westend and Fair Oak and also the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" **SCHEME.**

" It is proposed to separate from the Parish of North Stoneham and annex to the Parish of Portswood all that portion of the Parish of North Stoneham which is delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured dark green.

" It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of North Stoneham and annex to the Parish of South Stoneham all those two portions of the Parish of North Stoneham which are delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and thereon verged red.

" It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Portswood and annex to the Parish

of South Stoneham all that portion of the Parish of Portswood which is delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and thereon verged violet.

" It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of South Stoneham and annex respectively to the Parishes of Portswood, Westend, and Fair Oak all those three portions of the Parish of South Stoneham which are delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and thereon verged yellow, blue, and light green respectively.

" It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Westend and annex to the Parish of Fair Oak all that portion of the Parish of Westend which is delineated on the said plan hereto annexed and thereon verged orange.

" That the Incumbents of Portswood, South Stoneham, Westend, and Fair Oak shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within those portions of the Parishes so to be separated from the Parishes of North Stoneham, Portswood, South Stoneham, and Westend and annexed to Portswood, South Stoneham, Westend, and Fair Oak respectively.

" That the inhabitants of such portions so to be separated shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which the several portions are respectively separated, except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in any or either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

" That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed as they might have had in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which such portions were separated.

" That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding Tithes if any) arising from the said portions so to be separated shall henceforth belong to the respective Incumbents of the Benefices to which such portions are respectively annexed.

" That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or any of them.

" That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or any of them.

(a) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the Churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In such earthen graves now existing in the Churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order in Council (when made) as can be buried at or below that depth.

V, c. 53), it is provided that if where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto:

And whereas it is provided by (inter alia) the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Order, 1927 (S.R. & O. 1927, No. 1203), that it shall not be lawful to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any imported cabinet furniture of metal not including locks unless such goods bear an indication of origin stamped, punched or cast thereon in a conspicuous manner:

And whereas the Board of Trade being the appropriate Department in this case having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter are satisfied that the application of the said provisions of the Order to the particular classes or descriptions of the goods hereinafter specified, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Order, 1927, shall cease to apply to cabinet furniture of metal of the descriptions hereinafter specified, provided that goods of those descriptions are sold and exposed for sale (wherever they are so exposed) in a container having an indication

of origin printed thereon in a conspicuous manner:—

(a) Articles to which because of their small size it is not practically possible to apply an indication of origin in the manner prescribed by the said Order; and

(b) Articles of an ornamental character to which it is not practically possible to apply an indication of origin in manner prescribed by the said Order without injury to the ornamental appearance of the goods.

SWANSEA AND MERTHYR TYDFIL.

(4) To enable and require the Merthyr Tydfil Corporation to make annual payments in respect of the provision and maintenance of the said Mental Hospital as may be agreed between the Corporations or as may be prescribed by the proposed Provisional Order;
