APPOINTMENT OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

23rd February, 1928:-

APPOINTMENTS.

ASHWIN STREET AND ROSEBERRY PLACE, DALSTON.

Eighteen Hackney Carriages in two portions:

First Portion.—Eight carriages at Ashwin Street, in centre of roadway, commencing at a point fifteen feet North of the Northern building line of Dalston Lane and extending Northward as far as necessary for eight carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

Second Portion.—Ten carriages at Roseberry Place, on West side of roadway, commencing at a point fifteen feet South of the Southern building line of Dalston Lane and extending Southward, by kerb, as far as necessary for ten carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

With reference to the notice which was published in the issues of the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 25th November, 1927, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- (1) glue (including glue size) and gelatine;
- (2) enamel zinc sheets for covering walls and ceilings and for other similar purposes, the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, subsection 7, that Reports have been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid classes and descriptions of goods.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, subsection (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- 1. Ball and roller bearings of all descriptions, finished or unfinished and parts thereof, finished or unfinished, other than the balls, rollers or cages;
 - 2. Vacuum cleaners, electrically worked.
 - 3. Copper tubes.
- 4. Cotton wool, bleached or unbleached, medicated or unmedicated; absorbent gauze tissue, sanitary towels of all descriptions.
- 5. (a) Pumps of all descriptions (other than semi-rotary wing pumps).
 - (b) Parts of pumps of all descriptions.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an
