## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 20th April, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd April, 1928, to Saturday, the 28th April, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even

multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

#### COTTON WASTE RECLAMATION TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS NEWLY BROUGHT WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE TRADE BOARD.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Cotton Waste Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they Propose to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers by providing that the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice C.W.(12), dated 30th October, 1922, which are already in operation as respects workers employed in those branches of the Trade included by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of the Trade Board for the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, Great Britain, dated 27th August, 1920, which are also included by the

Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, Great Britain) (Cotton Waste Branch) (Amendment) Regulations, 1927, shall apply in the same manner to workers of the same classes who are employed in those branches of the Trade included by the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, Great Britain) (Cotton Waste Branch) (Amendment) Regulations, 1927, which are not included by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of the Trade Board for the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, Great Britain, dated 27th August, 1920.

Full particulars of the proposed rates will be supplied on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board by or on behalf of persons engaged in the trade.

Under Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Fix, which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th day of April, 1928. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Cotton Waste Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

#### FOOT- AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN- FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 47).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### PART I.

#### *Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas.*

1. The Areas described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas for the purposes

of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

*Revocation of Certain Orders.*

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1928 (Nos. 44 to 46 inclusive) are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

3. This part of this Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

PART II.

*Release of Certain Areas from Restrictions.*

4. The Areas numbered 4, 5, 6 and 8 described in the Schedule to this Order shall cease to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 as from the twenty-first day of April, the twenty-third day of April, the twenty-second day of April and the twenty-fourth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight respectively.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 47).
