ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Revocation.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1928 (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

Release of Animals undergoing Detention and Isolation.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine moved from the landing place with a licence granted under Article 5 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1928 (No. 3) shall, notwithstanding the conditions specified in such licence, be released from detention and isolation in accordance with the provisions of that Article on the fourteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, or when the period of fourteen days' detention and isolation has been completed, whichever is the earlier.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1928 (No. 4).
