

BOROUGH OF GODALMING.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

By an Order dated the 13th day of April, 1928, the Minister of Health has declared that on and after the 30th day of April, 1928, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Borough of Godalming, namely:—

Section 25 (which relates to the paving of yards in connection with dwelling-houses) comprised in Part II of the said Act.

Sections 39, 40, 41 and 42 (which relate to the provision and conversion of closet accommodation) comprised in Part III of the said Act.

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Section 25 to the condition specified in the Order.

A copy of the Order may be inspected at the Town Clerk's Office, High Street, Godalming, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

SEVENOAKS AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

The Sevenoaks and District Electricity Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 for a Special Order for the following purposes:—

1. To extend their area of supply so as to authorise them to supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined in the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 in the Parishes of Crowhurst, Godstone (detached), Horne, Lingfield, and Tandridge in the Rural District of Godstone, together with so much of the Parishes of Bletchingley and Godstone in the said Rural District as is not included in the existing area of supply of the Undertakers under the Woldingham and District Electricity Special Order 1924; all in the County of Surrey (hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the added area all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe the maximum prices to be charged for electricity within the added area.

4. To empower the Horley and District Electricity Supply Company Limited to give a supply of Electricity in bulk to the Company.

5. To empower the Company or the Horley and District Electricity Supply Company Limited to lay mains and to break up roads outside the added area for the purpose of giving such bulk supply.

6. The streets and parts of streets in the added area not repairable by the Local Authority which the Company propose to take

special powers by the Order to break up are as follow:—

Roads:—

In the Rural District of Godstone—

Parish of Godstone—

Cottenham Terrace.

Road in course of construction at Hunters Hill (Ministry of Transport reference A.22).

Parish of Lingfield—

Green Lane.

Mill Lane, Dormans Land.

7. The streets and parts of streets in the added area in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order are as follow:—

In the Rural District of Godstone—

Parish of Crowhurst—

Crowhurst Lane from the School to No. 1 St. George's Cottages.

Parish of Godstone—

So much of the Croydon to East Grinstead Road as lies between the junction of Carlton Road with that Road and the Post Office at Blindley Heath.

Parish of Horne—

Road from St. Mary's Church to the Rectory.

Parish of Lingfield—

Newchapel Road from the junction therewith of Godstone Road to the junction therewith of Mount Pleasant Road.

Godstone Road from the junction therewith of High Street to the Alms Houses. Mount Pleasant Road.

High Street.

Town Hill from High Street to "Ringmere."

Church Road.

Road through Dorman's Land from the Plough Inn to St. John's Church.

Parish of Tandridge—

Tandridge Lane from the School to St. Peter's Church.

8. The streets and parts of streets outside the added area which the Company propose to take special powers by the Order to break up are as follow:—

Roads repairable by the Local Authority—

In the Rural District of Reigate in the County of Surrey—

Parish of Burstow—

Hathersham Lane.

Scott's Hill.

Parish of Horley—

Hathersham Lane.

Roads not repairable by the Local Authority—

In the Rural District of Reigate in the County of Surrey—

Parish of Burstow—

Courtoak Lane.

9. Every local or other public authority Company or person being desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application may do so
