The KING has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Herbert Thomas Lloyd, upon whom was conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Clerk in Holy Orders, Master of Arts of the University of Oxford, formerly Rector of Croydon in the County of Cambridge, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may take and use the surname of Johnes in addition to and after that of Lloyd, that he may bear the Arms of Johnes quarterly with those of Lloyd, and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken borne and used by his issue, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the Permission and Royal Licence to be void and of none effect.

And to Command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as would have been due to them if their late Father Raymond Asquith, Lieutenant, Grenadier Guards, had survived his Father, Herbert Henry, Earl of Oxford and Asquith, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Oxford and Asquith.
