Electricity Commission.—1928.

AXMINSTER CHARD AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made to the Electricity Commissioners by South Somerset and District Electricity Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers") whose registered office is at 25, Victoria Street, in the City of Westminster, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926 for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Axminster Chard and District Electricity Special Order 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1927") so as to include therein the rural district of Axminster except the parishes of Axminster Hamlets, Chardstock and Beer and so much of the parishes of Axmouth and Colyton as forms part of the area of supply for the purposes of the Seaton and District Electricity Special Order 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

2. To authorise the Undertakers to generate, store, distribute, sell and supply electrical energy for all or any public or private purposes as defined in the said Acts and to exercise all powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity within the added area.

3. To authorise the Undertakers to supply within the area of supply of the Undertakers as proposed to be extended electricity for the purposes of haulage or traction on any railway, tramway or canal situate partly within and partly without that area or for the purposes of lighting vehicles and vessels and for other purposes incidental to the working or lighting of such railway, tramway or canal.

4. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, with or without modifications and to extend and make applicable to the added area with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Order of 1927.

5. To make provisions as to the price which may be charged by the Undertakers for electricity supplied in the added area.

6. To confer upon the Undertakers the powers or some of the powers contained in the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1926, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights and privileges.

7. Under the powers so proposed to be conferred upon the Undertakers the following streets not repairable by the local authority will or may be broken up or interfered with in the added area (that is to say):—

County Roads:—

In the Rural District of Axminster:—

The road from Axminster to Honiton.

The road from Axminster to Seaton.

The road from Axminster to Lyme Regis.

The road from Lyme Regis to Sidmouth.

The road from Whitford to Musbury.

The road from Kilmington to Colyton and Stafford Cross.

8. The streets and parts of streets in which the Undertakers are to lay down distributing mains within a specified time are the following (that is to say):—

(a) Parish of Musbury:—

Axminster Road from the junction of Whitford Road and Seaton Road to "The Moorings."

(b) Parish of Kilmington:—

The street from Gapemouth Corner via Newton's Farm and Rugg's Farm to Post Office Square.

And notice is hereby also given that every local or public authority company or person being desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, London, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 31st day of May, 1928, and must also forward a copy of any such objection to the undersigned.

COLNE CORPORATION.

(LIGHT RAILWAY ABANDONMENT.)

Sanction by the Minister of Transport.

WHEREAS it is enacted in Section 17 of the Colne Corporation Act, 1921, as follows:—

"(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Colne and Trawden Light Railways Order 1901 the Corporation may subject to the sanction of the Minister of Transport discontinue the light railways authorised by that Order or any part thereof and may remove the rails provided that the cost of such removal and of making good
