

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The District Chapelry of Saint John, Bulwell, being :—

“ All that part of the Parish of Bulwell, in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell, which is bounded upon the north west by the Parish of Hucknall Torkard, upon the south west by the Parish of Nuthall, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the east and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Nuthall from the said Parish of Bulwell crosses the middle of the footpath leading from Nuthall past the southern side of the Northern Cemetery to Bulwell, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of  $18\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the western side of Hempshill Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then first south eastward and then eastward along the middle of Hempshill Lane for a distance of  $38\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Coventry Road, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Coventry Road for a distance of  $18\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Commercial Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Commercial Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lime Street, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Lime Street for a distance of  $11\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ravensworth Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Ravensworth Road and of the footpath in continuation thereof which leads into the road called Squires Avenue for a distance in all of  $24\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said footpath with Squires Avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of Squires Avenue for a distance of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the occupation road leading to the Nottingham Corporation Golf Course, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said occupation road for a distance of  $12\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the southern boundary of the said golf course, and extending thence north westward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of  $40\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point near its western end upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bulwell from the said Parish of Hucknall Torkard.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Diocese of Southwell (Division) Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of March, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Diocese of Southwell (Division) Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the constitution of the Bishopric of Derby :

“ Whereas by the 9th section of the said Diocese of Southwell (Division) Measure, 1923, it is enacted that whenever the certificate referred to in the 3rd section of such Measure shall have been given to Your Majesty by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with respect to the Derby Bishopric Endowment Fund, we shall lay before Your Majesty in Council a Scheme for all or any of the matters in relation to such new Bishopric which in the said 9th section are mentioned :

“ And whereas the said certificate was given by us with respect to the endowment fund of the said Bishopric of Derby on the 23rd day of June, 1927, and thereupon by an Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 27th day of June, 1927, made in pursuance of the said Measure and reciting that such certificate had been so given as aforesaid, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of July, 1927, and came into operation on the 7th day of July, 1927, (1) the Bishopric of Derby was founded, (2) the Diocese of the said Bishopric was declared to consist of the Archdeaconries of Derby and Chesterfield, then in the Diocese of Southwell, (3) the Parish Church of All Saints, Derby (subject to the rights of the Patron and the Incumbent thereof), was declared to be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishopric, and (4) the Bishop of Derby was constituted a Body Corporate and was invested with all such rights, privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby, and the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Southwell, do (so far as their respective consents are necessary) consent to this Scheme and the several recommendations hereinafter contained, in testimony whereof they have respectively hereto set their hands and episcopal seals :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose as follows, namely :—

“ 1. The Diocese of Derby shall consist of the area assigned to it by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 27th day of June, 1927, as modified by the subsequent Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 20th day of December, 1927, which was published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the
