

Southwell, or otherwise in and for the Diocese of Southwell, and who derived or might have derived any portion of the emoluments of his office from sources arising within parishes or places which by the formation of the Diocese of Derby have been transferred from the Diocese of Southwell to the Diocese of Derby shall for the term for which he was so appointed to his office as aforesaid or until his resignation or other avoidance thereof continue within such transferred parishes or places to perform such duties in the same manner (that is to say, either in person or by deputy as may be authorised by the terms of such his appointment) and to receive accordingly such emoluments (upon the scale which may be established or be in force in the Diocese of Derby in relation to such his office) as an officer of or within the Diocese of Derby as he has hitherto performed and received as an officer of or within the Diocese of Southwell and (if an officer of the Bishop or Diocese) shall as regards such transferred parishes or places during his tenure of such his office be an officer of the Bishop or Diocese of Derby.

" 11. Sixteen Honorary Canonries shall be founded in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishopric of Derby and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Derby to appoint to such Honorary Canonries spiritual persons to whom the provisions of the 23rd section of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, in relation to the holders of Honorary Canonries founded thereunder shall be applicable save that so long as there shall be no Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Derby of his own sole authority and without the consent of any Dean and Chapter to make regulations respecting the Honorary Canons so appointed, provided always that any Honorary Canons in the Cathedral Church of Southwell who upon the foundation of the Bishopric of Derby were holding Benefices in that part of the Diocese of Southwell which is now included in the Diocese of Derby and who by writing under their respective hands duly registered or recorded as the Bishop of Derby shall direct, shall consent to such transfer, shall (notwithstanding anything in the last mentioned Act and section contained) be transferred to and become Honorary Canons in the said Cathedral Church of the Bishopric of Derby and shall, thereupon, that is to say, as to each of them upon his appointment as such Honorary Canon in the Cathedral Church of the Bishopric of Derby cease, ipso facto, to be an Honorary Canon in the Cathedral Church of Southwell.

" 12. All ferriers, tithe apportionments, maps, plans and other documents relating exclusively to any parish or parishes, ecclesiastical districts, or other cures or places situate within the Diocese of Derby as hereinbefore defined or otherwise relating exclusively to the said Diocese shall, subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained, be transferred from the custody of the registrar or other officer of the Diocese of Southwell or of the Bishop of such Diocese and shall become and be in the custody of such registrar or other officer or officers of the Diocese of Derby or of the Bishop of such Diocese. And as to all documents which may remain in their present custody although relating to or affecting the

Bishopric of Derby or any parish, ecclesiastical district, cure or place now situate in the Diocese of Derby as hereinbefore defined, the registrar or other officer of the Diocese of Derby shall be at liberty at all convenient times to inspect such documents and take copies therefrom as freely as the registrar or other officer in whose custody such documents may so remain."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Derby and Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of March, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wheatfield and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stoke Talmage, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Oxford and in the Diocese of Oxford:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Wheatfield and Stoke Talmage duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Wheatfield and the Parish of the Benefice of Chalgrove, situate in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:
