

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 years of age and over in spinning and twisting manilla hemp for binder twine making at the works of Messrs. R. Hood Haggie & Son Limited, Victoria Mill, Willington Quay, Northumberland, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that a woman shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to such woman, and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
