PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of Section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to Income Tax payable under the law in force in any foreign State; and

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the foreign State;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Income Tax payable in the foreign State, have the effect of law in the foreign State:

And whereas the agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government in Great Britain and the German Government:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

- (a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in Germany; and
- (b) that the arrangements contained in the said agreement between His Majesty's Government in Great. Britain and the German Government have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in Germany.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Germany) Declaration, 1928."

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND GERMANY FOR THE EXEMPTION OF SHIPPING PROFITS FROM DOUBLE TAXATION.

His Britannic Majesty's Government in Great Britain and the German Government being desirous of concluding an Agreement for the reciprocal exemption from income tax in certain cases of profits accruing from the business of shipping, have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Britannic Majesty's Government in Great Britain:

SIR RONALD C. LINDSAY,

His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at Berlin.

The German Government:

Walter de Haas,

Director in the Foreign Office,

DR. HERBERT DORN,

Director in the Ministry of Finance of the Reich,

who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:

Article 1.

His Britannic Majesty's Government in Great Britain agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from Income Tax (including Supertax) chargeable in Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the year of assessment 1923-24 commencing on the 6th day of April, 1923, and for every subsequent year of assessment any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Germany and not resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, or by a company managing and controlling such business in Germany.

Article 2.

The German Government agree to take the necessary steps under Article 7 of the Reichsabgabenordnung for exempting from Einkommensteuer und Körperschaftssteuer chargeable in Germany for periods subsequent to the 1st of April, 1923, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, and not resident in Germany, or by a company managing and controlling such business in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The expression "the business of shipping' means the business carried on by an owner of ships, and for the purposes of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

Article 4.

The agreement shall cease to have effect if and so soon as either the relief to be granted under Article 1 hereof in respect of income tax in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, or the relief to be granted under Article 2 hereof in respect of Einkommensteuer and Körperschaftssteuer in Germany, ceases to have legal operation.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

HEREAS by treaty, capitulations, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty The King has jurisdiction in the territories and places within the limits of "the Persia Order in Council, 1889" and "the Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907" and several Orders in Council amending the same:

And whereas it is desirable to suspend the operation of the Orders in Council aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by " the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890 " or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows, that is to say:

- 1. Subject to the provisions of Article 2, the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and any King's Regulations, Rules of Court, Rules, Instructions or other enactments made thereunder are hereby suspended from May 10, 1928, until further order, provided that this suspension shall not, either in Persia or elsewhere, affect the past opera-tion of such Orders, King's Regulations, Rules of Court, Rules, Instructions or enactments or my of them, or any right, title, obligation or liability accrued for the validity or invalidity of anything done or suffered under any of them before the making of this Order.
- 2.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1 the Secretary of State may, by an order published in the London Gazette, direct that the jurisdiction of any court established under the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule hereto may continue in certain respects as may be defined by such order, and the jurisdiction of such courts shall continue accordingly and shall be exercised in accordince with the provisions of the Orders in Council, King's Regulations, Rules of Court, Rules, Instructions or other enactments now in force in Persia.
- (2) The Secretary of State may, by an order published in the London Gazette, terminate to such extent and in such manner as he may think fit the jurisdiction of any provincial court whose jurisdiction has been continued under this Article.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Persia Order in Council, 1928, and shall come into force upon the tenth day of May, 1928.

And the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

NOTICE GIVEN BY HIS MAJESTY'S PRINCIPAL SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS UNDER ARTICLE 2 (1) OF THE PERSIA ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1928.

Whereas, by Article 1 of the Persia Order in Council, 1928, it is provided that the operation of the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule to that Order is suspended from May 10th, 1928, until further order:

And whereas by Article 2 (1) of the said Persia Order in Council 1928, it is provided that the Secretary of State may, by an order published in the London Gazette, direct that the jurisdiction of any court established under the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule to the said Order in Council may continue in certain respects as may be defined by such Order:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, hereby give notice that the jurisdiction of the Courts established under the Orders in Council mentioned in the Schedule to the said Persia Order in Council, 1928, shall continue in respect of any matter pending before the said Courts upon May 10th, 1928, and falling within His Majesty's civil jurisdiction exercisable in Persia for the judicial hearing and determination of matters in difference or for the administration or control of property or persons, and within His Majesty's criminal jurisdiction there exercisable for the repression or punishment of crimes or offences or for the maintenance of order.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of October, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, with part of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manchester. Saint Ann and Saint Mary, with the residue of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, all of which Benefices

are situate in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the said unions duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Manchester and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the said unions, and the said Bishop of Manchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all the said Benefices of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, Manchester, Saint James, George Street, and Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary are now full, the Reverend Hubert George Hiller being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and the Reverend Lewis Herbert Price being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, and the Reverend Francis Paton Williams being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary:

"And whereas there is no Parsonage House belonging to any of the said Benefices of Ancoats, Saint Andrew; Manchester, Saint James, George Street; and Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and Manchester, Saint James, George Street now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and a part of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, that is to say, so much of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, as lies to the east of an imaginary line proceeding from the northern boundary of the Parish of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, first south westwards along the middle of Portland Street to its junction with Oxford Street and then south eastwards along the middle of Oxford Street to the southern boundary of the said Parish of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Ancoats, Saint (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Ancoats, Saint Andrew), and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the remaining part of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street (containing the Church of Manchester, Saint James, George Street) and the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary), and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

- "3. That the Church of the Parish of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Ancoats, Saint Andrew.
- "4. That the Church of the Parish of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary, shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary.
- "5. That with the consents of the said Hubert George Hiller and of the said Francis Paton Williams (testified by their signing this Scheme), the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall take effect upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme if upon that day the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, shall be vacant; but, if upon that day the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, shall be full, then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street.
- "6. That if within the period of six calendar months immediately following the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Lewis Herbert Price shall with the consent of the said Bishop of Manchester retire from the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, in order that the said unions may take immediate effect, then he shall be entitled to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary and by way of compensation, an annual sum of £300 which annual sum shall commence as from the day upon which the said unions shall take effect and shall be payable by equal quarterly payments in every year, the first quarterly payment becoming due at the end of three calendar months next after the day upon which the said unions shall take effect and the said annual sum shall be payable to the said Lewis Herbert Price during the remainder of his life subject, however, to the same conditions as to suspension, reduction and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887. and the provisions of those Acts as to recovery in case of non-payment and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said annual sum and to the said Lewis Herbert Price as if the said annual sum were a pension

awarded under the said Resignation Acts and the said Lewis Herbert Price had resigned the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James,

George Street, under those Acts.

"7. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, shall be transferred to the Church of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary, to be closed officially.

- "8. Upon the unions taking effect all that capital sum of £1,960 10s. 2d. now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James, George Street, shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary and the income arising in respect of such capital sum shall be payable towards the cost of the provision of clerical or lay assistance for the Incumbent of such United Benefice.
- "9. That after the unions have taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Ann and Saint Mary.
- "10. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Church of Saint James, George Street, Manchester, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.
- "(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the deduction of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Manchester established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.
- fices Measure, 1923.
 "(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint James, George Street, Manchester, or such of them as the Bishop of Manchester shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Manchester to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Manchester which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint James, George Street, Manchester.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the site of the Church of Saint James,

George Street, Manchester, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint James, George Street, Man-chester, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto and provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.'

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Manchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manchester, Saint John, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manchester, Saint Matthew, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:
- "Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Man-chester, Saint John, and Manchester, Saint Matthew, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Manchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Manchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:
- "And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:
- "And whereas both of the said Benefices of Manchester, Saint John, and Manchester, Saint Matthew, are now full the Reverend Herbert Edmonds being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John, and the Reverend William Tonge being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Matthew:
- "And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John:
- "And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Manchester, Saint John, and Manchester, Saint Matthew, now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:
- 'Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to
- "1. That the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John, and the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Matthew, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Matthew and Saint John ' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.
- " 2. That the Church of the Parish of Manchester, Saint Matthew, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the

Table of Fees for the said Parish of Manchester Saint Matthew, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of

Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That with the consent of the said William Tonge (testified by his signing this Scheme) if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John, shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Matthew, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if both of the said Benefices shall then be full the union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Matthew, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That if within the period of six calendar months immediately following the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Herbert Edmonds shall with the consent of the said Bishop of Manchester retire from the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John, in order that the union of that Benefice with the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Matthew, as provided in Clause 1 of this Scheme may take immediate effect, then he shall be entitled to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice and by way of compensation, an annual sum of £300 which annual sum shall commence as from the day upon which the said union shall take effect and shall be payable by equal quarterly payments in every year, the first quarterly payment becoming due at the end of three calendar months next after the day upon which the union shall take effect and the said annual sum shall be payable to the said Herbert Edmonds during the remainder of his life subject, however, to the same conditions as to suspension, reduction and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887, and the provisions of those Acts as to recovery in case of non-payment and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said annual sum and to the said Herbert Edmonds as if the said annual sum were a pension awarded under the said Resignation Acts and the said Herbert Edmonds had resigned the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint John. under those Acts.

"5. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint John, Man chester, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Matthew, Manchester, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint John, Manchester, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint John, Manchester, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE PATENT OFFICE, DEPARTMENT OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 25, and candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to

resign their appointments on marriage.
5. No person actually serving in the Army,
Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission
to the examination unless he produces to the
Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon
to do so, the permission of his Commanding
Officer to attend the examination, dated before

the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 52) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.
