

the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of February, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Saint Margaret, Toxteth Park, Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:—

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Margaret, Toxteth Park, Liverpool, is vested in the Right Honourable Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax, Howard Douglas Horsfall, of Mere Bank, Liverpool, Esquire, Walter Digby Thurnam, of Lincoln’s Inn, London, Barrister at Law, the Reverend Stephen Richard Platt Mouldsdale, of Saint Chad’s College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, Ewart Douglas Horsfall, of Sandford Park, Sandford Saint Martin, in the County of Oxford, Esquire, and His Excellency the Right Honourable Edward Frederick Lindley, Baron Irwin, as Trustees upon the Trusts declared in a Deed bearing date the 28th day of October, 1869, and the said Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax, Howard Douglas Horsfall, Walter Digby Thurnam, Stephen Richard Platt Mouldsdale, John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, Ewart Douglas Horsfall, and Edward Frederick Lindley, Baron Irwin, are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

“ And whereas the said Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax, Howard Douglas Horsfall, Walter Digby Thurnam, Stephen Richard Platt Mouldsdale, John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, Ewart Douglas Horsfall, and Edward Frederick Lindley, Baron Irwin, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Margaret, Toxteth Park, Liverpool, should be transferred to and be vested in the Governing Body of Saint Chad’s Hall, Durham:

“ And whereas the Governing Body of Saint Chad’s Hall are willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, is consenting to the transfer of Patronage which is hereinafter recommended and proposed and in token

of such his consent which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them, is made necessary he, the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Margaret, Toxteth Park, Liverpool, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Toxteth Park, Liverpool:

“ Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Charles Lindley, Viscount Halifax, Howard Douglas Horsfall, Walter Digby Thurnam, Stephen Richard Platt Mouldsdale, John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, Ewart Douglas Horsfall, and Edward Frederick Lindley, Baron Irwin, being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Governing Body of Saint Chad’s Hall (in testimony whereof the Governing Body have caused their Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Margaret, Toxteth Park, Liverpool, shall be transferred to the said Governing Body of Saint Chad’s Hall and their successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Governing Body of Saint Chad’s Hall and by their successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.
