**ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT WHICH IS TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOYMENT.**

The Buckinghamshire Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder do by this Order vary as from 14th May, 1928, their Order of the 15th January, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Buckingham and hereby order that such employment shall be as follows:—

(a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, August Bank Holiday, Christmas Day or Boxing Day) in every week as may be agreed between an employer and a worker, provided that in any case overtime rates shall be payable in respect of all hours worked after 1 p.m. on such day.

(b) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, August Bank Holiday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, provided that in any case overtime rates shall be payable in respect of all hours worked after 1 p.m. on such days.

(c) All employment on a Sunday.

(d) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in summer.

(e) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in winter.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the period of twelve months.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of an aggregate sum of one thousand and two hundred pounds heretofore held by us for the spiritual benefit of the Parish of Belgrave, in the County and Diocese of Leicester, and now specifically appropriated for the endowment of the New Parish and Vicarage (hereinafter called the Benefice) of Birstall, which has recently been formed out of the said Parish of Belgrave, Do Hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, Grant, out of the Common Fund under our control to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Birstall and to his successors, Incumbents of the same Benefice, all and singular, a yearly sum or stipend of fifty-four pounds such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated from the thirtieth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight and to be payable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always that the yearly sum or stipend hereby granted shall be and shall be taken to be in lieu of and in substitution for two yearly sums or stipends of twenty-two pounds ten shillings and thirty-one pounds ten shillings respectively heretofore payable by us towards the stipend of the Curate serving the district of Birstall in the said Parish of Belgrave under the authority of two Instruments which were sealed by us on the fourteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six and the thirteenth day of October in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and were published in the London Gazette on the
