NOTE.—Grace Roberts, late of Mile End, London, a cousin of the said Anna Seward, is believed to have had 12 children. Nothing is known of one of her sons, John Chapman Roberts. Another son, William Roberts, is believed to have married and to have left issue. It is not known whether another son, Josiah Roberts, had issue. A daughter, Elizabeth, who married, first, James Samuel Smith, and by him had a son, John Chapman Smith (who is believed to have married and had a daughter Rosa), a daughter, Anne Seward, and a son, James Samuel Smith the younger. Elizabeth married, secondly, Abraham Osorio, and by him had issue. Another daughter of the said Grace Roberts, named Mary, is believed to have married Matthew Randall and to have died without issue. Another son, Nathaniel Roberts, is believed to have married and had a son Nathaniel, who left issue. Another daughter (name unknown) is believed to have married John Wilkinson, of Wapping, and died without issue. Another daughter, Sarah, is believed to have married William Hainworth, and left issue.

The said Mary Hall, another cousin of the said Anna Seward, is believed to have died before 15th February, 1808, leaving issue.
