

by the said Acts. We then took from such residue two sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123.335 grains, the second 123.259 grains, and that therefore the said coins were respectively, the first sixty one thousandths of a grain above (+.061) and the second fifteen thousandths of a grain below (-.015) the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.50, the second 916.58 respectively, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively, the first sixteen hundred-thousandths below (-.00016) and the second eight hundred-thousandths below (-.00008) the standard fineness so prescribed.
