

the Minister of Transport under the aforesaid Section of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of those routes, such number of omnibuses as is shown opposite to each such route respectively in Column 3 of the said Schedule in excess of the number of omnibuses which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulations; pro-

vided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD MAY, 1928.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 53).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Staffordshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1928 (No. 52) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of May, nineteen hundred
