3. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment the Hertfordshire Agricultural Wages Committee have, by Order dated 23rd May, 1928, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

All employment on the Hay Harvest after the hour of 5.30 p.m. (Legal Summer Time) on each day of the week.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOYMENT DURING THE PERIOD OF THE HAY HARVEST OF 1928.

The Hertfordshire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order define the under-mentioned employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Hertford for workers employed on the Hay Harvest for overtime employment during the said Harvest of 1928:—

All employment on the Hay Harvest after the hour of 5.30 p.m. (Legal Summer Time) on each day of the week.

Any existing Order so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded.

This Order shall come into operation on 28th May, 1928.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Hertford have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum rates of

wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work during the Corn Harvest in 1928 in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective on 28th May, 1928.

SCHEDULE.

1. The rates of wages payable for the employment on harvest work of workers employed in agriculture during the period of the Corn Harvest in 1928 on the premises on which the worker is employed shall be not less than the following minimum rates in lieu of the minimum and overtime rates otherwise applicable under Orders of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 27th January, 1925, and 9th February, 1925.

2. Where a worker is paid wages in accordance with the terms of a Permit of Exemption the rate of wages payable for his or her work on the Corn Harvest shall bear the same relation to the full minimum rate specified in this Order as the rate specified in his or her Permit of Exemption bears to the full minimum rate applicable to work other than harvest work.

3. Any existing rate or Order in so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded in respect of any premises for the harvest period.

4. This Order shall apply to the Corn Harvest in 1928 only.
