

To make provision as to supply of gas where consumer has a separate supply, mode of cutting off supplies, removal of fittings, expenses of reconnecting discontinued supply, high pressure valves, period of error in defective meters, licences for use of patents, supply and purchase in bulk and relief from obligation to supply.

To empower the Council to lay pipes for purposes ancillary to their undertaking and to enable the Council to require repairs of gas pipes in case of danger.

To confer upon the Council further borrowing powers in connection with the proposed Order and otherwise for the purposes of the undertaking.

To prescribe the mode of raising money and repayment thereof, the application of revenue and money borrowed and as to proceeds of sale and hire of fittings and other financial provisions.

To incorporate and apply with or without modification any provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871 and the Lands Clauses Acts and to repeal or amend any provisions of the Bourne Gas Order 1914 and any other Act or Order affecting the Council.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter, addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London and despatched on or before the 29th day of June 1928.

Any such objection must state (a) the specific grounds of objection; and (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection shall be forwarded to the applicants for the Order or their Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.
