His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Archibald Burton in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

At about 3 a.m. on 12th November, 1927, two miners, Burton and Gleaves, were engaged in inserting timbers at the Burley Colliery, Apedale, Staffordshire, when, without warning, a fall of roof occurred which pinned Gleaves by the feet, and extinguished the lamps of both men. In complete darkness Burton succeeded in locating Gleaves but, finding that he was unable to release him, groped about for timber and having found it, succeeded in erecting a shield to protect his comrade from further falls. He then left to fetch lamps and assistance. As he was leaving a further fall occurred which buried Gleaves to the hips. Burton travelled some 150 yards, including some steep inclines, in

complete darkness before he could get a lamp and send for assistance. Having secured a lamp, he returned to the scene of the fall and was soon joined by another miner, Moss. Together these two placed more timber in position to protect the imprisoned man. They were then joined by others who assisted in the work of clearing the fall. They had worked their way along under the protecting timber to Gleaves' feet when they had to withdraw on account of the imminence of another fall. This further fall was heavier than the previous two and completely buried Gleaves, breaking all the protecting timber except that originally erected by Burton. No further falls occurred and after between four and five hours' work the imprisoned man was extricated.

Burton in waiting to erect a protection for his trapped comrade undoubtedly saved Gleaves' life and gravely imperilled his own.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF OFFICIAL RECEIVERS AND ASSISTANT OFFICIAL RECEIVERS IN THE BANKRUPTCY (HIGH COURT) AND COMPANIES (WINDING-UP) DEPARTMENTS AND IN SALARIED PROVINCIAL BANKRUPTCY OFFICES OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. When the Board of Trade think it desirable that persons not on the permanent staff of the Board should be admitted to compete together with permanent officers of the Department for appointment to the above posts, they will take such steps as they think most appropriate by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise to make known the existence of the vacancies, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received, and the date by which the age-limits will be reckoned. The Board of Trade will send a notice of the vacancies to the authorities of other Departments having professional legal or accounting staff.

2. Application will be addressed to the Board of Trade on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached

the Board will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the application forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Board of Trade and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they may think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Board of Trade and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. The Selection Board will usually comprise representatives of the Civil Service Commission and of the Board of Trade.

Until further notice, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from more active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post. Other things being equal and subject to this preference, preference will also be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, and among these preference will be given to such as have served or are serving in a Government Department over candidates without such service.

4. Candidates must have attained the age of 30 and must not have attained the age of 45 (50 in the case of permanent officers of the Board of Trade) on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. The upper age limit may, however, be extended in favour of a candidate who has served in His Majesty's Forces between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, and is or has been employed in a Government Department or under the Board of Trade as a Non-Salaried Official Receiver in Bankruptcy.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising:—

In the administrative county of Derby.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and

Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising:—

The parts of Lindsey Division of Lincoln;

And also comprising:—

The city and county borough of Lincoln; the county borough of Grimsby, and the borough of Louth.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Glamorgan.

The county borough of Merthyr Tydfil;

The petty sessional divisions of Miskin Higher and Caerphilly Higher; and so much of the petty sessional division of Caerphilly Lower as lies to the north of the railway line running from the Monmouth county border to the border of the county borough of Merthyr Tydfil at Trelewis.

In the county of Monmouth.

The petty sessional division of Bedwelty (*except the parishes of Abercarn, Mynyddislwyn and Bedwas*); and the parish of Blaenavon.

In the county of Brecknock.

The parishes of Bryn-mawr, Llangattock, Llangynidr, Llanddettty, Llanfigan, Llanfrynach, Cantref, Modrydd, Glyn, St. David Without, Vaynor, Penderyn, Ystradfellte, and Senny; and so much of the parish of Llanelly as lies to the west of the River Clydach.
