WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of May, 1928 (C.W. 4359/28), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having

been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing date the 6th day of February, 1925, and the 8th day of July 1927, to sanction, *inter alia*, the payment of a special allowance to Naval Observers who may be appointed to the Royal Naval Staff Course, the Army Staff Course, the Royal Air Force Staff Course, or the Meteorological Course, in lieu of the Observers' Allowance which they would receive if engaged on their specialist duties:

“And whereas we consider that Naval Observers who may be appointed to undergo the Long Signal Course, and the Senior Officers' Technical Course, should receive extra remuneration:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the following proposals, with effect from the dates stated:—

“(1) Qualified Naval Observers who may be appointed to undergo the Long Signal Course, to receive a special allowance of 4s. a day during the period of the course, in lieu of the Observer's Allowance which they would receive if engaged on their specialist duties, with effect from 28th November, 1927.

"(2) Qualified Naval Observers who may be appointed to undergo the Senior Officers' Technical Course, to receive a special allowance of 2s. 6d. a day during the period of the course, in lieu of the Observer's Allowance which they would receive if engaged on their specialist duties, with effect from 17th October, 1927.

"(3) Payment of both special allowances during periods of leave or sickness to be at Admiralty discretion.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas in the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Navy, and in sundry Orders in Council, provision is made for the grant of leave on full pay to Royal Naval and Royal Marine Officers, subject to certain conditions:

"And whereas under these Regulations and Orders in Council this privilege is not granted to Officers who are permitted to vacate appointments abroad at their own request:

"And whereas we consider that we should be empowered, at our discretion, to grant to any such Officers who are allowed prematurely to vacate their appointments for reasons which appear satisfactory to us, foreign service leave on full pay according to the authorized scale from time to time in force, subject, however, to the proviso that such leave shall be calculated in the case of each Officer as from the day following the date of vacating his appointment abroad, any time during which he may be employed on naval duties during passage home being excluded:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to approve of this proposal, with effect from 1st November, 1927.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of May, 1928 (C.W. 4361/28), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the provisions of Her late Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 16th day of July, 1895, no increase of retired pay may be granted to any Executive Officer of the Royal Navy on account of time on half-pay in excess of 2 years subsequent to his last employment, whether retired pay is assessed on the half-pay scale or otherwise:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of May, 1925, this rule was extended to apply to all Officers of Your Majesty's Navy and Marine Force and to time on unemployed pay as well as half-pay:

"And whereas we consider that the rule requires amendment to cover cases of officers promoted while unemployed and not subsequently given an appointment:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the amendment of the regulation in accordance with the proposal set forth in the annexed Schedule, with retrospective effect to cover cases dealt with under the proposed rule since 1904.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"No increase of retired pay to be granted to any Officer R.N. or R.M. on account of time on unemployed or half-pay in excess of

two years subsequent to his last employment, whether retired pay is assessed on the half-pay scale or otherwise.

"In the case of such officers promoted while unemployed, and not subsequently given an appointment, the period of two years to be calculated from the date of such promotion."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of March, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Great Gransden, situate in the County of Huntingdon, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Little Gransden, situate in the County of Cambridge, and both situate in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Great Gransden and Little Gransden duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ely and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Little Gransden is now full, the Reverend Charles Herbert Malden being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Great Gransden is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Charles Herbert Malden has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do

humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Great Gransden and the said Benefice of Little Gransden shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great and Little Gransden' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Huntingdon and of the Rural Deanery of Saint Neots but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Herbert Malden if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Little Gransden shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Great Gransden shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Great Gransden shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Gransden shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ely has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of

one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of March, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Upton Hellions with a part of the Benefice of Crediton both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Upton Hellions with a part of the said Benefice of Crediton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said Benefice of Upton Hellions and of so much of the said Benefice of Crediton as comprises the Chapelry of Sandford (the boundaries whereof are well known and defined) and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for such union based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Crediton is now full, the Reverend Humphrey Cedric Onslow being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Chapelry of Sandford is also full the Reverend George Taylor Llewellyn being

the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Upton Hellions is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said George Taylor Llewellyn has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas it was recommended in the said Report that the house and premises now held in trust by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Crediton for the benefit of and now occupied by the Incumbent of the said Chapelry of Sandford should, subject to the approval of the Charity Commissioners, become and be the Parsonage House of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect, and the said Charity Commissioners with the consent of the said Patrons have by Scheme dated the 25th day of November, 1927, duly authorised the conveyance of the said house and premises to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England as and for the Parsonage House of such United Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Humphrey Cedric Onslow (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Upton Hellions and so much of the said Benefice of Crediton as consists of the Chapelry of Sandford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sandford with Upton Hellions' and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church or Chapel at Sandford shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said George Taylor Llewellyn if he is then Incumbent of the said Chapelry of Sandford shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Upton Hellions shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require, and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £120 in any one year.

"6. That so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Upton Hellions, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds

heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Upton Hellions and of the said Chapelry of Sandford alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Upton Hellions having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Chapelry of Sandford having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said

Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of April, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of the Holy Trinity, Mapperley, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Derby:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Mapperley, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in William Adlington, of Number 19, Evelyn Gardens, London, S.W., Esquire:

"And whereas the said William Adlington is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Mapperley, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Derby for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edmund Courtenay, now Bishop of Derby, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

" And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Mapperley, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Mapperley :

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Adlington (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Mapperley, now vested in him, the said William Adlington as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever :

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sparsholt and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Lainston, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester :

" Whereas the said two Benefices of Sparsholt and Lainston are now held in plurality and have been so held save during periods of avoidance under not less than three successive Incumbencies :

" And whereas the said Benefices of Sparsholt and Lainston are now held in plurality by the Reverend Edward Cyril Raban, under a Dispensation :

" And whereas the said Edward Cyril Raban has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect :

" And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Sparsholt :

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, now Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Saint Mary, Stafford, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Stafford.'

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme; and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas by an Instrument, dated the 10th day of March, 1898, prepared under the provisions of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, and of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, the then lately built and consecrated Church of the Holy Trinity, situate in the said New Parish of Roehampton, was formally substituted for the Old Church and thereupon became and is now the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Roehampton:

"And whereas the Old Church has ceased to be used and is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril, now Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the Old Church shall be pulled down in whole or in part and that the materials and site of the same and the ground or part of the ground annexed or belonging thereto (not being ground forming part of a Churchyard which shall have been used for burials) shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as we shall deem expedient. Provided always that such sale or disposal shall be subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"2. That the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England as aforesaid, after the payment thereof of all costs and expenses of and in relation to such sale or sales and to the carrying into effect of this Scheme shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, for the benefit of the Benefice of Roehampton:

"Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under

the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the said Old Church and of the site thereof, together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwark has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

"I, Frank Theodore, by Divine Permission Bishop of Winchester, do, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, and of the sixth section of The Church

Building Act, 1839, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"That to the Vicarage of Hurstbourne Priors in the County of Hants and my Diocese of Winchester there belongs an ancient Chapelry known by the name of St. Mary Bourne the boundaries of which Chapelry are well known and defined.

"That according to the last census the population of Hurstbourne Priors was three hundred and eighty seven or thereabouts and of St. Mary Bourne one thousand one hundred and fifty eight or thereabouts.

"That there is in the said Chapelry of St. Mary Bourne a Church or Chapel which is distant from the Parish Church of Hurstbourne Priors of about two and three quarter miles.

"That the Church at Hurstbourne Priors has accommodation for two hundred and forty persons and that at St. Mary Bourne for four hundred and thirty persons or thereabouts.

"That the net annual income of the said Vicarage of Hurstbourne Priors is one hundred and seventy nine pounds or thereabouts arising from Tithe rent charge and other sources.

"That the net annual income arising out of the area included in the Chapelry of St. Mary Bourne is one hundred and fifty six pounds or thereabouts arising from Tithe rent charge from interest on proceeds of sale of Glebe and from other sources.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence at St. Mary Bourne but there is no house of residence at Hurstbourne Priors.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, and The Church Building Act, 1839, the said Chapelry of St. Mary Bourne may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage of Hurstbourne Priors with St. Mary Bourne and be constituted a separate Parish and Benefice for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"By virtue of my Bishopric I am the Patron of the Benefice of Hurstbourne Priors with St. Mary Bourne and the same Benefice is at present vacant.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have prepared the following Scheme which together with my consent as the Patron of the said Benefice of Hurstbourne Priors with St. Mary Bourne I submit to Your Grace to the intent that Your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such Scheme certify the same and such Consent by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consent referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"1. That the said Chapelry of St. Mary Bourne the boundaries of which are well known and defined shall be separated from the said Vicarage of Hurstbourne Priors with St. Mary Bourne and be constituted a separate Parish and Benefice for Ecclesiastical purposes by the name or style of the Perpetual Curacy and Benefice of St. Mary Bourne of which the said Church or Chapel of St. Mary Bourne shall be the Parish Church.

"2. That the proposed separate Parish and Benefice shall be subject to the same

Ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Vicarage of Hurstbourne Priors and that the Incumbent of such separate Parish and Benefice shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

"3. That two Churchwardens shall be annually chosen in and for such Parish and Benefice and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted and shall do all things pertaining to the Office of Churchwarden as to Ecclesiastical matters within the said separate Parish and Benefice.

"4. That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for Churchings Marriages Burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the proposed separate Parish and Benefice of St. Mary Bourne and all other Ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Parish or Benefice as shall arise within the said separate Parish or Benefice of St. Mary Bourne shall belong to the Incumbent thereof.

"5. That the Parishioners of the said proposed separate Parish of St. Mary Bourne shall be exclusively subject and liable to all rates charges and assessments to be made for or in respect of the maintenance and repair of the Church or Chapel of St. Mary Bourne aforesaid and the expenses incidental to the due performance of Divine Service therein and shall be exempt from all rates charges and assessments to be made for or in respect of the Parish Church of Hurstbourne Priors aforesaid or for or in respect of any other Church or Chapel situate elsewhere than within the limits of the said proposed separate Parish.

"6. That the Parishioners of the said proposed separate Parish of St. Mary Bourne shall not hereafter be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Church of Hurstbourne Priors nor shall the Parishioners of Hurstbourne Priors be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Church or Chapel of St. Mary Bourne except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the Churches of Hurstbourne Priors or St. Mary Bourne respectively and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same.

"7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

"8. That all the Tithe rent charges whatsoever arising within the Chapelry of St. Mary Bourne together with all capital sums of money stocks annuities or other property being or representing the proceeds of sale redemption or other conversion of such Tithe rent charges or any portion thereof and the residence and Glebe lands within the said Chapelry and all other endowments profits ecclesiastical dues offerings or emoluments whatsoever belonging to or in respect of the same shall henceforth belong to and be attached to the separate Parish and Perpetual Curacy and Benefice of St. Mary Bourne for ever and shall be held received and enjoyed by and payable to the Incumbent thereof for the time being.

BYELAWS AND REGULATIONS made by The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Grimsby, acting by the Council under the Tramways Act, 1870, the Grimsby Corporation Act, 1921, and the Grimsby Corporation Act, 1927.

1. Throughout these Byelaws and Regulations the following words shall have the meaning respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“ Corporation ” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Grimsby, and shall include any Lessees, Local Authority or person or Company for the time being working or running over the Tramway or working the Trolley Vehicles hereinafter referred to.

“ Tramways ” means the Tramway System now or at any time hereafter owned or leased by the Corporation within the Borough.

“ Trolley Vehicles ” means Trolley Vehicles propelled by electrical power which may at any time hereafter be worked within the Borough.

“ Omnibuses ” means omnibuses propelled by mechanical power which may at any time hereafter be owned by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Grimsby and worked by them within the Borough.

“ Car ” means any carriage or car run upon the Tramways or any Trolley Vehicle or Omnibus as hereinbefore defined for the conveyance of passengers.

"Conductor" means any authorised person having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

The expression "interior of a car" shall not include the upper deck of covered cars.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise. When a car stops, no person shall board the car until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

3. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car in motion.

4. No passenger shall smoke in the interior of any car except in a compartment expressly reserved by notice posted therein for that purpose and no person shall spit in, on, from, or against any car.

5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall leave the car immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any car, tramway, trolley vehicle or omnibus station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Corporation's tramways, trolley vehicles or omnibuses.

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger or who in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter, or remain on or in any car, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any car, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Byelaw, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

11. Each passenger shall, on demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

12. Any person leaving the car shall be deemed to have completed his journey, unless he holds a transfer ticket enabling him to leave the car in which he commenced his journey and to continue his journey in another car, in which case he shall be deemed to have completed his journey when he leaves the car into which he has transferred, and no ticket

shall be used a second time for travelling on any car.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not elsewhere.

16. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or sit or stand on the railings, guards or buffers of any car, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

17. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car.

18. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the car with the consent of the conductor.

19. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car when warned by the conductor not to do so.

20. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

21. No person shall travel in or on any car of the Corporation with loaded fire-arms.

22. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway of the Corporation, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any other part of a car or its equipment.

23. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder

of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

24. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

25. The conductor shall enforce these Byelaws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws and

Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside each car in use a printed copy of these Byelaws and Regulations.

28. These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of September, 1928.

29. From and after the date when these Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force, the Byelaws and Regulations with respect to Tramways and Trolley Vehicles which were made by the Council on the 26th day of May, 1925, and which came into force on the 1st day of August, 1925, shall be repealed.
