**W**HEREAS by the Military Manœuvres Acts, 1897 and 1911, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, authorize the execution of military manœuvres within specified limits during a specified period not exceeding three months:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the power for this purpose given to His Majesty by the said Acts, and of every other power hereunto enabling Him, doth hereby authorize the execution of military manœuvres within the limits specified in the Schedules to this Order during the period of three calendar months commencing from the 1st day of August, 1928.

And the Right Honourable Sir Laming Worthington-Evans, Bt., G.B.E., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SCHEDULES.

### FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that part of the County of Sussex lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding,

where any road is named as a boundary, the said road:—

*On the North*, eastwards along the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Surrey from a point where the boundaries cross the road from Farnham to Chichester one mile south-east of Shottermill to the point where the boundaries meet the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Kent; thence along the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Kent to the point where the boundaries cross the Southern Railway one mile south-east of Cowden railway station:

*On the East*, from the aforesaid point where the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Kent cross the Southern Railway southwards along the Southern Railway to the point where the railway meets the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Kent north-west of Ashurst railway station; thence along the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Kent to the point where the boundaries meet the Southern Railway south-west of Burrswood; thence along the Southern Railway through Uckfield and Lewes to the coast at Newhaven:

*On the South*, from Newhaven westwards along the coast to Selsey:

*On the West*, from Selsey northwards along the Chichester and Selsey tramway to the point where the tramway meets the road from Donnington to Chichester half a mile south of Chichester; thence along that road to Chichester; thence along the road from Chichester to

Farnham through Singleton, Midhurst and Fernhurst to the point where the road meets the boundaries of the Counties of Sussex and Surrey one mile south-east of Shottermill:

Which Area, surrounded on all sides by a red line, is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

All that area of land comprising portions of the Counties of Essex and Suffolk lying within a line drawn as follows, including, where any road is named as a boundary, the said road:—

*On the North*, from Sudbury north-eastwards along the road from Sudbury to Bury St. Edmunds to Babergh Place; thence eastwards along the road through Great Waldingfield and Kersey to the point where the road meets the road from Stowmarket to Hadleigh; thence southwards along the last-named road to Hadleigh; thence eastwards along the road through Hintlesham to Ipswich:

*On the East*, from Ipswich south-eastwards along the River Orwell to Orwell Haven; thence across the River Stour to Harwich; thence southwards along the coast to Clacton-on-Sea:

*On the South*, from Clacton-on-Sea westwards to Colne Point; thence northwards to Sandy Point; thence westwards across the mouth of the River Colne and along Pyefleet Channel to the point where the Channel is crossed by the road from West Mersea to Colchester; thence north-westwards along the road to Peldon; thence south-westwards along the road through Great Wigborough, Tolleshunt D'Arcy, Tolleshunt Major and Wickham Bishops to the point half a mile west of Wickham Bishops railway station where the road meets the road to Witham:

*On the West*, from the aforesaid point half a mile west of Wickham Bishops railway station northwards along the road to Powershall End; thence north-westwards along the road through White Notley to Braintree; thence north-eastwards along the road through High Garret to Halstead; thence along the road to Sudbury:

Which Area, surrounded on all sides by a red line, is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

**WHEREAS** by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of

periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1928, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of thirty per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of thirty per cent.

**WHEREAS** it is provided by subsection (1) of Section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to Income Tax payable under the law in force in any foreign State; and

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the foreign State;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be

granted from the Income Tax payable in the foreign State, have the effect of law in the foreign State:

And whereas the agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government in Great Britain and the Icelandic Government:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in Iceland; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said agreement between His Majesty's Government in Great Britain and the Icelandic Government have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in Iceland.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Iceland) Declaration, 1928."

#### SCHEDULE.

##### AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE ICELANDIC GOVERNMENT FOR THE EXEMPTION OF SHIPPING PROFITS FROM DOUBLE TAXATION.

His Britannic Majesty's Government in Great Britain and the Royal Icelandic Government being desirous of ensuring the reciprocal exemption from income tax in certain cases of profits accruing from the business of shipping, the following agreement has been concluded:

##### Article 1.

His Britannic Majesty's Government in Great Britain agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from income tax (including supertax) chargeable in Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the year of assessment 1923-24 commencing on the 6th day of April, 1923, and for every subsequent year of assessment, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Iceland or by a company managing and controlling such business in Iceland. The arrangements made in accordance with this Article shall cease to have effect if and so soon as the laws of Iceland cease to give the relief indicated in Article 2.

##### Article 2.

The Royal Icelandic Government have declared that under the laws of the Kingdom of Iceland regarding income tax and property tax, tax is not chargeable in respect of profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland or by a company managing and controlling such business in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

##### Article 3.

The expression "the business of shipping" means the business carried on by an owner of ships, and for the purposes of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the law of such Possession, either no duty leviable in respect of property situate in the United Kingdom when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duties so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that section:

And whereas by virtue of section forty-five of the Finance Act, 1922, the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, has effect as if the Unfederated Malay States of Johore, Kedah, Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu and Brunei (in this Order referred to as "the Unfederated Malay States") were British Possessions:

And whereas by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, it is provided that the reference to the United Kingdom in the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, shall, in the application of the provisions of that section to Northern Ireland, be construed as a reference to Northern Ireland:

And whereas by section eight of the Finance Act (Northern Ireland) 1922, it is provided that the said section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, shall have effect as respects death duties payable in Northern Ireland with the like extension as is enacted by the said section forty-five of the Finance Act, 1922:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the laws of the Unfederated Malay States as respects duties leviable by the Government of those States in respect of property situate in Northern Ireland when passing on death are to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the enactments and Order aforesaid, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that section twenty of the Finance Act, 1894, as in force in Northern Ireland, shall apply, as respects death duties payable in Northern Ireland, to the Unfederated Malay States.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 7th day of June, 1928, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees, the New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, the New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, and the New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, all in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of August, 1864, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Stockton upon Tees, in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named ‘The District of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 24th day of March, 1871, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘The District of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of October, 1875, and published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of the same month, two separate Districts for spiritual purposes were constituted out of the said Parish of Stockton

upon Tees and out of the District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Districts were respectively named ‘The District of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees,’ and ‘The District of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees’:

“ And whereas the said District of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees, the said District of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, the said District of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, and the said District of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees, the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, and the said new Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees, of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees; (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees; (fourthly) all that portion of the said

Parish of Stockton upon Tees which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees; and (fifthly) all those portions of the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees and of the Parish of Norton, in the said County and Diocese, which are described in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ *The First Schedule.*

“ The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, and to be restored to the Parish of Stockton upon Tees, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, which is bounded upon the south partly by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, and partly by the District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the east by the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees, upon the north partly by the last named Parish and partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, at the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Leeds Northern Branch of the London and North Eastern Railway across Bishopton Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of  $26\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees.

“ *The Second Schedule.*

“ The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, which is bounded upon the north and upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, and upon the

remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, at the centre of Ox Bridge which carries Oxbridge Lane across the stream called Lustrum Beck, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Oxbridge Lane for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Leeds Northern Branch line of railway across Oxbridge Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees.

“ *The Third Schedule.*

“ The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, and to be restored to the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, being:—

“ All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, upon the east by the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of the Trinity, Stockton upon Tees, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, at the junction of Lawson Street with Yarm Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Yarm Lane for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yarm Road and Oxbridge Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Oxbridge Lane for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the said Leeds Northern Branch line of railway across Oxbridge Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees.

“ *The Fourth Schedule.*

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

“ All that portion of the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees which is bounded upon the east and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees, upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, from the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees at the junction of Norton Road with Garbutt Street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Garbutt Street for a distance of  $4\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Haffron Street upon the boundary which divides the

said Parish of Stockton upon Tees from the said New Parish of Saint James, Stockton upon Tees.

*" The Fifth Schedule.*

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, being:—

" I. All that portion of the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees which is bounded upon part of the south by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, upon the west and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, from the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees, at the junction of Hume Street with Norton Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Norton Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with High Street and Bishopton Lane, and extending thence first north westward and then westward along the middle of Bishopton Lane for a distance of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with John Street upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stockton upon Tees from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees.

" II. And also all that portion of the Parish of Norton in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north east by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Norton, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south west and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the northern side of the bridge which carries Durham Road across the watercourse flowing from Hardwick Plantation into Lustrum Beck where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stockton upon Tees, the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Stockton upon Tees, and the said Parish of Norton all meet, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Durham Road for a distance of  $26\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Darlington Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Darlington Lane for a distance of  $32\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the old roadway leading from Darlington Lane to the Fox Almshouses at Norton, and extending thence first southward and then north eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the said Leeds Northern Branch line of railway upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Norton from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Norton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with

the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stockton upon Tees, has offered certain objections to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of any two of the following Benefices that is to say the said Benefice of Chelsworth, the said Benefice of Monks Eleigh and the Benefice of Semer situate in the said County and Diocese duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Chelsworth and Monks Eleigh and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Chelsworth and Monks Eleigh based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Chelsworth and Monks Eleigh are now full, the Reverend James Crombie Littlejohn being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chelsworth and the Reverend Canon The Honourable Arthur Francis Northcote being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Monks Eleigh:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ (1) That the said Benefice of Chelsworth and the said Benefice of Monks Eleigh shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Monks Eleigh with Chelsworth ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Lavenham but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ (5) That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charge, glebe lands, and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the three Benefices of Newmarket, All Saints, Lakenheath, and Ipswich, Saint Augustine, all in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Newmarket, All Saints; a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Lakenheath and a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Augustine; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect, due and payable to the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged respectively and the annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newmarket, All Saints, of the said Benefice of Lakenheath, or of the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Augustine, respectively, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of June and the first day of December in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Newmarket, All Saints, Lakenheath, and Ipswich, Saint Augustine, respectively, shall have and be

entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefice of Newmarket, All Saints, to the said Benefice of Lakenheath, and to the said Benefice of Ipswich, Saint Augustine, or any of them any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for all or any of the yearly rentcharges hereby created as aforesaid, then the said yearly rentcharges or rentcharge in any cases or case in which equivalent endowments shall have been granted, conveyed and annexed as aforesaid, shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Divine, Romford, situate within the Parish of Romford, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Romford and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Romford, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parish:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Romford and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Divine, Romford, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation) and with the consent of the Warden and Scholars of Saint Mary College of Winchester in Oxford, commonly called New College in Oxford, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Romford as well as of the Rectory of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Romford and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John the Divine, Romford, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Romford.’

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Romford, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Romford and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Romford, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which, taken together, are bounded upon part of the south by the

New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west partly by the last named New Parish and partly by the New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north by the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, from the said Parish of Romford at the junction of Havering Road with Collier Row Lane, and extending thence first southward, then south eastward and then again southward along the middle of Havering Road for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Eastern Avenue and North Street, and extending thence first southward and then south eastward along the middle of North Street for a distance of 32½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Como Street, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Como Street for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Olive Street, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Olive Street for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mawneys Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Mawneys Road for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Marks Road, and extending thence south westward and in a straight line for a distance of 20 yards or thereabouts to a point on the southern side of Marks Road at the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 1, Marks Road, and extending thence southward along the said fence (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Romford from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford) for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Marks Road, and extending thence first south westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned fence (thereby following in part the fence forming the northern boundary of the Cottons Recreation Ground) for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 760 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Romford published in the year 1920 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Representation, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the said fence and along the fences forming the southern boundaries of the said close numbered 760 and the closes numbered 762, 770, 771, 620, 778 and 468 upon the said maps for a distance of 1 mile and 9 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 468 meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising:—

*In the administrative county of Derby.*

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of

the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary; namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising:—

The parts of Lindsey Division of Lincoln; And also comprising:—

The city and county borough of Lincoln; the county borough of Grimsby, and the borough of Louth.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Glamorgan.*

The county borough of Merthyr Tydfil;

The petty sessional divisions of Miskin Higher and Caerphilly Higher; and so much of the petty sessional division of Caerphilly Lower as lies to the north of the railway line running from the Monmouth county border to the border of the county borough of Merthyr Tydfil at Trelewis.

*In the county of Monmouth.*

The petty sessional division of Bedwelty (*except the parishes of Abercarn, Mynyddislwyn and Bedwas*); and the parish of Blaenavon.

*In the county of Brecknock.*

The parishes of Bryn-mawr, Llangatlock, Llangynidr, Llanddety, Llanfigan, Llanfrynach, Cantref, Modrydd, Glyn, St. David Without, Vaynor, Penderyn, Ystradfellte, and Senny; and so much of the parish of Llanelly as lies to the west of the River Clydach.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative county of Caernarvon.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative counties of Denbigh, Flint (*except the petty sessional division of Overton*), Merioneth, and Montgomery; so much of the administrative county of Cardigan as lies to the north of the main road from Aberystwyth via Goginan to Eisteddfa Gurig.

And also comprising:—

The parishes of Brompton and Rhiston, and Chirbury in the administrative county of Salop.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
