The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 17th day of July, 1928, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923," (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33), WHICH AMENDING STATUTES ARE NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

WE, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE B.

Matriculation, Residence, Degrees, Discipline.

CHAPTER I.

MATRICULATION.

By repealing in Section 1 of Chapter I the words "No one shall be matriculated unless

he is presented by a College, or has been approved as a Non-Collegiate Student," and substituting therefor the words "No one shall be matriculated unless he is presented by a College, or has been approved as a Non-Collegiate Student, or has been admitted to some office in the University."

STATUTE E.

TRUST EMOLUMENTS.

By making the following addition to Section 8 of Chapter I:—

"Women shall not be excluded from candidature for any such emolument on the sole ground that words of the masculine gender only are used in this Statute concerning the persons eligible to that emolument."

STATUTE G.

Obligations of Colleges.

CHAPTER II.

Contributions of Colleges for University Purposes.

By deleting from Section 3 of Chapter II Sub-section (i) the words at the end of the Sub-section "the interest on investments representing accumulated fees (including composition fees) if such interest is not used for any purpose other than any of those for which the fees were paid."

By repealing Section 4 (Sub-section xvi) of the same Chapter and substituting therefor

the following Sub-section to form an amended Sub-section xvi:—

"Money expended in the year in the provision of prizes and one half of the money paid in the year to such Scholars, exhibitioners and research students as are selected by the College or by persons representing its interests."

By repealing Section 6 of the same Chapter and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 6:—

"The scale upon which the contribution of a College is to be calculated shall be as follows:—for the first £5,000 of net assessable income 4 per cent., for the second £5,000 of net assessable income 11 per cent.; for any amount of net assessable income in excess of £10,000 21 per cent."

Greeting!

Whereas by Warrants under Our Royal Sign Manual, dated the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, the sixteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three and the fourteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, We were graciously pleased to Make, Ordain, and Establish Statutes and Ordinances for the government of the Imperial Service Order and the Imperial Service Medal, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, and augmenting, interpreting and dispensing with those Statutes by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the said Order:

And whereas We are minded to make certain amendments to the Statutes of the said Order:

Now We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, abrogate the fifth clause of the said Warrant of the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in lieu thereof Make, Ordain and Establish the following Statute:—

Fifthly.—It is ordained that the number of Companions of the Order shall not exceed seven hundred, of whom two hundred and fifty shall belong to Our Home Civil Service, two hundred to Our Civil Services in India, including the Staff of Our Secretary of State for India, and two hundred and fifty to the Civil Services of our Dominions beyond the

Seas, and Countries under Our Protection, including the Staff of the Crown Agents for the Colonies.

And it is Our Will and Pleasure that this Statute shall be taken and received as part and parcel of the Statutes of the said Order.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

accordance with the provisions Section 2, sub-Section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:-

(1) Elastic cords, webs, braids and fabrics and articles made therefrom;

(2) Fire-arms of all descriptions and parts thereof, except smooth bore tubes;

(3) Cash, deed, jewellery and similar boxes of metal;

(4) Monuments and grave enclosures of

granite and parts thereof;

(5) Wireless receiving sets, components and accessories of all descriptions including accumulator chargers and battery eliminators but not including batteries or accumulators.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
