And We do by these Presents authorise and empower you, or any of you, to visit and inspect personally such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands or seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at our Court at Saint James's, the fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, in the Nineteenth Year of Our Reign.

## THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

## COUNTY OF ESSEX.

Notice is hereby given that on the 31st day of July, 1928, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of the highway known as The Parade, between Newgate Street and Old Pier Street, in the Urban District of Walton-on-the-Naze (hereinafter referred to as "the said highway").

The Order will come into force on the 13th day of August, 1928, and is to the following effect:—

During the period of five years from the date on which the Order comes into force, no person shall, save as hereinafter provided, drive or cause to be driven on the said highway any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver.

Nothing in the Order contained shall prevent the driving upon the said highway of:—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said highway; or

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said highway, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said highway of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD AUGUST, 1928.)

## ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 6).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Landing except for Slaughter within Landing Place.*

1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland or the Isle of Man shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

(2) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned

in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands, and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, as amended by any subsequent Order, except the ports of Cork and Waterford, or shipped from the Isle of Man, may be landed at the landing places approved by the Minister as landing places for imported animals at Fishguard, Holyhead, Birkenhead, Manchester, and Glasgow, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(3) The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(4) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands, and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, as amended by the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands, and Isle of Man) (Amendment) Order of 1927, except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place, and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.

*Slaughter of fat animals already detained in Landing Places.*

2. Animals intended for immediate slaughter which are in any approved Landing Place in Great Britain at the date of this Order shall be slaughtered within ninety-six hours after such date, and the Orders referred to in Article 1 of this Order shall be read and have effect subject to this amendment.

*Offences.*

3. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

*Revocation.*

4. The Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1928 (No. 5) is hereby revoked.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1928 (No. 6).

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Isolation of certain animals at Royal Lancashire Agricultural Society's Show at Oldham.*

1.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority of the district, with a view to prevent the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease may by notice require the removal to a convenient and isolated place approved by him of any animal now at the Royal Lancashire Agricultural Society's Show at Oldham, which has been brought from any area which is after the movement of the animals to the said Show declared to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, and of any other animal at the Show which, in the opinion of the Minister or of the Local Authority, has been exposed to the risk of infection of Foot-and-Mouth Disease. This notice shall require any such animal to be detained and isolated at the said place of isolation until the notice is withdrawn by a further notice of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry, to the Local Authority and to the Secretary of the Show.

(3) The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Article shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

*Restriction of Movement of animals from Royal Lancashire Agricultural Society's Show at Oldham.*

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved out of the Show Ground of the Royal Lancashire Agricultural Society situated at Oldham, except with a licence granted by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and then only to some suitable premises approved by the Inspector of the Ministry and subject to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and are inserted in the licence.

(2) No licence shall be required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 in respect of any animal being moved from the Show with a licence under this Order.

3. The term "animal" in this Order means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

*Offences.*

4. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

**Inverness.**—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Duna, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

**Ross and Cromarty.**—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

An Area comprising:—

*In the administrative county of Derby.*

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

An Area comprising:—

The parts of Lindsey Division of Lincoln;

And also comprising:—

The city and county borough of Lincoln; the county borough of Grimsby, and the borough of Louth.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Glamorgan.*

The county borough of Merthyr Tydfil;

The petty sessional divisions of Miskin Higher and Caerphilly Higher; and so much of the petty sessional division of Caerphilly Lower as lies to the north of the railway line running from the Monmouth county border to the border of the county borough of Merthyr Tydfil at Trelewis.

*In the county of Monmouth.*

The petty sessional division of Bedwellty (*except the parishes of Abercarn, Mynyddislwyn and Bedwas*); and the parish of Blaenavon.

*In the county of Brecknock.*

The parishes of Bryn-mawr, Llangattock, Llangynidr, Llanddettty, Llanfigan, Llanfrynach, Cantref, Modrydd, Glyn, St. David Without, Vaynor, Penderyn, Ystradfellte, and Senny; and so much of the parish of Llanelly as lies to the west of the River Clydach.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative county of Caernarvon.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative counties of Denbigh, Flint (*except the petty sessional division of Overton*), Merioneth, and Montgomery; so much of the administrative county of Cardigan as lies to the north of the main road from Aberystwyth via Goginan to Eisteddfa Gurig.

And also comprising:—

The parishes of Brompton and Rhiston, and Chirbury in the administrative county of Salop.

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Argyll.*

So much of the parishes of Dunoon and Kilmun, Strachur and Lochgoilhead as is comprised within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at Strone Point in the parish of Dunoon and Kilmun, thence north-westerly and northerly along the road leading to Loch Eck via Kilmun, Ardbeg, Rashfield and Inverchapel; thence continuing along the road in a generally northerly direction via the eastern shore of Loch Eck, Invernoaden, Strachur and the eastern shore of Loch Fyne to St. Catherine's; thence in a generally easterly and then southerly direction along the road via Laglingarten, Hell's Glen and Drimsyniebeg as far as Lochgoilhead Pier; thence proceeding southerly along the western shores of Loch Goil and Loch Long via Carriek Castle, Rudha nan Eoin, Ardentinny and Gairletter Point to the point of commencement.

An Area comprising:—

The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex (including all boroughs geographically situated therein).

And also comprising:—

The city of Rochester.

The city and county borough of Canterbury; and the county boroughs of Brighton, Eastbourne and Hastings.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
