TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th August, 1928, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 20th August, 1928, to Saturday, the 25th August, 1928, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday

12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

APPOINTMENT OF A STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Hackney Carriages at the following place, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

20th July, 1928 :—

APPOINTMENT.

AT HENDON CIRCUS AND
QUEEN'S ROAD, HENDON

In Two Portions.

Three Hackney Carriages :

First Portion.—At Hendon Circus, South-east side of roadway, one carriage to stand at a point five yards North-east of lamp-post by the junction with Park Road. Front of vehicle toward the South.

Second Portion.—At Queen's Road, two carriages on the South side of roadway, commencing at a point twenty yards from the junction with Hendon Circus and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for two carriages. Front of vehicles toward the West.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16-17 Geo. V. C. 53.) it is provided that for the purposes of the said Act unless the context otherwise requires the expression "agricultural and horticultural produce and the produce of any fishing industry" includes all foodstuffs other than such foodstuffs as the Board of Trade (hereinafter called "the Board") with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may declare not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of that definition:

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has concurred in a proposal of the Board to declare tea not to be a foodstuff for the purposes of the said definition:

Now, therefore, the Board with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby declare tea not to be a foodstuff for the purposes of the aforesaid definition.

(c) Cranks;

(d) Fork blades;

(e) Chain and seat stays (cut to length, cranked and trapped);

(3) Cycle fittings of the following descriptions—

(a) Free wheels and side plates therefor;

(b) Brakes and brake controls;

(c) Pedals;

(d) Chains;

(e) Hubs and shells and spindles of hubs;

(f) Front forks (assembled but not finished, i.e., column, crown and pair of blades);

(g) Bracket axles and cups, and head clips;

(h) Inflators and connections, and handlebar grips;

(i) Gear cases;

(j) Bells;

(k) Lamps; and

(3) in the issue of the said Gazettes of the 23rd March, 1928, in respect of imported ball and roller bearings of all descriptions, finished or unfinished, and parts thereof, finished or unfinished, other than the balls, rollers or cages,

the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that Reports have been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid classes and descriptions of goods.
