At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 14th day of *August*, 1928.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of July, 1928, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we deem it expedient that an allowance, to be termed Telegraphist Detector Allowance, should be paid to ratings of the Telegraphist branch who are qualified and employed as Submarine Detector operators in submarines:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of a Telegraphist Detector Allowance of 3d. a day and of a Higher Telegraphist Detector Allowance of 6d. a day to be paid to those Telegraphist ratings who are actually

detailed for the duties in vacancies in the complements of submarines.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29; 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80; and 18 Geo. 5, c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain, Austria, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands and Spain:

And whereas Spain has acceded to the said Convention on behalf of that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under Spanish protection:

And whereas by reason of the ratification of and accession to the said Convention by the said foreign countries the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said foreign countries or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by various Orders in Council Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty King Edward VII have been pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, or the provisions of the said Section 91 as the case may be should apply to the foreign countries named in the said Orders, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Orders in so far as they apply to Austria, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands and Spain should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Austria, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Spain and that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under Spanish protection confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Austria, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Spain and that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under Spanish protection, or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Austria, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Spain and that part of the Empire of Morocco which is under Spanish protection.

3. The Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, in so far as it relates to Italy, the Netherlands and Spain, the Order in Council dated the 9th October, 1903, relating to Germany, and the Order in Council dated the 17th May, 1909, in so far as it relates to Austria, are hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Hague Industrial Property Convention Order, 1928.

V, c. 3), it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council apply the said Section to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom in like manner as to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state and that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts, it is provided *inter alia* that where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any British possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of the said Section to that possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order:

And whereas the laws of the Dominion of Canada confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the Dominion of Canada or the territorial waters thereof corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the said Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928:

And whereas it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of the Dominion of Canada has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, patented or registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Canada) Order, 1923, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the Dominion of Canada in like manner as they would apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which an Order in Council had been made under sub-section (2) of that Section.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall apply to the Dominion of Canada.

3. The Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Canada) Order, 1923, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Canada) Order, 1928.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Lois Weedon and the Benefice (being a

Rectory) of Plumpton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Lois Weedon and Plumpton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Lois Weedon is now full the Reverend Ernest Vanderzee Fenn being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Plumpton is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Ernest Vanderzee Fenn has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Lois Weedon and the said Benefice of Plumpton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Lois Weedon with Plumpton,’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Brackley II and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of Lois Weedon shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Lois Weedon shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“ 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Ernest Vanderzee Fenn if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lois Weedon shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Plumpton shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“ 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Lois Weedon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same

shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Lois Weedon shall have the first and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Plump-ton shall have the second turn.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Needham Market is now full, the Reverend William George Hargrave Thomas being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Badley is at present vacant:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Ash next Sandwich is now full the Reverend Conrad Henry Barton being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of West Marsh, Holy Trinity, is at present vacant:

" And whereas the said Conrad Henry Barton has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

" And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Ash next Sandwich and West Marsh, Holy Trinity now belongs to one and the same Patron:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Ash next Sandwich and the said Benefice of West Marsh, Holy Trinity, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ash with West Marsh' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Conrad Henry Barton if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ash next Sandwich shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ash next Sandwich shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice, and the

Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of West Marsh, Holy Trinity, shall form part of the endowments of the United Benefice but shall be used for the purpose of a house of residence for the Curate referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme unless the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being shall at any time by writing otherwise direct.

" 4. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and to reside within the Parish of the said Benefice of West Marsh, Holy Trinity, and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £180 per annum as the Archbishop of Canterbury may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Archbishop of Canterbury shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Sub-section (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Heckfield and Mattingley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Heckfield and Mattingley are now full the Reverend Edward Clarke Spicer being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Heckfield and the Reverend John Crosbie-Oates being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mattingley:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Mattingley is vested in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Heckfield:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Heckfield and the said Benefice of Mattingley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Heckfield with

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and if the Bishop of Winchester shall signify his consent in writing thereto but, if such Incumbent shall not so consent (or if the Bishop of Winchester shall not signify his consent as aforesaid) then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and if the Bishop of Winchester shall signify his consent in writing thereto but if he shall not so consent (or if the Bishop of Winchester shall not signify his consent as aforesaid) then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £75 in any one year.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (a) the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bromyard, and part of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Avenbury and (b) the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stoke Lacy and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Avenbury, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (a) the union of the said Benefice of Bromyard and a part of the said Benefice of Avenbury and (b) the union of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Avenbury duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the said unions of Benefices and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas all of the said Benefices of Bromyard, Avenbury and Stoke Lacy are now full the Reverend Prebendary Philip Austen Lushington being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bromyard, the Reverend Edward Henry Archer-Shepherd being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Avenbury and the Reverend Prebendary Henry George Morgan being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Bromyard and the northern part of the said Benefice of Avenbury (the contents of which part are described in the Schedule hereto annexed) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Bromyard' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bromyard) and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

That the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy and the part of the said Benefice of Avenbury remaining after the union of the northern part of such Benefice with the said Benefice of Bromyard as provided in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Stoke Lacy' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy) and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

That with the consent of the said Philip Austen Lushington (testified by his signing this Scheme) if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Avenbury and Stoke Lacy shall be vacant the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 4 of this Scheme shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices of Avenbury and Stoke Lacy shall be then vacant the said unions shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of such two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices of Avenbury and Stoke Lacy be then vacant the said unions shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of such two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and in any case upon the said unions taking effect the said Philip Austen Lushington or his successor, Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bromyard, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bromyard.

That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bromyard shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bromyard, (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Avenbury and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England as to one quarter of such net proceeds for the benefit of the United Benefice of Bromyard and as to the remaining three quarters of such net proceeds for the benefit of the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy.

" 7. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Bromyard shall belong wholly to the present Patron of the said Benefice of Bromyard and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy shall belong wholly to

the present Patron of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy.

" 8. That upon the unions taking effect the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Avenbury shall be divided and annexed as follows, that is to say, (a) the whole of the capital sum of £550 9s. 0d. at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England on behalf of the said Benefice of Avenbury together with a portion namely a yearly sum of £30 15s. 8d. of the stipend of £37 6s. 8d. at present payable by us to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Avenbury, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bromyard and (b) all other the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Avenbury shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy.

" 9. That with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified by his signing this Scheme), as Patron of the Benefice of Much Cowarne and with the consent of the Reverend Alfred Brown now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Much Cowarne (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the unions taking effect all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Much Cowarne which is bounded upon the south west by the River Lodon (and partly also by the Parish of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy) upon the north west by the said Parish of Stoke Lacy and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north and east by the said Parish of Avenbury (all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured yellow) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stoke Lacy but no alteration in the Patronage or endowments of either of the said Benefices of Much Cowarne and Stoke Lacy shall be made by reason of such transfer of territory.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

" The northern part of the Benefice of Avenbury comprising:—

" All that part of the Parish of the Benefice of Avenbury which contains the Parish Church of Avenbury, Avenbury Court, the Vicarage, the Brookhouse, Kilns, Little Froome, Little Froome Hill, Cusop, the Burgess, the Goodships, Birchyfields, Hockley, Northfield and Cooper's Green, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to

proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules.

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

“ Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Barrow Hill, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Courtenay, Bishop of Derby (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Staveley which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Barrow Hill, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Barrow Hill.’
