PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, power is conferred on His Majesty by Order in Council to declare that Part III of that Act shall apply to any drug of whatever kind in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in Section 8 (1) of the Act if it appears to Him that the drug is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the drugs benzoyl-morphine, dihydro-oxycodeinone, dihydrocodeinone and their respective salts, and any preparations containing benzoyl-morphine, dihydro-oxycodeinone, or dihydrocodeinone are productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to declare and it is hereby declared that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall henceforth apply to the drugs benzoyl - morphine, dihydro - oxycodeinone,

dihydrocodeinone and their respective salts and to any preparation, admixture and extract containing benzoyl-morphine, dihydro-oxycodeinone or dihydrocodeinone.
