WHEREAS the Right Reverend George Rodney, Lord Bishop of Wakefield, and the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, Lord Bishop of Ripon, have, under Section 26 of

the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms :—

" We, The Right Reverend George Rodney, Lord Bishop of Wakefield, and the Right Reverend Edward Arthur, Lord Bishop of Ripon, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd
