NOTICE TO BONDHOLDERS OF NUMBERS OF DRAWN BONDS.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that in accordance with the provisions of the Northern Ireland Land Act, 1925 (15 and 16 Geo.
