In pursuance of Section 118 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, Bart., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been pleased to appoint Mr. Derek Edward Hugh Wynter to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Hammer Finishing Department at the works of Messrs. Grosvenor, Chater and Company Limited, Abbey Paper Mills, Holywell, Flintshire, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
